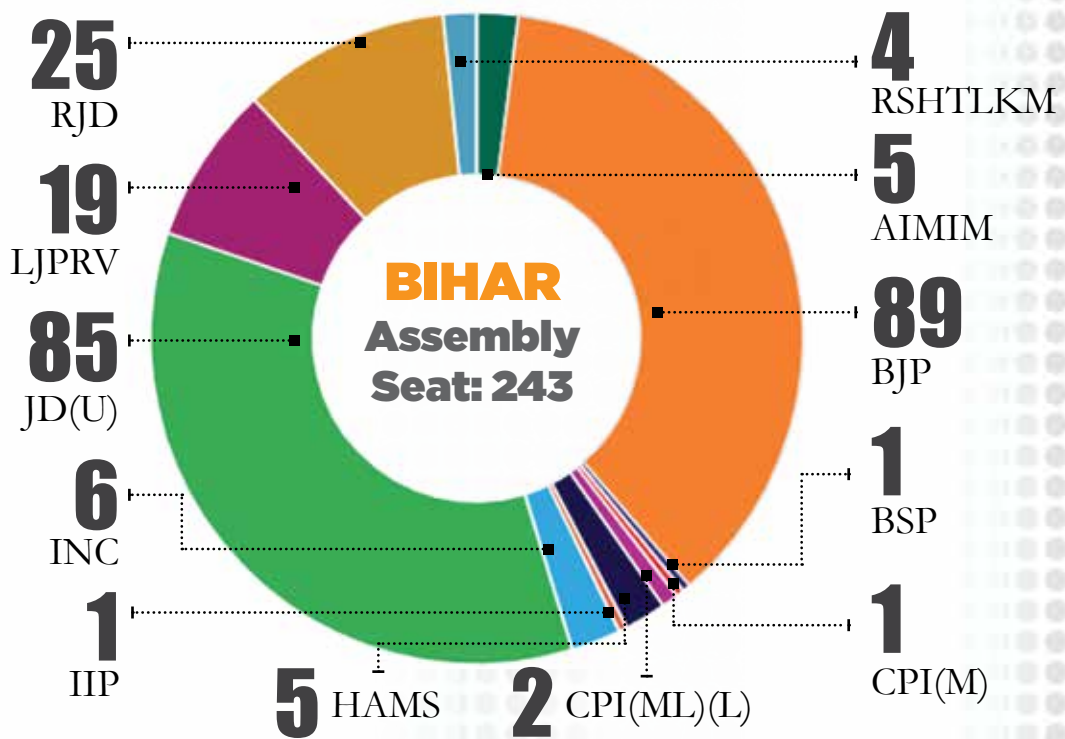

# Cooperatives are shaping India's future

### Greetings,

Cooperatives have played a pivotal role in promoting social and economic prosperity. They have not only strengthened the democratic fabric of India but also served as a powerful instrument for empowering the weaker and marginalized sections of society, providing them with better employment opportunities and achieving social and financial inclusion.

Cooperatives in the country have a long and rich tradition, playing a key role in the economic movement before independence. The establishment of the Ministry of Cooperation in 2021 reinvigorated this sector. Today, India has over 844,000 cooperative societies and over 300 million members. The cooperative sector, guided by the mantra of "Sahkar Se Samriddhi," is shaping India's destiny. The United Nations declared

2025 the International Year of Cooperatives, and recently, two cooperatives from India, Amul and IFFCO, ranked first and second, respectively, among the top 10 cooperatives in the world. In the year 1946, on December 14, the cooperative famous as Amul was registered. Under this backdrop, "Sahkar Se Samriddhi" serves as the cover story for this issue.

In the personality section, read about India's art icon Nandlal Bose. Prime Minister Narendra Modi's interaction with the ICC Women's World Cup champion and his stern approach to the Delhi blast are the other highlights of this issue. 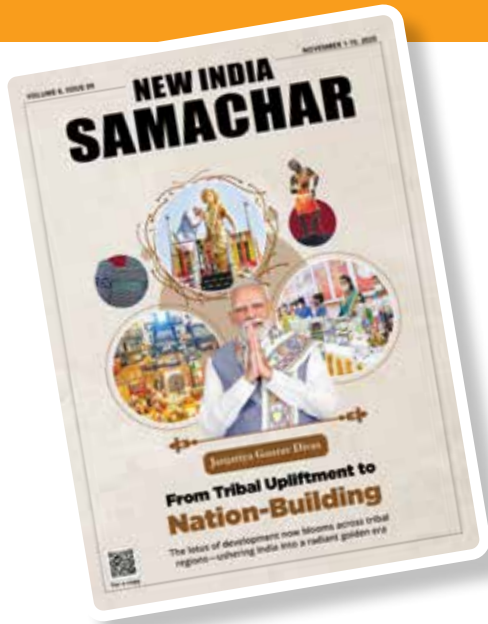

## India Shines in QS Asia University Rankings

The QS Asia University Rankings show a record 1,125% growth in the number of Indian universities. While the list included 24 universities across the country in 2016, it has increased to 294 in the 2026 rankings. According to the list, five of Asia's top 10 universities, and 28 of the top 50, are Indian universities. India is now becoming Asia's "research powerhouse", and universities are establishing a new identity globally through modern education, research, and innovation under the National Education Policy. Prime Minister Narendra Modi expressed his happiness over the record increase in the number of Indian universities in the rankings over the past decade. He stated that our government is committed to ensuring quality education for our youth by focusing on research and innovation. We are also building institutional capacity in this area by strengthening more educational institutions across India.



## Samrat Rana Creates History with Gold Win

India's Samrat Rana created history by winning the gold medal in the men's 10m air pistol event at the ISSF Shooting World Championships in Cairo. With this victory, Rana became the first Indian to win an individual air pistol world title. Rana won the gold medal in the men's 10m air pistol event with a score of 243.7, while Varun Tomar, also from India, took home the bronze.



## Bihar's Gogabeel Lake Receives Ramsar Site Status

India has achieved another major milestone in environmental conservation. Gogabeel Lake, one of the country's wetlands, has been granted Ramsar Site status. Spread over 86.63 hectares, this lake is located in Katihar district of Bihar. With this achievement, Bihar now ranks third after Tamil Nadu and Uttar Pradesh, while India ranks first in Asia and third globally. The number of Ramsar sites in the country has now increased to 94, with 67 new sites added in the last 11 years.





## Scrap sales brought in about ₹ 4,100 crore

Under the Special Cleanliness Campaign, over ₹ 4,085 crore has been earned through the disposal of scrap from various central government offices under Special Cleanliness Campaign 5.0. This campaign to clean up government offices by removing junk has been underway since 2021. According to Union Minister of State Dr Jitendra Singh, the amount earned from selling scrap is equivalent to the total budget of a mega space mission or several Chandrayaan space missions. A significant outcome of the Special Cleanliness Campaign was freeing up of 23.175 million square feet of space, previously filled with waste materials, old furniture, and junk. This campaign has freed up enough space to build a massive mall or other large structure for economic activities.



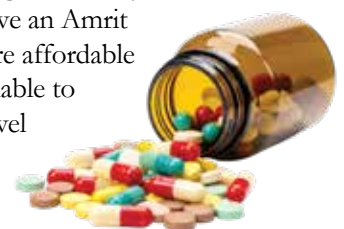
## Lucknow Wins Unesco's "Creative City Of Gastronomy"

UNESCO has awarded the 'Creative City of Gastronomy' honour to Lucknow, a city renowned worldwide for its unique arts and cultures. This represents unprecedented recognition and honour for India's timeless traditions, culture, and values on a global stage. This honour symbolizes the city's exceptional contribution to its distinctive culinary heritage and rich traditions. This recognition has enhanced Lucknow's global reputation. Now, its flavours will reach across the world. Expressing delight at Lucknow being declared a 'Creative City of Gastronomy' by UNESCO, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said, "Lucknow is synonymous with a vibrant culture, at the core of which is a great culinary culture. I am glad that UNESCO has recognised this aspect of Lucknow, and I call upon people from around the world to visit Lucknow and discover its uniqueness."



## "Amrit Pharmacy" to double in number

Launched in 2015 with the aim of providing affordable and quality medicines, "Amrit Pharmacy" has provided millions of patients with 50 to 90% cheaper medicines and implants over the past 10 years. There are currently 255 Amrit Pharmacies across the country, with a target to increase to 500 in the near future. More than 6.85 Crore patients have benefited from Amrit Pharmacy. Medicines worth over ₹ 17,000 crore have been dispensed to these patients, resulting in savings of approximately ₹ 8,400 crore. Union Health and Family Welfare Minister J.P. Nadda stated that every medical college and every district hospital should have an Amrit Pharmacy to ensure affordable medicines are available to citizens at every level of the healthcare system.





# Infused Indian Identity on the Pages of the Constitution

*The nationalist painter Nandalal Bose, regarded as the father of modern Indian art, elevated Indian painting to its greatest heights. A magician with the brush, he portrayed India's essence in the illustrations of the Constitution's pages and designed the sketches for the country's highest civilian honours – the Bharat Ratna and the Padma Shri. On the birth anniversary of such a legendary artist, a grateful nation pays its tribute...*



Born: December 3, 1882, Died: April 16, 1966

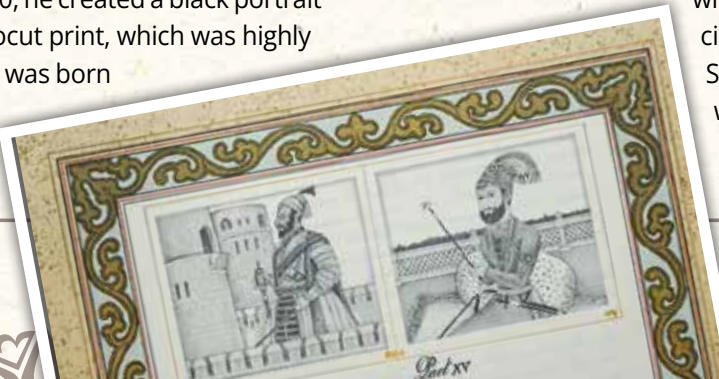
Nandalal Bose, a pioneer of modern Indian art and an internationally renowned artist, enriched the original handwritten pages of the Indian Constitution with Indian identity. It was not possible to paint on all the pages of this 221-page document. Therefore, he created 8x13-inch illustrations at the beginning of each section of the Constitution. There are 22 parts in total. This allowed him to adorn this original copy of the Indian Constitution with 22 of his paintings. These 22 paintings took four years to complete. His work not only keeps alive the historicity of the Constitution but also makes us realise the Indian culture, rich history, religion, tradition, high human values and unity.

The Constitution also features images of Lord Rama, Buddha, Mahavira, Guru Govind Singh, Gurukul, the message of the Bhagavad Gita, Shivaji, Lakshmi Bai, Nalanda University, and Nataraja. Through these paintings, he taught patriotism to his countrymen. His famous paintings include "Dandi March", "Santhali Kanya", and "Sati's Sacrifice". During the Salt Satyagraha in 1930, he created a black portrait of Gandhiji on a white linocut print, which was highly acclaimed. Nandalal Bose was born on December 3, 1882, in Munger district, Bihar, to architect Purnachan-

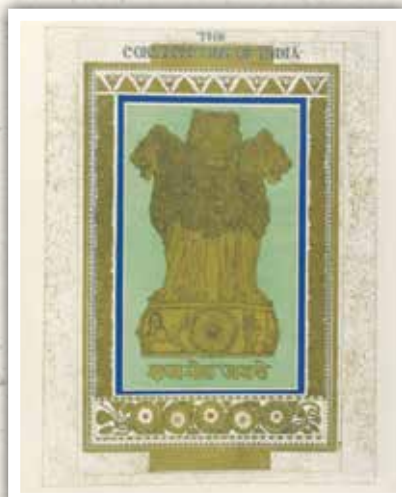
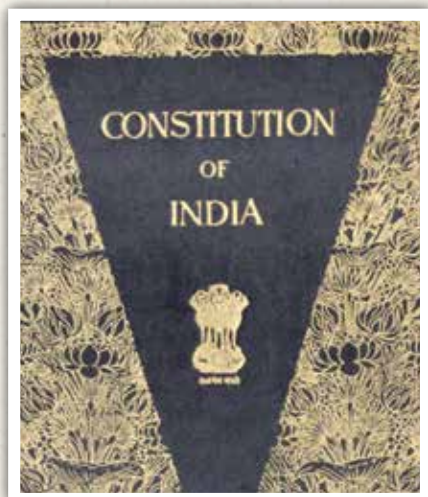
dra Bose and Kshemani. His ancestral village was in Hooghly, Bengal.

Recognizing his keen interest in sculpture and painting from childhood, his parents enrolled him in an art school in Kolkata. Nandalal Bose, a pioneer of modern Indian art, wrote three books: Rupavali, Shilpakala, and Shilpa Charcha, in addition to his work on painting and teaching. In 1930, when Mahatma Gandhi was arrested during the Dandi March, Nandalal Bose made a painting depicting Gandhi walking with his walking stick. This marked the beginning of Nandalal Bose's involvement in the freedom struggle. Nandalal Bose was awarded the Padma Vibhushan for his contributions to the arts. A disciple of Abanindranath Tagore, Nandalal Bose also made significant contributions to India's independence movement.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi remembered Nandalal Bose during his Mann Ki Baat address on August 25, 2019. He mentioned that before the Congress session in Haripura, Gujarat (1937-38), Mahatma Gandhi had invited Nandalal Bose, who was then the Principal of Kala Bhavana at Shantiniketan. Gandhi wanted him to depict the lifestyle of the people of India through art and to

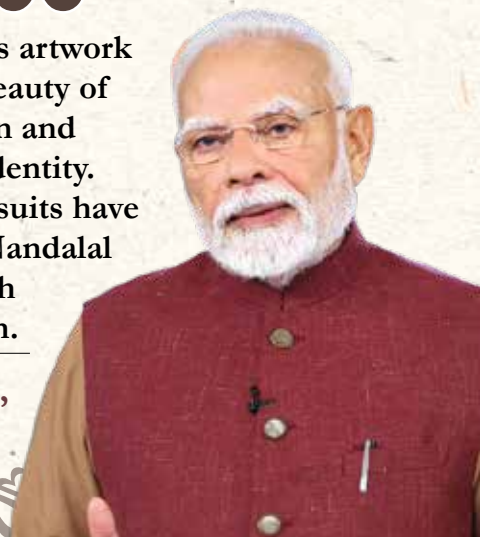


exhibit this artwork during the session. Bose visited the villages around Haripura and ultimately created some art canvases depicting life in rural India. These invaluable works gained immense attention at the famous art exhibition, the Venice Biennale, in 2019.

Later, on December 17, 2024, Union Home Minister Amit Shah also remembered Nandalal Bose in the Rajya Sabha, on the occasion of 75 years of the Indian Constitution. He said that in keeping with the spirit of the written Constitution, Nandalal Bose had illustrated various events that give prominence to India's history, religion, culture, traditions, and human values.

In his artwork, one can find depictions of Lord Rama, Buddha, and Mahavira, as well as visuals symbolizing India's ancient education system through

the Gurukul. These works convey messages about how our education policy should be. Alongside illustrations of the Bhagavad Gita, he also included images of Shivaji and Lakshmi Bai, teaching lessons of patriotism. The depiction of the Gurukul reminds us of the ancient system of learning, while the image of Nataraja symbolizes how balance should be maintained in life.

Furthermore, in the Republic Day parade on January 26, 2025, the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment's tableau presented the glorious journey of the Constitution over 75 years. Nandalal Bose's artwork was prominently displayed on sculptural panels. Nandalal Bose passed away on April 16, 1966. ●

# Terrorism will not be tolerated

## The Conspirators will not be spared...

*In keeping with its commitment to national security and the safety of every citizen, the Central Government has sent out a strong message against terrorism. The nation is united against the terrorist attack that occurred near Delhi's Red Fort on the evening of November 10th, and the world too has also expressed its support for India. Reiterating its zero-tolerance policy towards this cowardly and despicable act, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said, "Those behind this conspiracy will be brought to justice!"*

India's zero-tolerance policy against terrorism is clear. India advocates peace and does not seek war, but it will not allow terrorism to become a menace. Three major strikes against terrorism in the past 11 years – the Uri surgical strike, Operation Balakot, and Operation Sindoor – are a testament to that resolve and commitment. Now, a very restrained approach has been shown to the cowardly act of terror near the Red Fort in Delhi, and after a thorough investigation of all aspects, further investigation of the case has been handed over to the National Investigation Agency (NIA).

Prime Minister Narendra Modi chaired a meeting of the Union Cabinet after returning from Bhutan. The Cabinet expressed deep condolences to the people killed in the terrorist incident of a car bomb blast near the Red Fort in Delhi on the evening of 10 November 2025. The Cabinet observed two minutes' silence in memory of the deceased.

### Resolutions Passed in the meeting

- The country has witnessed a heinous terror incident, perpetrated by anti-national forces, through a car explosion near the Red Fort on the evening of 10 November 2025. The explosion resulted in multiple fatalities and caused injuries to several others.
- The Cabinet pays its solemn respects to the victims of this senseless act of violence and conveys its heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families.
- The Cabinet prays for the speedy recovery of all those injured and appreciates the prompt efforts of the medical personnel and emergency responders, who have been providing care and support to the victims.
- The Cabinet unequivocally condemns this dastardly and cowardly act that has led to the loss of innocent lives.
- The Cabinet reiterates India's unwavering commitment to a policy of zero tolerance towards terrorism in all its forms and manifestations.
- The Cabinet also recorded its appreciation for the statements of solidarity and support from many governments around the world.
- The Cabinet notes with appreciation the timely and coordinated response of the authorities, security agencies, and citizens who acted with courage and compassion in the face of adversity. Their dedication and sense of duty are deeply commendable.
- The Cabinet directs that the investigation into the incident be pursued with the utmost urgency and professionalism so that the perpetrators, their collaborators, and their sponsors are identified and brought to justice without delay. The situation continues to be closely monitored at the highest levels of the government.
- The Cabinet reaffirms Government's steadfast resolve to safeguard the lives and well-being of all Indians, consistent with its enduring commitment to national security and the safety of every citizen.

Upon receiving information about the terrorist attack in Delhi on the evening of November 10th, teams from the Delhi Police Special Cell, Crime Branch, NIA, NSG, and Forensic Science (FSL) arrived at the scene. Union Home Minister Amit Shah immediately took charge and informed Prime Minister Narendra Modi about the incident. Keeping in mind the sensitivity of the situation, Union Home Minister Amit Shah clarified that the incident was being investigated from all angles. *Vande Mataram - "Maa, I bow to You" - these words are a mantra, an energy, and a solemn resolve. It fills our present with self-confidence and instills renewed courage for the future, believing that there is no resolve or goal that we Indians cannot achieve. Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the year-long commemoration of the 150th anniversary of Vande Mataram, a symbol of resistance and patriotism, in New Delhi on November 7th...*

**T**he 150th anniversary of Vande Mataram, the enduring legacy of unity, resistance, and national pride, will be celebrated until November 7th, 2026. Several activities to commemorate the significance of this song are being organized across the country, since November 7th, 2025. Along with the main event, the full version of "Vande Mataram" was sung en masse at public places nationwide. These celebrations seek to reinvigorate the spirit of Vande Mataram for today's India, and to connect the nation's glorious past with its aspirations for a united, self-reliant, and culturally rich future. The Government of India

will celebrate the festival in four phases.

Inaugurating the year-long commemoration, Prime Minister Narendra Modi underscored the message that while the idea of a nation as a 'Maa' may seem surprising to those who view the nation solely as a geopolitical entity, India is different. In India, a 'Maa' is the one who gives birth, nurtures, and rises above all adversity when her child is in need. Maa Bharati possesses immense power, guiding us in adversity and destroying our enemies. The notion of the nation as a mother, and of the mother as a divine embodiment of Shakti, inspired a freedom movement that sought







## This is how Vande Mataram became the national song

Vande Mataram, India's national song... This composition, as an immortal national song, has inspired countless generations of freedom fighters and nation-builders. It is an enduring symbol of national identity and collective spirit. 'Vande Mataram' was first published in the literary magazine Bangadarshan on November 7, 1875. Later, its author, Bankim Chandra Chatterjee, included it in his novel 'Anandamath.' Rabindranath Tagore set music to it. On January 24, 1950, Dr. Rajendra Prasad made a statement in the Constituent Assembly: "The composition consisting of words and music entitled 'Jana Gana Mana' is the national anthem of India, subject to such alterations in the words as the Government may authorise as occasion arises; and the song Vande Mataram, which has played a historic part in the struggle for Indian freedom, shall be honoured equally with Jana Gana Mana and shall have equal status with it. I hope this will satisfy the Members." His statement was adopted, and Rabindranath Tagore's Jana Gana Mana was adopted as the national anthem of independent India, and Bankim Chandra's Vande Mataram as the national song.

It not only reminds us how we achieved independence but also tells us how we must protect it. Whenever the national flag is hoisted, these words spontaneously rise from our hearts: Bharat Mata ki Jai! Vande Mataram!**

## Changes transforming the lives of villagers and poor farmers

- The Ministry of Cooperation is transforming lives of the poor, farmers, and villagers across the country.

# Making PACS multipurpose, multifunctional, and transparent

More than 13 crore farmer members are associated with the Primary Agricultural Credit Societies(PACS). Model bylaws were developed to make PACS a multi-purpose, multi-faceted, and transparent institution. PACS membership was made more inclusive and broad by providing representation to women and SC and ST communities. PACS are being transformed into multi-service centres by linking them to 25 economic activities. More than 300 government schemes and services are now being provided through them.

Work has begun on a plan to establish new PACS, dairy, and fisheries cooperatives to bring all panchayats and villages under the ambit of cooperative institutions. A total of 24,417 new PACS, dairy, and fisheries cooperatives have been registered across the country since the scheme's launch on February 15, 2023, and until August 15, 2025.

## The World's Largest Food Storage Scheme in the Cooperative Sector

- By combining several schemes and missions, a project has been approved for food storage warehouses, custom hiring centres, primary processing units, and other agricultural infrastructure at the PACS level to prevent grain wastage and reduce transportation costs.
- Warehouse construction has been completed in 11 PACS across 11 states as part of a pilot project. Now, expanding this initiative, more than 500 PACS have been identified for warehouse construction.
- The State Government, NAFED, and NCCF have assured rent for the warehouses to be constructed in 225 PACS. Construction work has begun in 129 other PACS, of which 65 have been completed.
- Slight amendments have been made to the Agricultural Marketing Infrastructure (AMI) scheme to enhance financial viability, reduce construction costs, and reduce subsidies.

Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS) and marketing-related societies, as its members. Over 5 crore farmers have become IFFCO members through these societies, and today IFFCO is a pillar of the country's Green Revolution, producing 9.3 million metric tons of urea and DAP. IFFCO's Nano Urea and Nano DAP are being exported to Brazil, Oman, the United States, Jordan, and 65 other countries worldwide.

The International Cooperative Alliance (ICA) has now ranked Amul first and IFFCO second in the global rankings, demonstrating that the cooperative concept and culture remain powerfully alive today. Furthermore, India's Uralungal Labour Contract Cooperative Society Limited won the Asia Pacific Cooperative Excellence Award in 2023 in the Entrepreneurial Cooperative Award category.

## PACS as Common Service Centres

Considering the reach of PACS at the rural level, a multi-ministerial and multi-agency agreement was signed to enable them to provide more than 300 services, such as banking, insurance, Aadhaar enrolment, health services, PAN card services, and railway, bus, and air ticket booking. As of 10 November 2025, 50,355 PACS have started delivering common service centre facilities to the rural population.

- PACS have registered 1,863 Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs). This will help farmers gain market linkages and ensure fair prices for their produce.
- PACS have been included in the priority list for retail petrol and diesel outlets. 393 PACS across 27 states and union territories have applied. PACS have been given the option to convert their wholesale consumer petrol pumps into retail outlets.
- The government has now allowed PACS to apply for LPG distributorships.
- PACS are eligible to operate and maintain tap water supply systems in rural areas; 539 PACS have been identified for this purpose.
- PM Kusum Yojana and PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana have also been linked to PACS. Initially, 100 cities have been selected for the PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana.

## 20 lakh dairy farmers will be able to become members of the organized cooperative society

Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah inaugurated a multi-state cooperative organization called Sardar Patel Cooperative Dairy Federation Limited in July 2025. It has an initial capital of ₹200 crore. Over 20 lakh dairy farmers from over 20,000 villages across 20 states will be able to become members. Through this federation, farmers will benefit from assured milk procurement, better veterinary care, enhanced animal nutrition, and access to modern dairy technologies. Investments in robust cold storage infrastructure, cold storage centres, and efficient processing facilities will further strengthen quality standards. It will help meet the demand for safe and hygienic dairy products.

## Giving Fillip to Sahkar Se Samriddhi

The Ministry has launched over 100 initiatives to strengthen the cooperative movement. The National Cooperative Policy 2025 was launched on July 6, 2025. To promote the mantra of Sahkar Se Samriddhi, numerous schemes and initiatives were launched, and several tax reliefs, including income tax and GST, were provided.

The tax rate on cooperative societies with income between ₹1 crore and ₹10 crore has been reduced from 12% to 7%. This has reduced the tax burden on cooperative societies.

- Cash transactions by cooperative societies up to ₹2 lakh have been exempted from income tax penalties. The limit for cash deposits and payments by PACS and Primary Cooperative Agriculture and Rural Development Banks has been increased from ₹20,000 to ₹2 lakh.

- New manufacturing cooperative societies have been imposed a flat lower tax rate of 15%, compared to the previous rate of 30%.
- The minimum alternate tax rate for cooperative societies has been reduced from 18.5% to 12%.

Today, more than **8.44 lakh** cooperative organizations are active in the country, directly or indirectly involving approximately 32 crore people. Furthermore, approximately 94 percent of farmers are associated with cooperatives in some form or another.



- Cooperative sugar mills will not be required to pay any additional tax if they pay higher prices for sugarcane to farmers or up to the State Advised Price (SAP) starting April 2016.
- GST on molasses was reduced from 28% to 5%, allowing cooperative sugar mills to generate higher profits for their members by selling molasses at higher rates.
- Cooperative sugar societies were allowed to claim payments made to sugarcane farmers prior to the assessment year 2016-17 as expenses. This is expected to provide relief of over ₹46,000 crore. Additionally, a ₹10,000 crore loan scheme was launched to empower cooperative sugar mills.
- Cooperative sugar mills were given priority in ethanol procurement, and cooperative sugar mills were placed on par with private companies in ethanol procurement under the Ethanol Blending Programme.
- More than 60 policy reforms have been implemented in the cooperative sector to increase transparency, employment, and sustainability.
- Dairy and fisheries cooperatives are also being

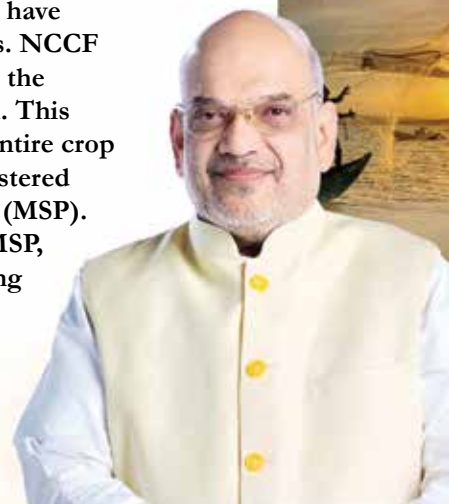


designated as Bank Mitras of central and state cooperative banks. They are also being provided with micro ATMs to provide doorstep financial services. Nearly 10,000 micro ATMs have been distributed in Gujarat.

- To expand the reach of cooperative banks and provide dairy cooperative members with the necessary liquidity, RuPay Kisan Credit Cards are being issued to cooperative society members.
- The conversion of 1,000 existing fisheries cooperatives into Fish Farmer Producer Organizations (FFPOs) has also been initiated, for which business plans are being prepared by the Cluster Best Business Organizations. 70 FFPOs have already been registered to facilitate market linkages and processing facilities for fishermen.
- A central scheme, "Grant-in-Aid to the National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC)," with an outlay of ₹2,000 crore for the period 2025-26 to 2028-29, has been approved. This will enable the NCDC to raise approximately ₹20,000 crore from the open market over four years. Approximately 2.9 crore members of 13,288 cooperative societies across the country, covering diverse sectors such as dairy, animal husbandry, fisheries, sugar, textiles, food processing, warehousing and cold storage, labour, and women-led cooperatives, are expected to benefit from this scheme.

## Farmers' Path to Self-Reliance...

The Ministry of Cooperation has launched the Self-Reliance Campaign to increase the production of pulses (tur, lentil, and black gram) in the country and reduce dependence on imports. Maize production is also being promoted to meet the targets of the ethanol blending program. NCCF and NAFED have been assigned the responsibility for this. NCCF e-samyukti and NAFED have launched the e-samridh portal for farmer registration. This portal guarantees the purchase of the entire crop of tur, urad, lentil, and maize from registered farmers at the Minimum Support Price (MSP). However, if market prices exceed the MSP, farmers can earn higher profits by selling their produce in the open market. To date, more than 4.141 million farmers are registered on the e-samyukti portal, and 11.07 lakh farmers are registered on NAFED's e-samridhi portal.



- Cooperatives were allowed to register as 'buyers' on GeM, enabling them to procure goods and services from approximately 67 lakh vendors with cost-effective procurement and greater transparency. More than 574 cooperative societies have been onboarded.
- The Cooperative Ranking Framework for evaluating and ranking cooperatives was launched in January 2025. The National Cooperative Database portal can generate rankings across seven key sectors.
- The Multi-State Cooperative Societies Act, 2002, was amended under the Multi-State Cooperative Societies (Amendment) Act, 2023, to strengthen governance in multi-state cooperative societies, enhance transparency and accountability, and improve the electoral process.
- An amount of more than Rs 4,548 crore has been returned to 22.56 lakh valid depositors of the Sahara Group cooperative societies in a transparent manner through a portal.

White Revolution 2.0 aims to expand the reach of dairy cooperatives to farmers in areas of the country where these cooperatives have not yet reached. By joining dairy cooperatives, farmers will have access to a better market for their milk. White Revolution 2.0 aims to expand the reach of cooperatives, increase milk procurement by 50%, create new employment opportunities in rural areas, and empower women economically. Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah has launched the SOP of White Revolution 2.0.

### Initiative to transform the dairy sector from Kachre Se Kanchan

A key objective of White Revolution 2.0 is to develop a development model in the dairy sector that ensures environmental protection, resource reuse, and sustainable growth in farmers' income. Toward this end, the government has taken steps to promote sustainability and circularity in the dairy sector, adopting climate-smart practices across the dairy value chain, promoting efficient resource use, and building a low-emission and income-generating ecosystem through renewable resources. To this end, three multi-state cooperative societies will be established:

- For livestock feed production, disease control, and artificial insemination.
- For cow and buffalo dung management.
- For the management of dead cattle hides, bones, and horns.



this sector was fragmented and lacked uniformity across the country. To ensure equitable development of the country's rural economy, a separate Ministry of Cooperation was established in 2021 to strengthen the cooperative movement and take its benefit to every household. Over the past 11 years, rural India has witnessed unprecedented develop-

ment in basic physical infrastructure such as roads, housing, telecommunications, electricity, toilets, and cooking gas. This has advanced rural aspirations. On one occasion, farmers demanded a price increase, and Polson Dairy stopped buying milk. The farmers, under the leadership of Tribhuvandas Kishibhai Patel, feeling helpless, approached Sardar Patel. He said, "If you accept slavery, you will endure exploitation. If you don't want to do that, you should form your own cooperative society and trade your milk yourself." Then, under the leadership of Tribhuvan Das Patel, history was made on December 14, 1946, when the Kheda District Cooperative Milk Producers' Union, commonly known as Amul, was registered under the

Bombay Cooperative Societies Act of 1925. This was the first cooperative that had a humble beginning, which started from a small village collecting 250 liters of milk. From there, the journey to becoming Amul, the world's strongest cooperative brand, was paved by Tribhuvan Das Patel. # Cooperative Banks

## Empowered by Government Initiatives

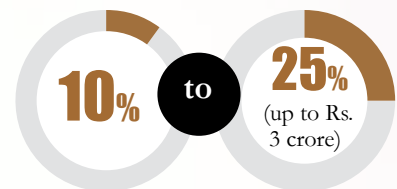
Since the formation of the Ministry of Cooperation, the efforts to strengthen the Cooperative banks have received a boost through steps that include opening new branches, allowing door-step services to customers, establishing a nodal officer at the RBI, and increasing housing loan limits.

- Urban cooperative banks are now eligible to open 10% of their previous financial year's total branch openings or a maximum of 5 branches without prior RBI approval.
- The RBI has permitted urban cooperative banks to provide doorstep services to customers. Account holders of these banks can now avail banking services such as cash withdrawals and deposits, KYC, demand drafts, and life certificates at their doorsteps.

- Urban cooperative banks can now obtain notified status by being included in RBI's Schedule II upon meeting financially sound and well-managed criteria and maintaining a minimum required deposit balance.

Priority sector lending target for urban cooperative banks has been reduced from **75% to 60%** to facilitate their operations.

Housing loan limits for urban cooperative bank members have been increased from



- The loan limit has been increased from Rs. 1 crore to Rs. 3 crore, enabling these banks to meet higher loan demand, support business growth, and increase their competitiveness in the SME loan sector.



- The RBI has approved the establishment of an umbrella organization for the urban cooperative banking sector, paving the way for approximately 1,500 urban cooperative banks to acquire the necessary information technology infrastructure and operations.
- Urban cooperative banks have been permitted to conduct one-time settlements on outstanding loans, similar to other banks. Cooperative banks are now able to provide a process for technical write-offs and other services to borrowers through board-approved policies.
- The individual housing loan limit for rural cooperative banks has been increased by two and a half times to ₹75 lakh.



of cooperatives in India. The Gujarat Cooperative Milk Marketing Federation, also known as Amul, is the result of Tribhuvan Das's vision.

Amul's turnover in 2003 was ₹2,882 crore. Today, Amul's sales have exceeded ₹90,000 crore. This is many times more than many large multinational companies. In this massive movement, no one's share capital exceeds ₹100. Poor farmer women collected ₹100 each to build it. Today, the world is

watching with amazement, and the Amul Group's turnover, including milk and other related businesses, has surpassed ₹90,000 crore. This group alone provides self-employment to 3.6 million women in Gujarat.

After independence in 1947, the cooperative movement gained momentum, as they were given a significant role in various five-year plans formulated by the Planning Commission. In 2002, the central

government announced the National Cooperative Policy. This policy aimed to strengthen the overall development of cooperatives in the country. A ministerial-level task force was formed to prepare an action plan for implementing this policy. This task force recommended that a single law be implemented instead of parallel laws in the states. The cooperative system in India can broadly be classified into two types: credit and non-credit cooperatives.

There are over 800,000 registered cooperative societies in the country, with over 300 million members engaged in agriculture and allied activities. The cooperative sector has always played a vital role in the overall economic development of the country. The cooperative model is generating widespread financial prosperity by empowering the economically disadvantaged sections of Indian society to drive economic growth.

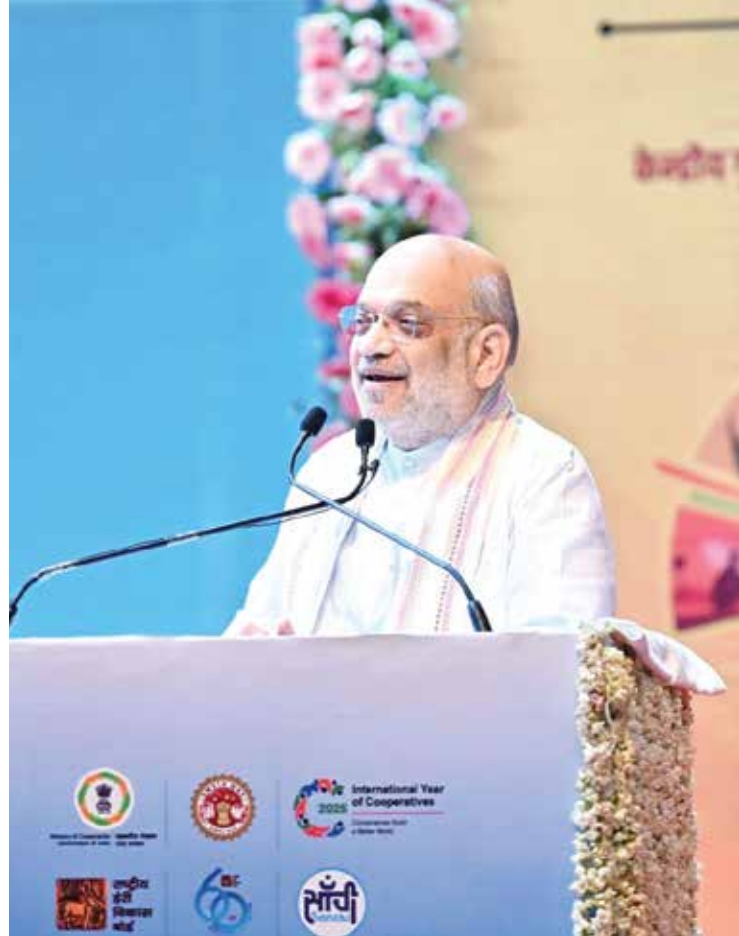
### **MINISTRY CREATED WITH THE MANTRA OF SAHKAR SE SAMRIDDHI**

Cooperatives are aligned with India's fundamental philosophy, nature, and culture. The central government, led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, took a historic step to realize the mantra of Sahkar Se Samriddhi by establishing a new ministry on July 6, 2021, the Ministry of Cooperation. Its objective was to provide a distinct administrative, legal, and policy framework to strengthen the cooperative sector. The cooperative-based development model is highly relevant

in the country, where each member performs their duties in accordance with their responsibilities. The new Ministry of Cooperation is working to facilitate ease of doing business for cooperatives, streamline processes, and enable the development of multi-state cooperatives. The cooperative economy model has been prevalent in the country since ancient times. Currently, mass movements like Amul have brought the benefits of cooperation to every village and every family. The cooperative movement plays a crucial role in increasing farmers' incomes and strengthening the rural economy, making villages self-reliant. The Central Government signaled its deep commitment to community-based development partnerships with the establishment of the Ministry of Cooperation. Long-term vision and administrative reforms to strengthen cooperative institutions through the "Sahkar Se Samridhi" approach have transformed the cooperative sector.

### THE COOPERATIVE SECTOR: BEFORE AND NOW

For more than seven decades, farmers, the rural population, and cooperative leaders in the country had been demanding a separate Ministry for Cooperatives. This demand was realized by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. With the establishment of the Ministry of Cooperation, a new chapter in the development of cooperatives began. For more than seven decades, this sector has not received the attention it deserved. The cooperative movement, too, was exhibiting uneven progress across various regions. It was doing well in the West and South, moderate in the Central Region, weak in the North, and even weaker in the East. With the establishment of a separate Ministry of Cooperation, this sector received structural institutional attention. A cooperative database was developed in collaboration with all state governments. Today, anyone can access data on the number of cooperatives in each region, and also the information on dairy, PACS, marketing, fisheries, and housing is also easily available. Following this, the central government decided to create 200,000 new primary cooperative societies (PACS), ensuring that not a single Panchayat in the country is without a PACS. Thanks to the efforts of the Central Govern-

This roadmap also includes coordination with the Government of India schemes to strengthen the cooperative ecosystem at the grassroots level. Under the cooperative-led White Revolution 2.0, efforts are underway to increase milk procurement by 50% over the next five years.**

## Bharat Taxi

### India's First Cooperative-Based Mobility Platform

Sahakar Taxi Cooperative Limited is the country's first cooperative-based mobility platform, which aims to empower drivers and provide affordable and reliable transportation to the public. Based on cooperation, transparency, and shared ownership, Sahakar Taxi is a people-centric approach to traditional ride-hailing platforms. Set to launch soon under the name "Bharat Taxi," the platform aims to transform the mobility landscape in India. This initiative aims to transform the mobility ecosystem with a cooperative-driven, transparent, and citizen-first ride-hailing platform. The project is being jointly promoted by the National Cooperative Development Corporation, along with IFFCO, NAFED, Amul, Kribhco, NDDB, NCEL, and NABARD.

*Cooperatives contribute one-third of sugar production, one-fourth of fertilizer production, one-fifth of agricultural loans, paddy and fish procurement, and one-tenth of milk production and distribution in the country.*

ment, the bylaws of the Central Government's model PACS have been approved across the country, from Kashmir to Kanyakumari and from the Northeast to Dwarka.

This change has integrated more than 25 economic activities into PACS. It has integrated an election system and incorporated a common accounting software, available in all languages. PACS provide short, medium, and long-term agricultural loans. They now distribute improved seeds, grow fruits and vegetables, and engage in beekeeping. PACS fisheries society, PACS dairy, are being formed, and other activities such as sericulture are also undertaken. PACS also operates as a Common Service Center.

Today, over 50,000 PACS have been developed as common service centers across the country, covering over 300 central and state government schemes. Birth and death registrations, air and railway ticket bookings, and any verification process are all being

done through PACS. 36,000 Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samridhhi Kendras (PMKVVs) are operating nationwide. More than 4,000 Pradhan Mantri Jan Aushadhi Kendras (PMJAYs) are being established here. Also, a number of PACS are starting their own petrol pumps. Several PACS have applied for LPG distribution. Grain storage, which had previously been left to private hands, is now being implemented under PM Modi's leadership as the world's largest food storage scheme. So far, work has begun in 76 of the 500 identified PACS warehouses. Work on 11 PACS warehouses has been completed, and paddy and wheat purchased through PACS are being delivered from storage to each person under the Muft Anna Yojana.

Computerized software has been provided for all these activities. All transactions have become online. In a way, a new modern revolution has taken place in the cooperative sector. The formation of two lakh

new multi-purpose PACS will revive the country's cooperative movement in a balanced manner. Today, more than 550 cooperative societies are registered on the GeM portal. The income tax surcharge on societies has been reduced from 12 percent to 7 percent. MAT has been reduced from 18.5 percent to 15 percent, and income tax penalties have been exempted under Section 269ST for transactions less

than Rs 2 lakh. The rate for cooperative societies involved in construction has been reduced from 30 percent to 15 percent. The cash deposit limit for PACS and others has been increased from Rs 20,000 to Rs 2 lakh. The TDS exemption limit has been increased from Rs 1 crore to Rs 3 crore. As a result of the strengthening of the cooperative sector, investors in the Sahara Group are getting their money

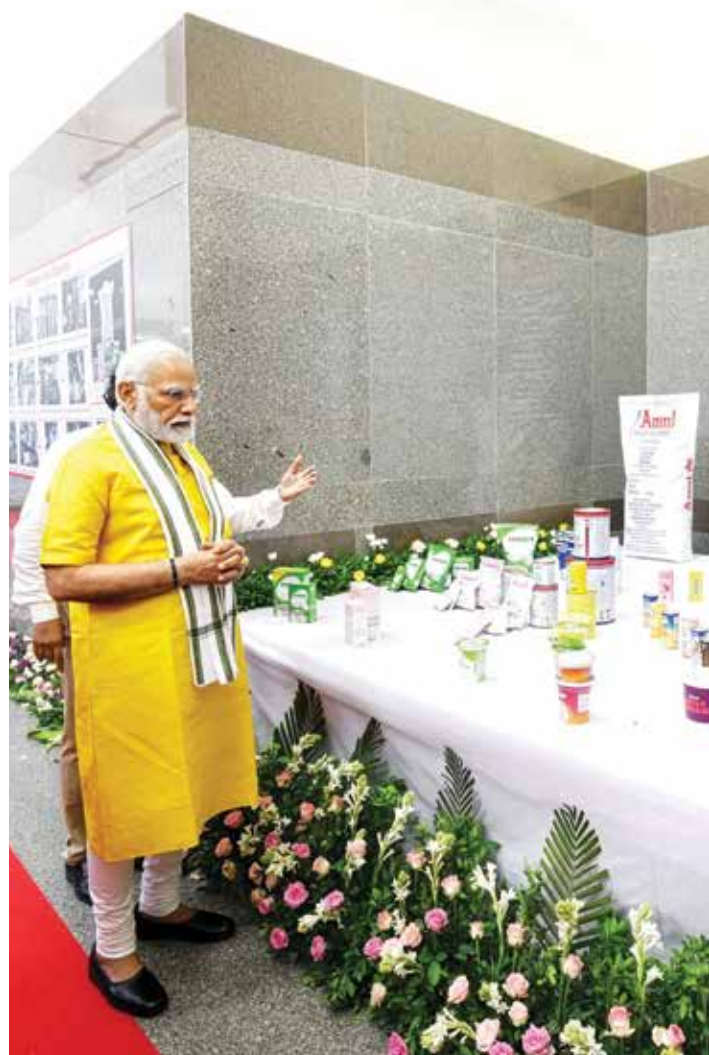


back from the company. Whenever the country has faced any crisis, the cooperative movement has pulled the country out. Cooperative banks work for the people without profit consideration because cooperation is deeply ingrained in Indian culture.

A cooperative taxi service named Sahkar Taxi, including Ola and Uber, is emerging in India, which will also register cars, bikes, and autorickshaws, with profits going directly to the drivers. A cooperative insurance company is also being formed, which will insure all cooperatives. It is likely to become the largest cooperative insurance company in the private sector.

### THE TRINITY OF THE COOPERATIVE SECTOR

The Ministry of Cooperation is committed to transforming cooperatives into vibrant and successful business entities. Three national-level cooperative societies have been formed to promote the cooperative sector, agriculture, and the prosperity of farmers. The central government has established a national cooperative organization called National Cooperative Exports Limited (NCEL), with over 8,000 PACS affiliated to it. Through this, the produce of the country's farmers is exported abroad, with the entire profit going to the farmers. Additionally, through National Cooperative Organic Limited (NCOL), organic items produced by farmers is purchased, tested, and packaged under the Bharat brand name and sold in the markets. Today, farmers from 5,000 PACS are selling their organic produce through this organization in markets both domestically and internationally. These include organic rice, flour, grains, millet, sugar, jaggery, tea, coffee, whole spices, organic oil, honey, ground spices, dry fruits, organic gram flour, organic gram dal, masoor dal, organic kidney beans, toor dal and whole green gram - today all these 100% organic items are available under the name Bharat Brand. Similarly, where earlier only big farmers were associated with Bharatiya Beej Sahkari Samiti Limited (BBSSL), now farmers with 2.5 acres of land have also been associated for seed production. Today, farmers from more than 20 thousand PACS are engaged in seed production. There are two and a half times more profits in seed

cultivation than growing crops, which earlier small farmers were not able to do, but now it has become possible.

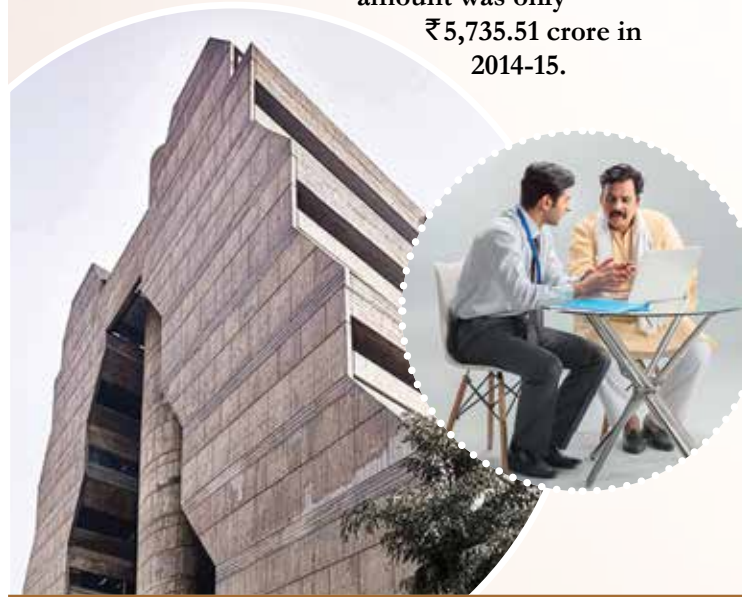
### COOPERATIVES: A PATH TO ENTREPRENEURSHIP FOR THE CAPITALLESS

The cooperative sector is the only way to connect capitalless individuals with entrepreneurship. According to economists, GDP is a key indicator of a country's economy, but with a population of 1.4 billion, GDP, along with employment, is also a significant driver. To date, 35,395 new cooperatives have been formed, which is right on track to achieve the target of establishing 200,000 multipurpose cooperative societies in the country over the next five years. The cooperative sector is opening up a path to prosperity for the landless and capitalless. India has become the world's largest milk producer. Milk production, which was 140 million tons in 2014-15, has now surpassed 240 million tons. A circular economy is getting a boost. Cooperative dairies will also provide fodder and vaccinations to the livestock of private milk sellers. They will also collect their dung and use it to produce gas. When an animal dies, cooperative dairies will also provide farmers with higher market prices for its skin and bones through cooperatives. This project has already begun with a provision of ₹10,000 crore. Under the cooperative-led White Revolution 2.0, launched on December 25, 2024, efforts are being made

### Footprint Expands

To expand its geographical reach, the National Cooperative Development Corporation (NCDC) opened a regional office in Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh, and sub-offices in Jammu and Kashmir, Ladakh, Sikkim, Manipur, Mizoram, Tripura, Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya, and Nagaland. NCDC's loan disbursements have increased from ₹24,733 crore in the 2020-21 fiscal year to ₹95,183 crore in 2024-25. This amount was only ₹5,735.51 crore in 2014-15.

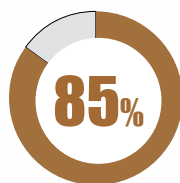

The government began expanding the scope of PACS and making them economically viable. Cooperatives are a system that not only enriches economically aspiring individuals in society but also makes them part of the broader mainstream economy. Cooperatives are a powerful tool for improving the plight of those with little or no capital. While cooperatives have a rich

Although approximately 320 million people in the country are associated with cooperatives in some form or another, the central government wants to strengthen the cooperative foundation by associating it with the future generation. This is why, under the guidance of the Ministry of Cooperation and in consultation with NCERT, the National Council for Cooperative Training (NCCT) has developed a special curriculum on cooperatives. Its goal is to make school students aware of the role of cooperatives in nation-building and inspire them to pursue a career in the cooperative sector. This special curriculum will be offered to secondary-level students in schools with the NCERT curriculum.

- Under the direction of the Ministry of Cooperation and the efforts of the National Council for Cooperative Training (NCCT), NCERT has included a chapter on cooperation in the Class 6 curriculum to provide students with basic knowledge of the cooperative movement.
- Vaibhav Shankar Mittal National Institute of Cooperative Management, Pune, has initiated to launch a new course, 'PGDM-Cooperation', affiliated to AICTE, New Delhi, for the academic session 2025. 30 students can be admitted to this course.

## TSU will guide cooperative governance, education, and research

*Tribhuvan Cooperative University (TSU) will not only empower rural India but also pave the way for transparent, professional, and inclusive development. It will provide a new direction for cooperative education, research, and governance in India. It will be the premier institution for cooperative education. A three-tier curriculum system has been designed. At the operational level, courses will be offered to those with 10th-grade education to provide essential foundational knowledge and technical skills. Diploma programs will be offered at the supervisory level, suitable for those in middle management of cooperative institutions. At the managerial level, degree and PhD programs will be offered. The university will develop e-learning platforms using cutting-edge technologies to provide quality education to cooperative workers living in remote areas.*

- TSU will establish sector-specific educational and training centers in various states, to establish institutions related to dairy cooperatives in Gujarat, fisheries cooperatives in Kerala, cooperative finance in Maharashtra, and women's cooperatives in Uttar Pradesh and Bihar.
- The curriculum will be in alignment with the National Education Policy 2020, emphasizing multidisciplinary studies. The university aims to train 800,000 students annually through digital platforms. The university will be fully operational in 2026.

## Amit Shah: The Mantra of “Sahkar Se Samriddhi” Close to His Heart

To strengthen and simplify this fundamental right to justice, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated a two-day national conference on "Strengthening the Legal Aid Delivery Mechanism" on November 8th.*

India's legal system no longer operates on a system of punishment, but is instead focused on justice. Justice is a fundamental right of every individual, and everyone should have easy access to it. The National Legal Services Authority (NALSA) is playing a vital role in ensuring ease of access to justice and legal aid. This year marks the 30th anniversary of NALSA. Over these three decades, NALSA has made significant efforts to connect the judiciary with the poorest citizens of the country. From the national level to the taluka level, legal services authorities act as a bridge between the judiciary and citizens. Today, through Lok Adalats and pre-litigation settlements, lakhs of disputes are being resolved swiftly, amicably, and at low cost. The

Legal Aid Defence Counsel System, initiated by the Government of India, has resolved nearly 8 lakh criminal cases in just three years. These efforts of the government have ensured ease of justice for the poor, the oppressed, the deprived, and the marginalized across the country.

Over the past 11 years, the government has consistently focused on enhancing Ease of Doing Business and Ease of Living. More than 40,000 unnecessary compliances for businesses have been removed. Through the Jan Vishwas Act, over 3,400 legal provisions have been decriminalized, and more than 1,500 obsolete laws have been repealed. PM Modi reiterated that "Ease of Doing Business and Ease of Living are truly possible only when Ease of Justice is

### A People's Movement for Access to Justice

During the 20th National Conference on Strengthening Legal Aid Mechanisms and to commemorate Legal Services Day, Prime Minister Modi launched the Community Mediation Training Module of the Community Mediation Scheme to facilitate mutual consent and peaceful dispute resolution. This will bring justice and community solutions to the people. PM Modi stated that the new module is reviving the ancient Indian tradition of resolving disputes through dialogue and consensus. From village panchayats to village elders, mediation has always been a part of India's civilisation. The new Mediation Act advances this tradition and modernizes it. Community mediation will create resources that will help resolve disputes, maintain harmony, and reduce litigation.

### Translations of judgements into 18 Indian languages started

Justice must be delivered in a language that is understood by the recipient. This principle must be considered at the time of drafting laws. When people comprehend the law in their own language, it leads to better compliance and reduces litigation. PM Modi stressed the need for judgements and legal documents to be made available in local languages. He commended the Supreme Court's initiative to translate over 80,000 judgements into 18 Indian languages. He expressed full confidence that this effort will continue at the High Courts and district courts as well.

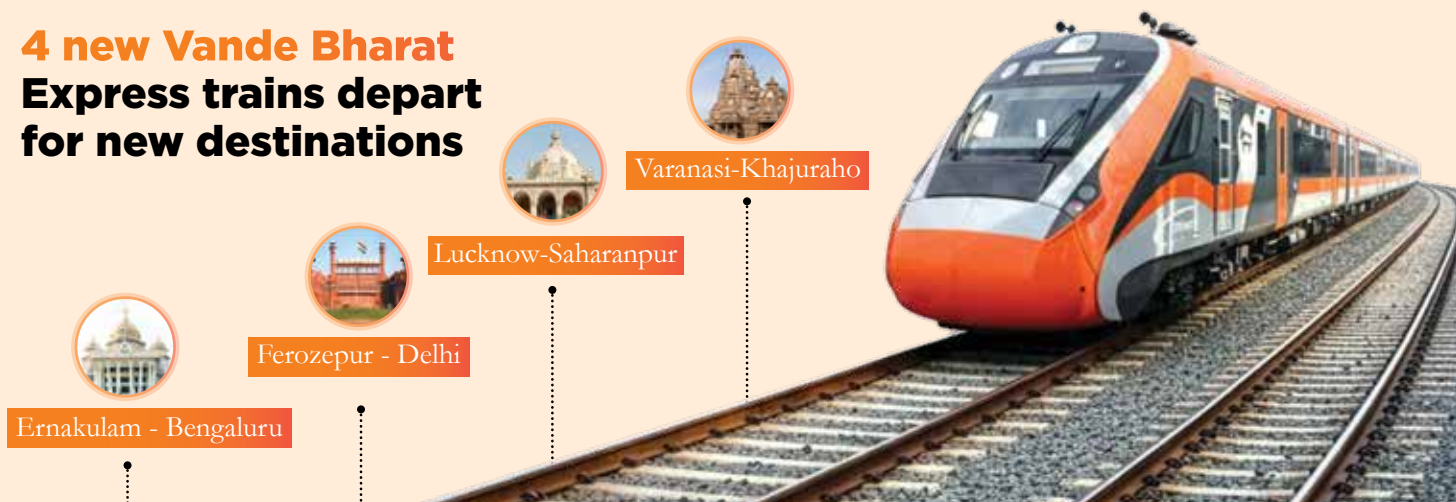

# Nuclear Plants Safe Against All Disasters

*One of the key concerns flagged for atomic and nuclear plants is their safety. In India, these plants and their surroundings are protected and secured, which follows a very high benchmark and standard. Even high magnitude earthquakes of 8.6 to 9.0 on the Richter scale cannot damage the country's nuclear plants. While tapping nuclear energy for peaceful use, special safeguards have been taken to ensure the safety and security of the people living in its surroundings.*

India's nuclear energy capacity currently stands at 8,780 MW from 24 reactors, while efforts are underway to achieve a capacity of 13,600 MW. Of this, 2,000 MW has been installed with the cooperation of Russia, and 320 MW with the United States. Nuclear energy accounts for 3% of the country's total electricity generation. The Indian government is pursuing a Nuclear Energy Mission to augment the nuclear energy generation in the country while regularly evaluating and maintaining strict safety and security protocols. Recently, in a reply given by the Minister of State for the Department of Atomic Energy, in Parliament, it was stated that a re-assessment of safety is undertaken following any major incident relevant to nuclear safety anywhere in the world.

Following the devastating earthquakes in Russia and Japan, including the 2011 Fukushima Daiichi nuclear accident, the Atomic Energy Regulatory Board undertook a comprehensive evaluation of Indian power plants to assess their capacity and prepared-

ness to withstand earthquakes, floods, and other major natural disasters. The assessment concluded that the safety systems in place at India's nuclear power plants are robust enough to remain unaffected even in the event of an earthquake measuring up to 9.0 on the Richter scale. However, safety assessments are conducted regularly in accordance with guidelines. It was also affirmed that every nuclear power plant located in coastal areas is designed with standard technical parameters to withstand earthquakes, tsunamis, storm surges, and floods. Furthermore, personnel are trained to respond to such situations.



## A Robust Framework for Nuclear Emergency Management

In India, the design of nuclear power plants (NPPs) integrates comprehensive safety concepts, features, and systems, while strict compliance with established operational procedures greatly minimizes the likelihood of serious accidents. A robust framework for managing nuclear emergencies is in place. Comprehensive measures have been established to ensure the safety of communities residing near nuclear power plants, supported by well-defined emergency response systems that include the following:

- Nuclear power plant location selection, construction, and operation are all carried out in accordance with stringent regulatory and safety requirements set by the Atomic Energy Regulatory Board.
- To minimize the potential impact on public areas due to radioactive emissions in the event of an emergency, a containment zone is identified around the NPP plant. This is to ensure immediate precautionary and prompt protective action.
- Districts or states that host nuclear power plants have district and state-level disaster management plans, which are developed in coordination with the National Disaster Management Authority.
- Each nuclear facility has a 1.5-kilometer no-go zone, a 5-kilometer deactivation zone, and a 16-kilometer emergency planning zone around it.

The Atomic Energy Regulatory Board conducted 86 inspections of operational plants over the past two years. These inspections found no deficiencies in radioactive waste management or emergency preparedness plans.

### PRIVATE SECTOR TO PARTNER IN NUCLEAR POWER GENERATION

The Nuclear Energy Mission targets generating 100 gigawatts of nuclear energy by 2047. Private sector participation has also been permitted in this sector. Also, the Department of Atomic Energy has formed a working group to consider aspects of nuclear power plant construction, ownership, operation, nuclear safety and security, and waste management. Arrangements have been made to retain foreign partners in the nuclear energy sector in accordance with the government's existing FDI policy.

### NUCLEAR POWER PLANTS TO HELP ACHIEVE NET ZERO

Over the past five years, 2,100 megawatts of nuclear energy capacity have been connected to the grid. During this period, approximately 241 billion units of clean electricity have been generated from nuclear power plants. This has reduced emissions equivalent to more than 20.7 crore tons of carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) into the environment. In the long term, nuclear energy will increase the availability of clean electricity, which will not only ensure the country's energy security but will also help in achieving the goal of net zero by 2070. ●

*To strengthen global competitiveness and accelerate the progress towards Aatmnirbhar Bharat, the Union Cabinet has approved the Export Promotion Mission and the Credit Guarantee Scheme for Exporters. This will enhance export competitiveness, strengthen the supply chain, and create new employment opportunities. This decision will further enhance the impact of "Made in India" globally. The Cabinet also approved a proposal to rationalize royalty rates for four critical minerals: graphite, caesium, rubidium, and zirconium.*

**DECISION:** The Export Promotion Mission was approved to strengthen India's export ecosystem with an outlay of ₹25,060 crore.

**IMPACT:** The mission will provide a comprehensive, flexible, and digitally driven roadmap for export promotion from fiscal years 2025-26 to 2030-31. The mission marks a strategic shift from multiple schemes to a results-based and adaptive ecosystem that can address global trade challenges and emerging exporter needs. This flagship initiative was announced in this year's budget to strengthen India's exports, especially for first-time exporters and labour-intensive sectors of MSMEs.

**DECISION:** Approval to launch the Credit Guarantee Scheme for Exporters (CGSE)

**IMPACT:** Under this scheme, the National Credit Guarantee Trustee Company Limited will provide 100% credit guarantee coverage to member lending institutions, enabling additional credit facilities of up to ₹20,000 crore to eligible exporters, including MSMEs.

- This scheme is expected to enhance the global competitiveness of Indian exporters and promote diversification into new and emerging markets.
- This will boost employment and further strengthen the country's journey towards a Viksit Bharat.

**DECISION:** Approval to rationalize royalty rates for graphite, caesium, rubidium, and zirconium minerals, which are important for green energy.

**IMPACT:** This decision will promote the auction of mineral blocks containing caesium, rubidium, and zirconium. This will enable the utilisation of not only these minerals but also critical minerals found alongside them, such as lithium, tungsten, REES, niobium, etc. Increasing indigenous production of these minerals will reduce imports and supply chain disruptions while also creating employment opportunities in the country. graphite, caesium, rubidium, and zirconium are critical minerals for high-tech applications and the energy transition.

- Graphite is a crucial component of electric vehicle (EV) batteries. It is primarily used as anode material.
- Zirconium is used in various industries, including nuclear energy, aerospace, healthcare, and manufacturing.
- Caesium is primarily used in high-tech electronics.
- Rubidium is used in the manufacture of specialised goggles used in fibre optics, telecommunications systems, night vision devices, and more. ●
