

- **India's New Thinking:** With the inauguration of the world's largest leap engine MRO facility in Hyderabad, India took a major step forward in the aircraft maintenance, repair, and overhaul sector. INS 'Mahe' was inducted into the Indian Navy. This is a reflection of India's new thinking, innovation, and youth power.
- **Historic Records:** The country achieved significant achievements in the agricultural sector. India set a historic record with a grain production of 357 million tonnes. Compared to 10 years ago, India's grain production increased by 100 million tonnes.
- **Success of Faith:** The failure of Chandrayaan-2 did not stop the scientists. That very day, they started writing the script for Chandrayaan-3's success. That is why when Chandrayaan-3 made a successful landing, it was not just the success of a mission. It was the success of faith built after failure.
- **New Records:** Today, India is setting new records in honey production. 11 years ago, honey production in the country was 76,000 metric tonnes. This has now increased to more than 1.5 lakh metric tonnes. Honey exports have also increased threefold in the last few years.
- **Jam Saheb of Navanagar:** A statue of Jam Saheb of Navanagar, Gujarat, was unveiled in Moshav Nevatim, southern Israel. This was a very special honour. Last year, I had the privilege of paying homage at Jam Saheb's memorial in Warsaw, Poland.
- **Natural Farming:** Educated young professionals are now adopting natural farming. Natural farming has been a part of India's ancient traditions, and it is our duty to continuously promote it to protect Mother Earth.
- **Kashi Tamil Sangamam:** Kashi Tamil Sangamam has become an important platform for all those who are passionate about the Tamil language. People of Kashi always express their joy in being a part of Kashi Tamil Sangamam. This time, the theme of Kashi Tamil Sangamam 4.0 is Learn Tamil – Tamil Karkalam.
- **Self-reliance:** Every Indian feels proud when India's security system is strengthened. It is a matter of pride for all of us that our Navy is rapidly moving towards self-reliance.
- **Vocal for Local:** I am happy that millions of people across the country have made the spirit of 'Vocal for Local' a part of their lives. I always urge all of you to carry forward the mantra of 'Vocal for Local'.

The Government of India launched “Yuva AI for All”


India at the cusp of bringing AI to every citizen

The Ministry of Electronics and Information Technology has launched “Yuva AI for All” to open the world of artificial intelligence to all Indians, especially youth. This is the first free course of its kind, launched under the India AI Mission. The platform offers 4.5 hours of learning, anywhere, anytime, and provides a government certificate upon completion. This initiative aims to empower 10 million citizens with basic AI skills. This course integrates global knowledge with the Indian context and focuses on ethical, responsible, and inclusive AI use.



Agriculture: Another Feather added in the cap

Achieving a new milestone, food grain production in the country increased by 8% to a record 357.7 million tonnes in the 2024-25 crop year from 332.3 million tonnes in the 2023-24 crop year (July-June). Union Agriculture Minister Shivraj Singh Chouhan believes that the record food grain production is a result of farmers' efforts, the increase in the Minimum Support Price (MSP), and government policies. Food grain production has increased by 106 million tonnes in the last 10 years, reaching 357.73 million tonnes in the 2024-25 fiscal year from 251.54 million tonnes in the 2015-16 fiscal year. The government's oilseeds mission has also achieved promising results, with an increase of more than 8% compared to 39.67 million tonnes in the 2023-24 crop year.



E-Jagriti empowers consumers: 1.27 lakh cases resolved fast

The e-Jagriti platform has rapidly emerged as an effective digital grievance redressal system to strengthen consumer rights protection. According to the Consumer Affairs Ministry, since its launch on January 1, 2025, more than 2.75 lakh consumers, including 1,388 NRIs, have registered on the platform. As of November 13, more than 1.30 lakh complaints were filed on the platform, of which more than 1.27 lakh cases have been resolved. The platform facilitates filing complaints from abroad, virtual hearings, and real-time tracking, ensuring accessible justice for all. The AI-powered, multilingual, accessible interface has also facilitated real-time tracking for consumers.





Largest cleanup of the National Identification Database...

2 crore Aadhaar IDs of deceased deactivated

Accurate and reliable data helps in better decision-making, increased efficiency, and resolving problems. This is why the Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) has deactivated the Aadhaar numbers of



over 20 million deceased individuals as part of the largest-ever cleanup of the national database. The objective is to enhance identity security, prevent fraud, and eliminate subsidy misuse. UIDAI made this decision based on data received from the Registrar General of India, the state, and various central government departments. UIDAI has also clarified that Aadhaar numbers are never duplicated to any individual. UIDAI has also launched a deceased person reporting initiative on the MyAadhaar portal. A family member can report the Aadhaar number closure by providing the required evidence, authenticating themselves and the deceased person's Aadhaar number, and providing the deceased person's registration number.

Indian Navy Warship Mahe Launched, Logo Unveiled

Marking another milestone in its indigenous shipbuilding journey, the Indian Navy launched Mahe, the first anti-submarine warfare shallow water craft (ASW-SWC) of the Mahe class, at the Naval Dockyard in Mumbai. Before this, its logo was unveiled. The ship's crest bears the "Urumi," the flexible sword of Kalaripayattu. It symbolizes agility, precision, and lethality. Mahe was built at Cochin Shipyard Limited (CSL) in Kochi. It is a cutting-edge example of the Aatmanirbhar Bharat initiative. The ship's motto, "Silent Hunters," symbolizes its stealth, vigilance, and unwavering resolve. The ship is small yet powerful. Designed to detect submarines, conduct coastal patrols, and secure the country's vital sea lanes, it is constructed with over 80 percent indigenous material.




Launch of 4th Edition of the "Nayi Chetna – Initiative for Change" Campaign

To promote gender equality and women's empowerment, the Central Government has launched the fourth edition of the "Nayi Chetna – Initiative for Change" campaign. This national campaign has become a mass movement to strengthen the safety, dignity, and economic participation of women in rural India. The New Consciousness Campaign promotes women's dignity, security, and self-reliance. It strives to increase women's access to assets, credit, skills, and markets, thereby expanding entrepreneurship and livelihood opportunities for them. This nationwide campaign is being organized by the Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana - National Rural Livelihoods Mission under the Ministry of Rural Development. The campaign will run in all states and union territories of the country until December 23, 2025.



Bringing Ramayana to Every Doorstep

The Ramayana, an important epic and sacred text, has immense significance for India and the Hindu religion and culture. Whenever the Ramayana name is taken in the same breath, the name of Ramanand Sagar comes to mind. He received adulation for his serial Ramayana, which was aired for the first time on Doordarshan in the 1980s. The characters played by actors were so realistic that they were immortalized.

From its very first episode broadcast in 1987, it evoked public emotion. Every Sunday morning, the streets would be empty as the people remained glued to their television sets to watch Ramayana. The characters were so popular that, as Ram and Sita would appear on the screen, people respectfully joined their hands in reverence. The man behind the serial was none other than Ramanand Sagar, who produced and directed through his production company, Sagar Arts. The popularity of the Ramayana can be gauged from the fact that after its 78 episodes were completed, viewers demanded the making of the story of Luv and Kush.

After his birth in Lahore on December 29, 1917, his mother named him Chandramouli. He lost his mother in childhood. After his mother's demise, his grandmother adopted him and changed his name to Ramanand. Thus, Chandramouli Chopra was given the name Ramanand Sagar. He overcame several hardships in his childhood; he faced a lot of hurdles in pursuing his studies despite a deep interest in it. He made a foray into the film industry and achieved new heights of success. He later brought Ramayana alive on the small screen,

cherishing the dignity, ideals, and teachings of Lord Shri Ram to the masses through electronic media. He also made highly acclaimed movies like Charas and Jalte Badan, along with several romantic movies, and ventured into making serials. His famous TV serials include Vikram Aur Betaal, Dada-Dadi Ki Kahaniyaan, Ramayan, Krishna, Alif Laila, and Jai Ganga Maiya.

In 2020, when Covid made an entry into the country, in the interest of the people during the 21-day lockdown, the Ministry of Information and Broadcasting and Prasar Bharati decided to re-telecast Ramanand Sagar's Ramayan on Doordarshan from March 28, 2020. This decision was taken after a public demand was made for its rebroadcast. With its re-telecast, Ramayan once again proved its popularity, breaking all TRP records as soon as it was aired on the small screen again.

Ramanand Sagar was honored with the Padma Shri by the Government of India in 2000 for his contributions to the field of art. Ramanand Sagar, a symbol of preserving and promoting Indian culture and religious values, passed away on December 12, 2005. ●

Indian Constitution: A Guide to the Nation's Present and Future


The Constitution of India is the guide for the nation's present and future.

Those who lived and died for freedom had many dreams. Cherishing those dreams and India's great tradition spanning thousands of years, our Constitution makers gave us the Constitution. India is called the "Mother of Democracy". Our Constitution has played a vital role in strengthening India's position as the "Mother of Democracy". The Constitution of India, which we take pride in today, bears the indelible imprint of Baba Saheb Ambedkar's able leadership. He ensured the welfare of every section of society. Equality for all and sensitivity towards all are the hallmarks of our Constitution. My fellow Indian, Namaste!

26th November is a day of immense pride for every Indian. It was on this very day in 1949 that the Constituent Assembly adopted the Constitution of India, a sacred document that has continued to guide the nation's progress with clarity and conviction. That is why, nearly a decade ago, in 2015, the NDA government decided to mark 26th November as Constitution Day.

It is the power of our Constitution that enabled a person like me, coming from a humble and economically disadvantaged family, to serve as the Head of the Government continuously for over 24 years. I still remember the moments in 2014, when I came to Parliament for the first time and bowed, touching the steps of the greatest temple of democracy. Again, in 2019, after the election results, when I entered the Central Hall of Samvidhan Sadan, I bowed and placed the Constitution on my forehead as a mark of reverence. This Constitution has given several others, like me, the power to dream and the strength to work towards it.

On Constitution Day, we remember all the inspiring members of the Constituent Assembly, which was presided over by Dr. Rajendra Prasad, who contributed to the making of the Constitution. We recall the efforts of Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar, who chaired the Drafting Committee with remarkable foresight. Several distinguished women members of the Constituent Assembly enriched the Constitution with their thoughtful interventions and visionary perspectives.

My mind goes back to the year 2010. This was when the Constitution of India completed 60 years. Sadly, the occasion did not receive the attention it deserved at a national level. But, to express our collective gratitude and commitment to the Constitution, we organised a 'Samvidhan Gaurav Yatra' in Gujarat. Our Constitution was placed on an elephant and I,

along with several other people from different walks of life, had the honour of being part of the procession.

When the Constitution completed 75 years, we decided that this would be an extraordinary milestone for the people of India. We had the privilege of organising a special session of Parliament and launching nationwide programmes to commemorate this historic occasion. These programmes witnessed record public participation.

This year's Constitution Day is special for many reasons.

It marks the 150th birth anniversary of two extraordinary personalities, Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel and Bhagwan Birsa Munda. Both of them made monumental contributions to our nation. Sardar Patel's visionary leadership ensured the political unification of India. It was his inspiration and courage of conviction that guided our steps to act against Article 370 and 35(A). The Constitution of India is now fully in force in Jammu & Kashmir, ensuring all constitutional rights for the people, especially the women and marginalised communities. The life of Bhagwan Birsa Munda continues to inspire India's resolve to ensure justice, dignity and empowerment for our tribal communities.

This year, we also celebrate the 150th anniversary of Vande Mataram, whose words resonate with the collective resolve of Indians through the ages. At the same time, we commemorate the 350th martyrdom anniversary of Sri Guru Teg Bahadur Ji, whose life and sacrifice continue to illuminate us with courage, compassion and strength.

All these personalities and milestones remind us of the primacy of our duties, something the Constitution also emphasises through a dedicated chapter on Fundamental Duties in Article 51A. 

Ambedkar's Statue at UNESCO Headquarters in Paris





Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Temple has 392 pillars and 44 entrances



- No iron or steel was used in the construction of the temple. To protect the structure from ground moisture, a 21-foot-high platform was built using granite.
- The temple has 392 pillars and 44 entrances. Pillars and walls are exquisitely carved with idols of Hindu deities.
- The Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Temple is built in the traditional Nagara architectural style, designed by Chandrakant Sompura of Ahmedabad.
- The temple is 161 feet high and has 12 doors.
- The idol of Ram Lalla is placed in the main sanctum sanctorum on the ground floor. Access is via 32 steps from the Singh Dwar.
- The complex has five pavilions: Nritya Mandap, Rang Mandap, Sabha Mandap, Prarthana Mandap, Kirtan Mandap, old Shiva temple and Sita Kup on Kuber Tila.

- The first Ram Janmabhoomi lawsuit dates back to 1853.
- On the night of December 22-23, 1949, an idol of Ram Lalla was found in the disputed structure.
- In 1950, 2 petitions were filed in the Faizabad Civil Court.
- On February 1, 1986, the locks of the disputed structure were opened by a court order.
- On December 6, 1992, the disputed structure was demolished by kar sevaks.
- On September 30, 2010, Allahabad High Court ordered the disputed land to be divided into 3 parts between the Sunni Waqf Board, the Nirmohi Akhara, and parties representing 'Ram Lalla Virajman'. Parties did not accept

Shri Ram Temple in Ayodhya A Symbol of Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat

The self-reliant Ram Temple has been built to eliminate outside dependence on resources. Similarly, all materials used in the temple's construction, including stone, wood, and brass, were sourced from different states, making the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Temple a symbol of Ek Bharat Shrestha Bharat.

- The pink sandstone was brought from Rajasthan, while granite stones were brought from Telangana and Karnataka.
- The carvings were done by adroit artisans from across the country.
- The high-quality teakwood is from Maharashtra, and the handcrafted wooden doors are from Hyderabad.
- The brassware is from Uttar Pradesh. The 42 bells are from Tamil Nadu.

Built entirely using Indian tradition and indigenous technology

This flag is the meaningful culmination of the spiritual practice of saints and the participation of society.

■ **Where Ideals transform into ideal behaviour:** Ayodhya is the land where ideals transform into ideal behaviour. This is the city from where Shri Ram began his life's journey. This Ayodhya showed the world how a person becomes 'Purushomtam' through the power of society and its values. When Shri Ram went into exile from Ayodhya, he was Prince Ram, but when he returned, he came as the most virtuous man. The Dhawajrohan symbolizes the completion of the temple's construction, a cultural celebration, and the beginning of a new chapter of national unity. It is not just a date on the calendar but the dawn of a new era. The Dharma Dhvaj of the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Temple is a blend of ancient traditions and modern technology. The Dharma Dhvaj features a shining sun, symbolizing the brilliance and valour of Lord Shri Ram. It bears the inscribed 'Om' along with an image of the Kovidara tree. The sacred saffron flag will convey a message of dignity, unity, and cultural continuity, embodying the ideals of Ram Rajya.

The Kovidara tree is a symbol of Lord Rama's lineage. It is made entirely from indigenous materials. Its fabric has three layers so that it remains strong even in sunlight, rain, and strong winds. Golden fabric has been added along the edges. Traditional methods have been used to highlight every line and colour on the flag. The flagpole's base is designed with a special ball-bearing chamber, allowing it to rotate 360 degrees and keep the flag fluttering smoothly even in strong winds. Redevelopment of Shri Kedarnath Dham

Shri Kedarnath is one of the 12 sacred Jyotirlingas, located at an altitude of 11,968 feet in the Rudrapur district of Uttarakhand. The temple is open to pilgrims for approximately 6 to 7 months a year, from Akshaya Tritiya (April-May) to Diwali (October-November).

- The 2013 disaster caused massive devastation to the pilgrimage town. Many buildings in the temple complex were damaged.

₹1,300 Crore, Kedarnath-Badrinath Dham was rebuilt for the divine Char Dham Yatra.

- In 2017, PM Modi envisioned the Shri Kedarnath Dham Reconstruction Plan to restore the spiritual glory and divine form of Kedarnath Dham.
- Approximately 30,000 tons of debris were removed, and an 840-foot-long stepped temple corridor was developed.
- Construction of an arrival plaza at the confluence of two rivers and the use of local stones in the temple plaza.
- Reconstruction of the damaged Shri Adi Guru Shankaracharya Samadhi, with a 12-foot-tall statue installed, which was unveiled by PM Modi.
- Kedarnath Dham, has a meditation cave. In November 2021, PM Modi spent 17 hours there, which became a



center of attraction among devotees.

- Construction of a large Sangam Ghat on the banks of the Mandakini and Saraswati rivers to facilitate bathing and religious rituals.
- India's 200,000th 5G site was activated in Gangotri, dedicated to the Char Dham fiber connectivity.
- The government is working on Kedarnath-Manaskhand connectivity. Efforts are underway to ensure that visitors to Kedarnath and Badrinath Dham can easily access Jageshwar Dham, Adi Kailash, and Om Parvat.
- The foundation stone for the Gaurikund-Kedarnath and Govindghat-Hemkund Sahib ropeways has been laid. These projects are giving new impetus to development in Uttarakhand.
- Landslide and subsidence management work is being carried out at 17 locations on NH-107 from Rudraprayag to Gaurikund at a cost of ₹357 crore.
- The 125-km-long Rishikesh-Karnprayag new rail line project will provide connectivity to religious and tourist destinations like Devprayag and Karnprayag with India's national capital.
- Around 17 lakh devotees have come to Shri Kedarnath Dham in 2025 for Dev Darshan.
- Before 2014, the record number of Chardham pilgrims was 24 lakh, which has reached around 55 lakh in 2024-25.



The Kartarpur Sahib Corridor cherishes the rich culture of Sikhism

Over the past 11 years, in a bid to boost pride and learn from our heritage and culture, many significant initiatives have been undertaken, 400th Prakash Parv of the Guru Tegh Bahadur Ji, the 550th Prakash Parv of Guru Nanak Dev Ji, and the 350th Prakash Parv of Guru Gobind Singh Ji, the removal of GST on langar, the construction of the Kartarpur Sahib Corridor, the designation of Sultanpur Lodhi as a heritage city, the establishment of Guru Nanak Chair at a British university, the repatriation of copies of the Guru Granth Sahib from Afghanistan to India, and the facilitation of Sikh pilgrims' travel to Pakistan. To commemorate the sacrifice of the Sahibzadas, the celebration of Veer Bal Divas on December 26th was started.

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi flagged off the first batch of pilgrims from the Kartarpur Corridor checkpoint at Dera Baba Nanak in Gurdaspur on November 9, 2019.
- On October 24, 2019, India signed an agreement with Pakistan to facilitate the travel of pilgrims from India to Gurdwara Darbar Sahib Kartarpur, Narowal, Pakistan, via the Kartarpur Sahib Corridor.
- Since the opening of the Kartarpur Sahib Corridor, 230,000 pilgrims have used the Kartarpur Sahib Corridor to visit Gurdwara Sri Darbar Sahib until December 2023.

Revival of the Shri Ujjain Mahakal Temple Corridor

- The Mahakal Temple in Ujjain is the only temple in the world to house a south-facing Shivalinga. This is why the Mahakaleshwar Jyotirlinga holds special significance among the 12 Jyotirlingas in India.
- The corridor project will expand the temple complex nearly seven-fold.





- The goal is to double the current annual tourist footfall of 15 million.
- The 'Mahakal Lok' features a grand entrance and a 384-meter-long mural wall depicting 25 stories of Shiva.
- This great center of spirituality has been given its grandest facelift through the Mahakal Lok project, which Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated on October 11, 2022.
- The plaza covers an area of 2.5 hectares and is surrounded on one side by a lotus pond with a fountain and a statue of Shiva.
- 108 pillars line the Mahakal Path, depicting the Ananda Tandava form (dance form) of Lord Shiva. Religious sculptures depicting the life of Lord Shiva have been installed along the Mahakal Path.
- The Mahalok Project includes the development of facilities and the expansion of the area, and the entire complex is monitored 24/7 by an Integrated Command and Control Center using artificial intelligence and surveillance cameras.

Kamakhya Temple Corridor



The area surrounding the Kamakhya Temple in Guwahati, Assam, has been expanded from 3,000 square feet to approximately 100,000 square feet. The renovation of six temples is included in this project.

On February 5, 2020, Union Home Minister Amit Shah announced the formation of the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust in Parliament. 15 trustees were appointed to the Shri Ram Janmabhoomi Teerth Kshetra Trust, with a provision for one trustee to always be from the Dalit community.

Flagstaffs and sacred Kalash have been installed on them. All works directly related to the convenience of visitors or arrangements have also been fully completed. Pamban Bridge, Tamil Nadu



- Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Pamban Bridge on April 6, 2025. It is India's first vertical lift bridge, connecting Rameswaram Island to the Indian town of Mandapam.
- The bridge holds deep cultural significance. According to the Ramayana, the construction of the Rama Setu began at Dhanushkodi near Rameswaram. Connecting Rameswaram to the mainland, this bridge stands as a remarkable achievement of Indian engineering on the global stage.
- Constructed at a cost of over ₹700 crore. Its length is 2.08 km, with 99 spans and a 72.5-meter vertical lift span that rises to a height of 17 meters, facilitating smooth movement of ships and ensuring uninterrupted train operations.
- Constructed with stainless steel reinforcement, high-grade protective paint, and fully welded joints, the bridge offers greater durability and requires less maintenance. It has been designed for dual rail tracks to meet future demands. A special polysiloxane coating protects it from corrosion, ensuring longevity in harsh marine environments.





Religious sites in Kashmir regain their glory

In August 2019, Article 370 was abrogated from Kashmir. A zero-tolerance policy on terrorism was also adopted. This thwarted the threat of terrorism, allowing the restoration of ruined and abandoned religious sites.

- The 300-year-old Raghunath Temple, a church in Dalgate, and a mosque in Srinagar were selected as the first sites for restoration under the Smart City project.
- The Raghunath Temple has regained its glory. Now, it not only a place of worship but also hosts exhibitions to introduce youth to the heritage.
- In June 2021, the renovated Shiva Temple in Gulmarg was reopened after a grand inauguration ceremony by the Army.
- In May 2022, prayers were also offered at the Martand Sun Temple in Anantnag district. Earlier, in February 2021, prayers were also started at the Sheetalnath Temple from Basant Panchami.
- Every year, devotees visit the Kheer Bhawani Temple in central Kashmir, about 27 kilometers from Srinagar, to offer prayers.
- This temple holds a sacred place in the spiritual life of Kashmiri Pandits. In the year 2022, on the auspicious occasion of Jyeshtha Ashtami, 18 thousand Kashmiri Pandits and devotees had darshan of Maa Kheer Bhawani.



Buddhist Circuit Gains Air Connectivity

On October 20, 2021, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the Kushinagar International Airport, which has led to an increase in tourist arrivals and created more employment opportunities for local residents.

- Kushinagar is an international Buddhist pilgrimage center, where Lord Gautam Buddha attained Mahaparinirvana. It is also the focal point of the Buddhist Circuit, which includes the pilgrimage sites of Lumbini, Sarnath, and Gayaji.
- The Central Government is developing a Buddhist Circuit for Buddhist sites associated with Lord Buddha. Key development initiatives under the Buddhist Circuit include connectivity, infrastructure and logistics, cultural research, heritage and education, public awareness, communication, and outreach.
- The airport is attracting more Buddhist followers from India and abroad to Kushinagar. Traveling to Lumbini, Bodhgaya, Sarnath, Kushinagar, Shravasti, Rajgir, Sankisa, and Vaishali on the Buddhist Circuit is now taking less time.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi became the first PM to visit Lumbini, the birthplace of Lord Buddha.

Pandharpur: Palkhi Marg to ease travel

- On November 8, 2021, PM Modi dedicated to the nation over 223 km of road projects to improve highway connectivity to Pandharpur.
- These include the Mhaswad-Piliv-Pandharpur, Kurduwadi-Pandharpur, Pandharpur-Sangola, the Tembhurni-Pandharpur section of NH 561A, and the Pandharpur-Mangalvedha-Umadi section of NH 561A.
- In an effort to facilitate the travel of pilgrims to Pandharpur, PM Modi laid the foundation stone for the four-laning of five sections of the Shri Sant Dnyaneshwar Maharaj Palkhi Marg and three sections of the Shri Sant Tukaram Maharaj Palkhi Marg.

Sun Temple Fully Solar Powered

- Second only to the Konark Sun Temple, the Modhera Sun Temple is a fine example of temple architecture in Gujarat. Built in the 11th century, it is located 30 kilometers from Patan city, in Bechraji taluka of Mehsana district, on the left bank of the Pushpavati River, a tributary of the Rupen River.
- On October 9, 2022, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated heritage lighting at the Modhera Sun Temple in Gujarat, India's first heritage site to be fully solar-powered. 3D projection mapping also started.
- In May 2020, the Government of India launched a plan for 100% solarization of the historic Konark Sun Temple and Konark city in Odisha. This will meet the city's energy needs.
- This plan was launched to promote PM Modi's vision of developing the Konark Sun Temple as a "Sun City."
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi showcased India's heritage and strong history to the world during the G-20 Summit by showcasing the Konark Sun Temple and Nalanda University.

Destinations under the Swadesh Darshan-Prashad Scheme

Swadesh Darshan is a centrally funded scheme. The Ministry of Tourism has approved 76 projects under this scheme so far. Under this scheme, tourist destinations are being equipped with state-of-the-art facilities. Under the Prasad Scheme, 47 projects with an estimated cost of ₹1594.40 crore have been approved, and 26 new destinations have been identified. Its objective is the holistic development of selected pilgrimage sites in the country.

- The Ministry of Tourism has now revamped its Swadesh Darshan Scheme as Swadesh Darshan 2.0 (SD 2.0). Its objective is to develop sustainable tourist destinations with a tourist- and destination-centric approach.

Shri Somnath Temple

The circumstances under which the Somnath Temple was destroyed, after which its restoration, facilitated by the efforts of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, hold a profound message for the nation. Places of faith and culture like Somnath are crucial centers for the nation's learning from the past...

- Nearly 10 million devotees from different states, across the country, and around the world visit the Somnath Temple every year.
- **Circuit House:** A new Circuit House was inaugurated in Somnath, Gujarat, on January 21, 2022. From every room in the Circuit House, visitors can view the sea and the peak of Somnath.
- **Samudra Darshan Path:** Keeping in mind the natural beauty of Somnath, the Samudra Darshan Path was built under the Central Government's 'Prashad' scheme. This 1.5-kilometer-long Samudra Darshan Path is built along the seashore.
- **Somnath Exhibition Gallery:** This gallery is themed on temple architecture. The fragmented remains of the Somnath Temple are preserved here. The temple's architecture, significance, and other information are provided in Hindi and English, as well as in Braille.

- **Ancient Somnath Temple:** The Maratha queen Mato Shri Ahilyabai Holkar of Indore established the ancient Somnath Temple in 1783. It was here that Somnath Mahadev was worshipped during the period of attacks on Somnath. The old temple complex, with its sacred worship area and inaccessible entrance, has been renovated to include a total area of 1,800 square meters. The temple's entrance has been streamlined.
- **Shri Parvati Temple:** Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone for this temple in August 2021. The trust is carrying forward its commitment to construct the temple in the Sompura Salat style, developing the sanctum sanctorum and the Nritya Mandap at a cost of approximately ₹30 crore.
- Prime Minister Narendra Modi chaired a meeting of the Somnath Trust on October 30, 2023. The Trust's environmentally friendly measures and how the temple complex can leverage the latest technology to make the pilgrimage experience even more memorable were reviewed.

Deoghar (Baba Baidyanath Dham) Air connectivity achieved

- In July 2022, PM inaugurated and laid the foundation stone for development projects worth over ₹16,800 crore in Deoghar.

Hemkund Sahib Ropeway

- In October 2022, Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone for the Hemkund Sahib Ropeway Project, connecting Govindghat to Hemkund Sahib.
- It will be approximately 12.4 kilometers long. The journey, which currently takes a day, will take only 45 minutes.
- This ropeway will eliminate the hassle of walking on the difficult paths of Hemkund Sahib. This ropeway will also connect Ghangaria, the gateway to the Valley of Flowers National Park.

Girnar Ropeway

- Mount Girnar is home to Goddess Amba. It also boasts the Gorakhnath Peak, Guru Dattatreya Peak, and a Jain temple. The construction of a world-class ropeway has now provided convenience and the opportunity for everyone to visit. Previously, it took 5-7 hours to reach the temple. Now, the ropeway covers that distance in just 7-8 minutes. This new facility has attracted more devotees and tourists.
- On October 24, 2020, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the ropeway in Girnar. The construction of the ropeway from the foothills of Bhavnath to the Ambaji Temple on Girnar Mountain is establishing its place on the global map.
- Initially, 25-30 cabins with a capacity to carry eight people were installed. The 2.3-kilometer distance can now be covered in just seven and a half minutes with the ropeway.

Pavagadh in Gujarat

Pavagadh is a city of spirituality, history, nature, art, and culture. On one hand, it is home to the Shaktipeeth of Goddess Mahakali, and on the other, to the heritage of Jain temples. Pavagadh has been a center of religious harmony, reflecting India's historical diversity. UNESCO has listed the archaeological site of Champaner as a World Heritage Site.

- On June 18, 2022, Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the redeveloped Shri Kalika Mata Temple in Pavagadh, Panchmahal. The Shikhar Dhawaja was hoisted after five centuries and 75 years of independence.
- It is one of the oldest temples in the region.
- The temple has been reconstructed in two phases. The first phase was inaugurated by the Prime Minister in April 2022.

Shared Heritage and Tribal Museums

- To give due recognition to the sacrifices and contributions made by tribal people in the country's freedom struggle, 'Museums of Tribal Freedom Fighters' is being established on the instructions of Prime Minister Modi.
- The first museum dedicated to tribal freedom fighters is the Bhagwan Birsa Munda Museum in Ranchi. Ten other tribal museums are being constructed.
- Janjatiya Gaurav Diwas is dedicated to tribal freedom fighters.
- Rashtrapati Bhavan Museum - Phase 2, New Delhi.
- Unveiling of the statue of Netaji Subhash Chandra Bose on the Kartavya Path and a long-standing demand fulfilled. Subhash Chandra Bose Museum, Delhi.
- Kranti Mandir – a museum dedicated to freedom fighters.
- Renovation of the Jallianwala Bagh Memorial Complex.
- National Museum of Indian Cinema, Mumbai.
- The Pradhanmantri Sangrahalaya is dedicated to former prime ministers in New Delhi.
- India has acquired 642 antiquities since 2014, compared to only 13 before 2014. 578 cultural artefacts have been brought back to India from the United States since 2016.

■ **Statue of Unity: The World's Tallest Statue**

The 182-meter statue of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, the architect of India's unification, built in Kevadia, Gujarat, is the tallest in the world. It was inaugurated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on October 31, 2018.

■ **Statue of Equality: World's Tallest Seated Statue**

This 216-foot-tall sitting statue in Hyderabad is the world's tallest statue in memory of the 11th-century Vaishnavite saint Sri Ramanujacharya. He promoted the idea of equality in all spheres of life, including religious affiliation, caste, and creed. On February 5, 2022, Prime Minister Modi unveiled this statue made of Panchdhatu.

■ **Statue of Prosperity**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi unveiled a 108-foot-tall bronze statue of Bengaluru's founder, Nadaprabhu Kempegowda, on November 11, 2022.

■ **Suheldev Memorial**

Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone of the Suheldev Memorial in February 2021 in Bahraich district, Uttar Pradesh. He also remembered Suheldev's contribution to the protection of Indianness.

■ **Sant Tukaram Temple**

Scientific Investigation of Dwarka and Bet Dwarka

The Underwater Archaeology Wing of the Archaeological Survey of India resumed the scientific investigation of Dwarka and Bet Dwarka in February 2025 and March



2025, respectively. Previous scientific investigations were conducted between 2005 and 2007. Remotely operated vehicles, underwater cameras, life jackets, and specialised diving gear have been purchased for this purpose.

Models of the Ram Temple and Ram Darbar Icons... Bids up to ₹51 lakh

- The 143 mementos that fetched bids of over ₹5 lakh include models of the Ram Temple and 15 Ram Darbar. There were also several models whose bids started at ₹5,000-₹6,000.
- Of the top 100 that fetched the highest price in the E-auction of PM Modi's gifts, 35 relate to religious and cultural identities. All of these were bid for over ₹10 lakh.

Bought a Ram Temple model for ₹51 lakh

Ram Darbar attracts bids of nearly ₹30L

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath presented a glass Ram Darbar idol of Lord Ram, Maa Sita, Lakshman, and Hanuman to Prime Minister Narendra Modi at an event. It was auctioned in October 2022. The base price was set at just ₹32,400, but 131 people expressed interest in taking it home, and the final bidder, who bid nearly ₹30 lakh, won the Ram Darbar idol. In another auction, a Ram Darbar icon along with a model was purchased by a devotee with a bid of ₹10 lakh. The price rose from ₹16,200 to ₹10 lakh in just the seventh bid. Another model, showing the intricately carved pillars and magnificent minarets, was sold for ₹55,000 and reached ₹10 lakh. It was gifted to Prime Minister Modi by Union Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal and auctioned in October 2024.

In Gujarat, someone might be called 'Ram Bhai'; in Tamil Nadu, 'Ramachandran'; and in Maharashtra, 'Rambhau'. This cultural continuity binds Bharat together. Take, for example, the act of bathing in our country. People typically bathe using water from a bucket, yet they invoke the names of rivers from every corner of India. The prayer 'Gange cha Yamune chaiva Godavari Saraswati, Narmada Sindhu Kaveri jalesmin sannidhim kuru' signifies that one is spiritually bathing in the waters of all these rivers, encompassing the entire nation.

Not just this, India has a tradition of sankalp (sacred resolve). Whenever someone takes a vow, performs a ritual, or even during a wedding, it begins from the universe itself: "Jambudvipe, Bharatkhande, Aryavarta..." gradually coming down to the village, then to the family, and finally invoking the family's deities.

This Indian culture, which gives the message of unity in diversity, has become the basis of the resolve of Viksit Bharat in the Amrit Kaal. Regarding how the ideals of Lord Ram teach good governance, Recalling that during the consecration of the Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, PM Modi said the nation collectively resolved to move from devotion to nation-building—



- The ASI handed over the bronze statues of Ram, Lakshmana, and Sita to Tamil Nadu's Idol Branch. These statues—stolen from the Rajagopala Vishnu Temple in 1978—were returned by London's Metropolitan Police to the Indian High Commission in September 2020.
- Seven natural heritage sites across the country have been included in the Tentative List of UNESCO World Heritage Sites. With this, the number of Indian heritage sites on the tentative list has increased from 62 to 69. India now has a total of 69 sites under consideration by UNESCO, including 49 cultural, 17 natural, and 3 mixed heritage sites. This achievement demonstrates India's unwavering commitment to the preservation and promotion of its exceptional natural and cultural heritage.



Four Labour Codes Implemented

Transforming Labour Governance **Respect for All, Security for All**

The power of “Satyameva Jayate” (truthful victory) is equally powerful for national development, because through the hard work of everyone, the thinking of everyone, the enthusiasm of everyone, and the contribution of every worker, a new India is becoming self-reliant. Following Prime Minister Narendra Modi’s mantra of “Shrameva Jayate”, four labour codes were implemented on November 21, 2025. These reforms are a major step towards empowering, protecting, and respecting every worker in the country...

A person who works is a labourer, a “Shramyogi,” devoted to work. Addresses many problems of individuals, society, and the nation, and fulfils essential needs. There is a need to view them with respect and give them recognition, along with timely reforms in government systems. The dignity of labour and the worker in social life, the pride of the “Shramyogi”, is the collective responsibility of the nation.

In a historic decision, the Government of India has announced that the four Labour Codes – the Code on Wages, 2019, the Industrial Relations Code, 2020, the Code on Social Security, 2020, and the Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions Code, 2020 – are being made effective from 21st



Code 1**The Code of Wages, 2019**

The Code on Wages, 2019, seeks to simplify, consolidate, and rationalize the provisions of four existing laws.

Key Issues

- ✓ Under the Wage Code, 2019, the number of rules has been reduced from 163 to 58, the number of forms from 20 to 6, and the number of registers from 24 to 2.
- ✓ **Minimum Wage:** This code ensures the right to a minimum wage for all workers in both the organized and unorganized sectors
- ✓ **Wage Determination:** The government will determine minimum wages by considering workers' skill levels, geographical areas, and job conditions. Previously, the minimum wage applied only to scheduled employment, which covered approximately 30% of the workforce.
- ✓ **Gender Equality:** There will be no discrimination on the basis of gender in recruitment, wages, and conditions of employment for the same work.
- ✓ **Wage Payment:** Previously applicable only to employees earning up to ₹24,000 per month, it will now apply to all employees above this salary limit.
- ✓ **Overtime Compensation:** Employers cannot pay overtime wages at a rate less than double the normal wage for any work performed beyond regular working hours.
- ✓ One Nation, One Wage Code – consolidates four existing wage laws into one, providing a uniform definition of wages, workers, employees, etc.

The Industrial Relations Code (IR Code) acknowledges the fact that the survival of the worker depends upon the survival of the industry. It promotes harmony and ease of doing business.

Key Issues

- ✓ **Reduced compliance burden:** The number of rules has been reduced from 105 to 51, the number of forms from 37 to 18, and the number of registers from 3 to zero.
- ✓ **Fixed-term employment:** Full parity in wages and benefits, time-limited contracts permitted. Gratuity eligibility after one year.
- ✓ **Reskilling Fund:** A fund established by contributing an amount equivalent to 15 days' wages to train each retrenched employee.
- ✓ **Trade union recognition:** A union with 51% membership will be recognized as a negotiating union.
- ✓ **Expanded definition of worker:** Includes employees, journalists, and workers earning up to ₹18,000 per month.
- ✓ **Women's representation:** Ensures proportional representation of women in grievance committees to resolve gender-sensitive issues.
- ✓ **Work from home provision:** Permitted in service sectors with mutual consent.
- ✓ **Tribunals:** A two-member tribunal consisting of a judicial and administrative member for dispute resolution.
- ✓ **Direct tribunal access:** Parties can approach the tribunals directly after conciliation fails within 90 days.

Code 3

The Code on Social Security, 2020

The Code on Social Security incorporates nine existing social security acts. This code provides social security to all workers, covering life, health, maternity, and provident fund benefits.

Key Issues

- ✓ **Time-bound EPF inquiries:** A five-year limit has been set for initiating EPF inquiries and recovery proceedings.
- ✓ **Reduced EPF Appeal Deposit:** Employers appealing against EPFO orders will now have to deposit only 25% of the assessed amount.
- ✓ **Self-Assessment for Construction Cess:** Employers can now self-assess cess liabilities in respect of building and other construction work.
- ✓ **Inclusion of Gig and Platform Workers:** New definitions of social security coverage have been included – 'aggregator', 'gig worker', and 'platform worker'.
- ✓ **Social Security Fund:** A dedicated fund is proposed to finance schemes covering life, disability, health, and old-age benefits for unorganized, gig, and platform workers.
- ✓ **Expanded definition of dependents:** Extended to grandparents. Dependent parents-in-law of female employees are also included.
- ✓ **Uniform definition of wages:** 'Wages' now includes basic pay, dearness allowance, and retaining allowance.
- ✓ **Inclusion of travel accidents:** Accidents occurring while travelling between home and workplace are now considered employment-related.
- ✓ **Gratuity:** The eligibility period has been reduced from 5 years to 1 year.

Code 4**Occupational Safety, Health and Working Conditions of Service Code 2020**

This Code has been formulated by incorporating, simplifying, and rationalizing relevant provisions of 13 central labour laws. It ensures worker rights and safe working conditions. This will promote economic growth and employment. It will make India's labour market more efficient, fair, and future-ready.

Key Issues

- ✓ **Unified Registration:** A uniform threshold of 10 employees has been set for electronic registration.
- ✓ **Extension to Hazardous Work:** The government can extend the provisions of this Code to any establishment with even a single employee.
- ✓ **Simplified Compliance:** A framework of one licence, one registration, and one return has been introduced for establishments.
- ✓ **Expanded Definition of Migrant Workers:** The definition of migrant workers now includes workers who are employed directly, through contractors, or migrate on their own.
- ✓ **Health:** Free annual health check-up for employees.
- ✓ **Appointment Letters:** Appointment letters will be issued, indicating wages and social security to enhance transparency and accountability.
- ✓ **Employment of Women:** Women can work in all types of establishments and during night hours with consent and safety measures.
- ✓ **Expanded definition of media worker:** 'Working journalists' and 'cine workers' now include workers in all forms of electronic media and audio-visual production.
- ✓ **National Database for Unorganized Workers:** There will be a national database for unorganized workers, including migrant workers.
- ✓ **Compensation to Victims:** In case of injury or



death, courts may direct at least 50% of the fine imposed to be paid as compensation to the victims or their legal heirs.

- ✓ **Safety Committees:** Establishments with 500 or more workers will form safety committees with employer-worker representation.
- ✓ **Social Security Fund:** A fund has been established for the welfare and benefit distribution of unorganized workers.

complex and, in several parts, outdated provisions spread across 29 Central labour laws. These restrictive frameworks struggled to keep pace with changing economic realities and evolving forms of employment, creating uncertainty and increasing the compliance burden for both workers and industry. The implementation of the four Labour Codes

addresses this long-pending need to move beyond colonial-era structures and align with modern global trends. Together, these codes empower both workers and enterprises, building a workforce that is protected, productive and aligned with the evolving world of work — paving the way for a more resilient, competitive and self-reliant nation. ●

Indigenous Integrated REPM Factory to Make a Foray in India

The Union Cabinet approved a plan to establish India's first integrated ecosystem for sintered rare earth permanent magnet (REPM) manufacturing. This REPM ecosystem will make India a manufacturing hub for electric vehicles, renewable energy, electronics, aerospace, and defense applications. This will generate significant employment for youth. Furthermore, the Union Cabinet also approved the Pune Metro Rail Project Phase-2 and two railway multi-tracking projects...

DECISION: Approval of a ₹7,280 crore project to promote sintered rare earth permanent magnet manufacturing.

IMPACT: This one-of-a-kind initiative aims to establish an integrated REPM manufacturing capacity of 6,000 metric tons per year in India. This decision will further strengthen India's national capabilities in strategic sectors such as renewable energy, e-mobility, defense, and space. High-tech manufacturing will be encouraged, leading to increased self-reliance. India will be positioned as a major manufacturing country in the global REPM market. Sintered rare-earth permanent magnets are the most powerful permanent magnets made from alloys of rare-earth elements such as neodymium and samarium. India's REPM consumption is expected to double between 2025 and 2030, driven by rapidly growing demand for electric vehicles, renewable energy, industrial applications, and consumer electronics. Currently, India's REPM demand is primarily met through imports. The scheme has to be completed in 7 years from the date of award.

DECISION: Pune Metro Rail Project Phase 2: Kharadi-Khadakwasla (Line 4) and Nal Stop-Warje-Manik Baug (Line 4A) approved.

IMPACT: Lines 4 and 4A, totaling 31.6 kilometers with 28 elevated stations, will connect IT hubs, commercial areas, educational institutions, and residential clusters of East, South, and West Pune. The project will be completed in five years at an estimated cost of ₹9,857.85 crore. According to projections, daily ridership on Lines 4 and 4A is expected to reach 4.09 lakh combined in 2028, increasing to nearly 7 lakh in 2038, 9.63 lakh in 2048, and over 11.7 lakh in 2058. With the approval of these corridors, the Pune Metro network will span over 100 kilometers. With Lines 4 and 4A, Pune will not only get more metro tracks, but also a faster, greener, and more connected future. This corridor will reduce commute times, decongest traffic, and provide citizens with a safe, reliable, and affordable option.

DECISION: Approval of two railway multi-tracking projects covering four districts in Maharashtra and Gujarat.

IMPACT: The total estimated cost of the project is 2,781 crore. These two projects, covering four districts in the states of Maharashtra and Gujarat, will expand Indian Railways’ existing network by approximately 224 kilometers. This initiative will strengthen Dwarkadhish Temple connectivity and the freight corridor. The approved multi-tracking project will improve connectivity to approximately 585 villages, with a population of approximately 3.2 million. The increased line capacity will significantly enhance mobility for Indian Railways, resulting in improved operational efficiency and service reliability. The project will add 18 MTPA of freight capacity. It will also result in savings of 30 million liters of fuel and a reduction of 160 million kg of CO₂, equivalent to planting 6.4 million trees. Through this development, these projects will make local people self-reliant, increasing employment and self-employment opportunities for them. These projects include -

A Nation Moving Towards a State-of-the-Art Security System for a Viksit Bharat

India, advancing towards the goal of becoming a developed nation by 2047, is working tirelessly to achieve comprehensive transformation in all sectors. Security is the most important foundation for any nation, and therefore, the annual DGP Conference serves as a platform to further enhance police administration through technology in the changing times, while also adapting future technologies to the ground-level needs of policing.

Furthermore, aircraft are often grounded for extended periods. This situation is not conducive to a large aviation market like India. This is why India is now working on aviation-related MRO systems alongside shipping. Expanding natural farming is a key requirement of 21st-century agriculture. In recent years, the growing demand for food has led to a rapid increase in the use of chemicals in agricultural fields and on farms. Excessive use of chemical fertilizers and pesticides is leading to a decline in soil fertility and impacting moisture. Along with this, the cost of agriculture is also steadily increasing. The solution to this problem lies in crop diversification and natural farming. Based on these facts, PM Modi has stated that we must move towards natural farming. This is both our vision and our need. Natural farming helps us cope with climate change. It can main-

tain the health of our soil. It can also protect people from harmful chemicals. State governments and FPOs play a vital role in this natural farming campaign. In the past few years, 10,000 FPOs have been formed. With the support of FPOs, we should create small clusters or groups of farmers. Provide facilities for cleaning, processing, and packaging, and connect directly to online markets. This will further increase the profit potential for farmers involved in natural farming.

Farmers in South India are advancing by combining

₹4 lakh crore deposited in farmers' accounts

The central government is continuously taking steps to empower farmers. On Nov. 19, 2025, under the PM-KISAN scheme launched in the 2018-19 financial year, PM Modi transferred ₹18,000 crore to the accounts of 9 crore farmers as the 21st installment. So far, more than ₹4 lakh crore has been transferred to the bank accounts of small farmers under this scheme.

Even educated youth are now turning to agri-training

PM Modi also interacted with farmers involved in natural farming. The farmers informed him about more than 100 natural products from South India – highlighting honey as a key item – along with a thousand traditional varieties of paddy, four types of tea including white tea, and products made from banana waste. They also shared details about 25 GI-tagged products. PM Modi spoke about Gujarat's "Cattle Hostel" concept for clean villages and efficient livestock care. When he asked whether young people were coming for training, the farmers said that a large number of youth are actively participating. Earlier, such individuals were considered eccentric, but now they earn ₹2 lakh per month and are seen as sources of inspiration.

agricultural innovation with the core philosophy of Indian farming. This includes multicultural farming. In many regions of South India – such as Kerala or the hilly areas of Karnataka – farmers grow coconut, areca nut, and various fruit trees together in the same field. In the lower sections, spices and pepper are cultivated.

Prime Minister Modi also considers this to be the core philosophy of natural farming. He wants to take this model of farming to the national level. He has urged state governments to consider how this type of natural farming can be implemented across different regions of the country. PM Modi has described South India as a living university of agriculture.



Natural farming has begun on over 5.45 lakh hectares of land

More than 1.43 million farmers have joined the National Mission on Natural Farming, approved by the Union Cabinet on November 25, 2024, with an outlay of ₹2,481 crore, as of August 2025. These farmers are practising natural farming on over 5.45 lakh hectares. Under this mission, each farmer is given an incentive of ₹4,000 per year (per farmer per acre) for two years.

Benefits of Natural Farming...

A study conducted by the Indian Agricultural Systems Research Institute on the farms of 484 farmers at 20 locations in 16 states revealed that natural farming leads to a 0.25% increase in soil organic carbon content and a 29% reduction in production costs. According to an ICAR study, the benefit-cost ratio has improved by 15% to 270% in three states.



New Strength of Viksit Bharat

The role of nuclear energy in accelerating India's resolve to become a developed nation is becoming more powerful. Expanding its reach as a clean, reliable, long-term energy source and implementing indigenous technologies, emerging research capabilities, and cutting-edge projects, India is today firmly positioned among global nuclear power nations. With these efforts, India is moving towards a sustainable, secure, and self-reliant energy future...

To achieve the broader objectives of a developed India, ensure energy reliability, and reduce dependence on fossil fuels, the Government of India has outlined major developments under a long-term energy transition strategy. As part of this, the central government has set an ambitious target of 100 GW of nuclear power capacity by 2047. Strategic interventions and infrastructure investments are underway to achieve this goal, with a focus on indigenous nuclear technology and public-private partnerships.

Recognizing nuclear energy as a critical component for achieving energy security, the government has launched the Nuclear Energy Mission for a Developed India. This



Government Initiatives to Expand India's Nuclear Capacity

India is actively expanding its nuclear power capacity to meet growing energy demands and achieve environmental goals. The government has taken steps to increase nuclear power capacity from the current 8,780 MW to 22,480 MW by 2031-32. This expansion includes the construction and commissioning of ten reactors with a total capacity of 8,000 MW in Gujarat, Rajasthan, Tamil Nadu, Haryana, Karnataka, and Madhya Pradesh. Pre-project activities have begun for another ten reactors, which are planned to be completed by 2031-32. Furthermore, the government has granted in-principle approval to establish a 6 x 1208 MW nuclear power plant in collaboration with the United States at Kovvada in Srikakulam district in the state of Andhra Pradesh.

On September 19, 2024, the country achieved a significant milestone in the field of nuclear energy. Unit 7 of the Rajasthan Atomic Power Project, one of the country's largest and the third indigenous nuclear reactor, has reached criticality. The plant initiated a controlled fission chain reaction. This symbolizes India's growing capability to build and operate indigenous nuclear reactors powered by homegrown technology.

- By 2047, India is moving forward with a resolve to increase its nuclear power capacity more than tenfold.
- **Annual nuclear power generation increased by 60%** from 35,592 million units in 2014-15 to 56,681 million units in 2024-25.
- **Installed nuclear capacity increased by 71%** from approximately 4,780 MW in 2014 to 8,780 MW in 2025 across 25 nuclear reactors operated by Nuclear Power Corporation of India Limited (NPCIL).

Prime Minister Narendra Modi attended the summit from November 21 to 23 at the invitation of South African President Cyril Ramaphosa. During his visit, he addressed several sessions of the Summit and held bilateral meetings with several global leaders, during which several important decisions were taken.



During the G-20 summit in 2023, under India's presidency, the African Union was made one of its members. The G20 summit was held in South Africa for the first time from November 21 to 23. This time, the theme of the G-20 Summit was "Solidarity, Equality, and Sustainability." South Africa, through this summit, sought to advance the outcomes of the previous summits held in India and Brazil. Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who attended the G-20 summit for the 12th time, presented the country's vision in alignment with 'वसुधैव कुटुम्बकम्' and 'One Earth, One Family, and One Future'.

FIRST SESSION

In the first session of the summit on November 22, PM Modi said that commendable work has been done under South Africa's presidency on issues such as skilled migration, tourism, food security, AI, the digital economy, innovation, and women's empowerment. Over the past several decades, the G-20 has shaped global finance and global economic growth. PM Modi proposed to create a Global Traditional Knowledge Repository within the G-20, which could serve as the basis for the Indian Knowledge Systems Initiative. This could become a global platform that would help disseminate humanity's

collective knowledge to future generations. Promoting Africa's development and young talent is in the global interest. This is why India has proposed the G-20-Africa Skills Multiplier Initiative. This could operate under a 'train-the-trainers' model for different sectors. PM Modi stated that the collective goal is to train one million trainers in Africa over the next decade. India has proposed the formation of a G20 Global Healthcare Response Team, composed of trained medical experts from G20 countries, ready for rapid deployment in the event of a global health crisis or natural disaster. We must work together to ensure that the voice of the Global South is amplified in all global institutions.

SECOND SESSION

PM Modi said that natural disasters pose a significant challenge to humanity. Therefore, global cooperation must be strengthened to address natural disasters. With this vision, India established the Disaster Risk Reduction Working Group during its G20 presidency. South Africa has also taken this agenda forward. India believes that space technology benefits all humanity. Therefore, India has proposed the G20 Open Satellite Data Partnership. This will make satellite data and analysis from G20 space agencies more accessible, interoperable, and useful for countries in the Global South.

Sustainability and clean energy are essential for global growth. Critical minerals play a vital role in ensuring this. Therefore, India has proposed the G20 Critical Mineral Circularity Initiative. This initiative could promote innovations such as recycling, urban mining, and second-life batteries. During the G20 summit in New Delhi, India pledged to triple renewable energy and double energy efficiency by 2030. To achieve this goal, developed countries must fulfill their commitments to provide affordable climate finance and technology in a timely manner.

The Prime Minister outlined India's vision for development, progress, and well-being for all, placing six points before the G20 for consideration...

- 1 Building the G20 Global Traditional Knowledge Repository:** This will harness humanity's collective wisdom for the benefit of future generations.
- 2 Building the G20 Africa Skills Multiplier:** This program aims to create a pool of 10 Lakh certified trainers to skill youth in Africa. This will build local capacities and promote long-term development on the continent.
- 3 Building the G20 Global Healthcare Response Team:** This will comprise healthcare experts from each G20 country and can be deployed to address global health challenges in any part of the world.
- 4 Establishing the G20 Open Satellite Data Partnership:** Through this program, satellite data from G20 space agencies will be made available to developing countries for activities such as agriculture, fisheries, disaster management, and more.
- 5 Creation of the G20 Critical Minerals Circularity Initiative:** This initiative will promote recycling, urban mining, second-life battery projects, and a variety of innovations. It will help strengthen supply chain security and develop cleaner pathways to development.
- 6 Creation of the G20 Initiative to Counter the Drug Terror Nexus:** This will prevent drug trafficking and dismantle the drug-terror economy.





PM Modi holds bilateral talks with global leaders

Prime Minister Narendra Modi met with South African President Cyril Ramaphosa, Canadian Prime Minister Mark Carney, Italian Prime Minister Giorgia Meloni, Japanese Prime Minister Sanae Takaichi, and Australian Prime Minister Anthony Albanese.



India-South Africa

The two leaders reviewed bilateral relations and expressed satisfaction with progress in various areas of cooperation, including trade and investment, food security, skills development, mining, youth, and people-to-people ties. They discussed ways to enhance cooperation in the areas of artificial intelligence, digital public infrastructure, and critical minerals. Prime Minister Modi thanked President Ramaphosa for the relocation of South African cheetahs to India and invited him to join the India-led International Big Cat Alliance.

Global Institutions Are Far From 21st-Century Realities agrees IBSA

IBSA (India, Brazil, and South Africa) is not just a group of three countries; it is an important platform connecting three continents, three major democratic powers, and three large economies. All three countries agreed that global institutions are far from 21st-century realities. None of the three countries is a permanent member of the United Nations Security Council. This clearly demonstrates that global institutions do not represent today's world. Therefore, IBSA must unanimously send a message to the entire world that institutional reform is no longer an option, but a necessity. This year, IBSA was chaired by Brazilian President Luiz Inacio Lula da Silva. At the meeting, Prime Minister Modi noted that the first meeting of the National Security Advisors of the three countries was held in 2021 under India's IBSA chairmanship. The three countries can institutionalize this to strengthen security cooperation. On counter-terrorism, the Prime Minister emphasized the need for strong coordination, saying that there should be no room for double standards when fighting terrorism. Technology plays a vital role in ensuring human-centric development. PM Modi proposed the establishment of an 'IBSA Digital Innovation Alliance' to facilitate the sharing of digital public infrastructure like UPI, health platforms like CoWIN, a cybersecurity framework, and women-led technology initiatives among the three countries.



India will host the AI Impact Summit in February 2026, with the theme: For the welfare of all, for the well-being of all. India has invited G-20 countries to participate.



India-Canada

The Prime Ministers of the two countries discussed cooperation in trade and investment, defense, education, space, science and technology, and energy. PM Carney expressed support for the AI Summit being hosted by India in February 2026. They agreed to commence negotiations on a high-profile Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA), to double trade between the two countries to \$50 billion by 2030. The two leaders stressed the importance of regular high-level dialogue.



India-Japan

The two leaders reaffirmed the importance of the India-Japan Special Strategic and Global Partnership, based on civilizational ties, shared values, mutual goodwill, and a commitment to a free and open Indo-Pacific. The two leaders emphasized their commitment to further deepen the India-Japan partnership for regional and global peace, prosperity, and stability. The leaders acknowledged the continued progress made in bilateral relations during the 15th India-Japan Annual Summit.



India-Italy

The two countries adopted the 'India-Italy Joint Initiative to Combat Terrorism Financing'.

This initiative aims to strengthen bilateral cooperation against terrorism and enhance partnership in multilateral forums such as the Financial Action Task Force (FATF) and the Global Counter Terrorism Forum (GCTF). The two leaders reviewed the progress of the bilateral strategic partnership in areas such as trade and investment, defense, security, space, science and technology, education, and people-to-people contacts. The two leaders also expressed satisfaction with the progress of the Joint Strategic Action Plan 2025-29.



India-Australia

The two leaders discussed further strengthening bilateral cooperation in a wide range of areas, including political and strategic issues, defense and security, trade and investment, energy, critical minerals, technology, mobility, education, and people-to-people contacts. They also exchanged views on regional and global issues of mutual interest. They reiterated their commitment to elevate the India-Australia Comprehensive Strategic Partnership to even greater heights.

THIRD SESSION

Prime Minister Narendra Modi addressed the third session of the Summit (theme: "A Fair and Just Future for All – Critical Minerals; Decent Work; Artificial Intelligence"). He called for a tectonic shift in the way critical technologies are promoted. They should be based on "human-centric" rather than "finance-centric," "global" rather than "national," and "open

source" rather than "exclusive models." AI systems impact human life, security, and public trust, and therefore must be made accountable. Most importantly, AI should enhance human capabilities, but the ultimate responsibility for decision-making should always remain with humans. ●




