



EPF Withdrawal Now Easier and Faster...

No Need to Cite Reasons

Withdrawing your money deposited in the Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) has now become simpler and faster. 13 different categories and numerous conditions have been simplified to create a uniform provision. This will benefit over 30 crore people. These decisions were taken at a meeting of the EPFO's Central Board of Trustees, chaired by Union Labour and Employment Minister Mansukh Mandaviya.

Withdrawal Limits Simplified – Whether It's Amount or Frequency

- Now, only 3 categories are kept for partial withdrawal: essential needs, housing, and special circumstances. A 1-year service period will apply to all types of partial withdrawals.
- Previously, 5 and 7 years of service were mandatory for withdrawing funds for marriage and house construction, respectively; now, only one year is required.
- Withdrawals for education can be made 10 times, and for marriage 5 times. Earlier, only 3 withdrawals were allowed. In special or emergency situations, the entire eligible amount can be withdrawn up to twice a year without any questions asked.
- Employees can withdraw up to 75% of the combined amount including interest.

Initiative to bring more employees under social security!

Eligible employees who joined service between July 1, 2017, and October 31, 2025, can now be voluntarily enrolled by their employer under EPFO with a nominal panel damage. The employee enrollment scheme will be effective from November 1, 2025, to April 30, 2026.

With EPFO reforms, employees' social security is now ensured!

- After leaving the job, up to 75% of the amount can be withdrawn immediately. The remaining 25% amount can be withdrawn after completing 1 year.
- Earlier, multiple withdrawals caused breaks in service, because previously, the full amount could be withdrawn 2 months after leaving the job. This prevented meeting the 10-year continuous service requirement for pension, resulting in no pension benefits.

Pension service now at your doorstep!

EPFO, in collaboration with India Post Payments Bank, has decided to provide the facility of a Digital Life Certificate free of cost at the homes of EPF '95 pension holders.

Free Biometric Update for Children Aged 7-15

If your child is between 7 and 15 years old and hasn't had their Aadhaar biometrics updated, this is important news. The Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) has waived all mandatory biometric update (MBU-1) fees for children in this age group. This waiver will be effective from October 1, 2025, and will last for the next one year. This waiver will benefit approximately 60

million children. The free biometric update facility in Aadhaar will facilitate children's access to education, scholarships, and Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT)

schemes. With the new waiver, the update process will be free for all children aged 5-17, i.e., MBU-1 and MBU-2.



Sanchar Saathi Initiative



If your mobile is lost or stolen, report it on www.sancharsaathi.gov.in, along with filing a police complaint or FIR. Upon reporting here, the mobile is not only blocked but also linked to the government's digital systems, increasing the chances of recovery. Launched in May 2023, Sanchar Saathi has now become India's most comprehensive digital security platform. Of the 39.56 lakh complaints of stolen or lost mobile phones reported here, 24.46 lakh have been traced. Furthermore, over 6.39 lakh handsets have also been recovered.

Record 22 Medals Won at the World Para Athletics Championships

India achieved its best-ever performance at the 2025 World Para Athletics Championships, winning a record 22 medals, including 6 gold, 9 silver, and 7 bronze. India finished 10th in the medal tally. India successfully hosted the World Para Athletics Championships for the first time, earning a place of pride in the world. The medal winners at the 2025 World Para Athletics Championships included 15 athletes from the government's Target Olympic Podium Scheme and one from the Khelo India program. Prime Minister Narendra Modi praised the para-athletes, saying, "A historic performance by our para-athletes! Their success will inspire many. I am proud of every member of the contingent. I wish them all the best in their future endeavours." India won 9 medals at the 2019 World Para Athletics Championships in Dubai, 10 in 2023 in Paris, and 17 in 2024 in Kobe. While Indian athletes won only four medals at the Paralympics in 2016, they achieved their best-ever performance at the 2024 Paris Paralympics, achieving 29 medals.

Mahabharat Now in a New Form on Doordarshan

Episodes of the epic Mahabharata, in a new AI version, will be available every Sunday at 11 a.m. on the national television network Doordarshan, starting November 2, 2025. Prasar Bharati and Collective Media Network have partnered for this. The



episodes will be simultaneously available to digital audiences in India and around the world via Waves OTT. Using advanced AI tools, the series recreates the vast scope of the Mahabharata epic, its characters, battlefields, emotions, and moral dilemmas, with cinematic scale and stunning realism. This project embodies the spirit of Make in India and Digital India.

...whom Tagore titled the 'Queen of Dance'

Once in a century, an artist is born whose art dazzles the world and lays the cultural foundation upon which future generations build their identity. In this journey of struggle, dedication, and sacrifice, one such name is Sitara Devi, who transformed Kathak from merely a dance form into a celebration of life. So profound was her talent that none other than Gurudev Rabindranath Tagore bestowed upon her the title of Nritya Samragyi – the Queen of Dance.

ate: November 8, 1920... Place: Kolkata, the day of Dhanteras. A baby girl was born. It is said that the newborn's mouth was slightly crooked. Frightened by this, the parents handed her over to a midwife. The midwife named her Dhanno. She massaged the baby day and night and gradually managed to reduce the crookedness of her mouth to a great extent. When the parents learned about this, they finally took the child back home after eight years. Dhanno had now become Dhanlakshmi.

At that time, it was common for girls to be married at a very young age. So, at the age of 8, Dhanlakshmi was also married off. Her in-laws wanted her to focus on household chores, but she insisted on going to school. As a result, the marriage ended.

Her father, a resident of Varanasi, was a Kathak artist by profession. Sukhdev Maharaj, by then, had already recognised his daughter's potential for greatness. He named her Sitara instead of Dhanalakshmi. Sitara received dance lessons from Achhan Maharaj, the father of Shambhu Maharaj and Pandit Birju Maharaj. By the age of 10, she began performing solo dance performances.

She usually performed in cinema halls during the fifteen-minute intermission between films. This was a time when a woman dancing on stage was not looked upon favourably. She first entered the film world at the age of 11. She is credited with introducing Kathak to Bollywood. She worked in films like Sheher Ka Jadoo, Swami, Roti, and Mother India. However, after Mother India, she stopped working in films to focus on classical dance.

It is said that Rabindranath Tagore was so impressed by a performance by the 16-year-old Sitara that he nicknamed her "Queen of Dance". He also presented her with a shawl and a gift of 50 rupees as a token of appreciation. Gurudev's words proved true. With her performances, she captivated the entire world. She performed in every important country in the world, including her full-house performances at the Royal Albert Hall in England and Carnegie Hall in New York, which are still remembered today.

She was honoured with several awards, including the Padma Shri, the Sangeet Natak Akademi Award, and the Kalidas Samman. She passed away on November 25, 2014. Prime Minister Narendra Modi also expressed condolences after her death.

India Awarded the International Social Security Association Award 2025


elf-reliance, self-welfare, and self-respect are the three key pillars that are very important to every citizen of the country. It aims to promote ease of living, and India's vision of progress is inclusive, its mission inclusive. This inclusive philosophy underpins every policy and every scheme of the Central Government, resonating not only across the country but also globally. India, committed to social security, has received the International Social Security Association (ISSA) Award for the year 2025. This award is dedicated to Prime Minister Narendra Modi's principle of 'Antyodaya,' which aims to ensure security for the marginalized people. This award was received by Union Labour and Employment Minister Mansukh Mandaviya in Kuala Lumpur, the capital of Malaysia.

- According to the International Labour Organization, social security is the protection cover provided to individuals and families to ensure access to health care and guarantee income security.
- It is particularly important in times of old age, illness, unemployment, disability, maternity, workplace injury, or the death of a breadwinner. Social security is recognized as a fundamental human right as defined in International Labour Organization conventions and United Nations documents.
- According to the International Labour Organization, India has significantly increased social security coverage, increasing from 19% in 2015 to 64.3% in 2025. Now, 950 million Indians are receiving health insurance, pensions, and other benefits.

India is the fifth country to receive the honor. India is the fifth country in the world to be honored with this award. The award was started in 2013. Established in 1927, the ISSA comprises more than 330 member organizations from 158 countries.

Today, the majority of the population in India is benefiting from social security, and recently, a landmark report by the International Labour Organization was released. This report states that more than 64% of India's population is now receiving some form of social security benefit. This is one of the largest coverages in the world in terms of social security. Today, approximately 950 million people in the country are benefiting from some social

security schemes, whereas, until 2015, less than 250 million people were covered by government schemes.



here is an anecdote about a guest who arrived at the home of a tribal family in a remote village. The family consisted of a husband, wife, and a small child, who welcomed the guest with utmost simplicity, yet complete devotion. In the meal, the family served half a millet roti and a bowl full of milk to the guest, showing immense respect to him despite limited resources. As the guest started to eat, his gaze fell on a small child, who was staring at the bowl of milk. The guest realized that the milk was meant for the child, but had been given to him as a guest. The guest ate roti with water and did not touch the milk. As soon as the child saw that the milk was left untouched, he immediately picked up the bowl and consumed it. The guest's eyes welled up with tears, and he became witness to a silent, poignant, and very emotional moment. The guest deeply felt the unseen truth of the country—poverty, hunger, and deprivation. That moment was not just an experience, but the seed of a resolve to build an India where no child goes hungry, no mother is constrained by her child's hunger, and everyone can live their lives with dignity and respect was germinated here. That guest was none other than the country's present Prime Minister, Narendra Modi, who, in his early public life, would travel on foot and, motorcycle to explore remote, inaccessible, and tribal areas. These travels inspired his thoughts with empathy and dedication towards the inclusive development of tribal society.

A similar incident occurred in the year 1980. The city of Ahmedabad was witnessing a new dawn—the foundation stone of the Vanvasi Kalyan Ashram was being laid. This ashram, to be built, was being constructed not merely as a building of bricks and mortar, but as a sacred resolution to improve the plight of the tribal community. Funds were needed. To fulfill this sacred purpose, an event was organized, inviting the city's leading industrialists, businessmen, and social workers. At this gathering, a dynamic young man, Narendra Modi, took the stage. He was holding no public position or any political clout, but only self-confidence, a resolve to serve, and the fire of knowledge. For 90 minutes, he spoke about the suffering of tribal people, their culture, struggle, and apathy, as if he himself had



been born in those forests. But this empathy was not mere sentimentality, but compassion. Do you know the secret behind the depth and poignancy of this speech? To deliver a powerful message, he had studied over 50 religious texts on the life, problems, and history of tribal society in just 12 days. The impact of his speech brought tears to the eyes of the businessmen present. For the first time, they had experienced a disturbing truth so closely, and what followed was truly impressive. The dignitaries handed Narendra Modi blank cheques and



told him to fill them with the amount he found suitable, and to spend on tasks as he deemed fit. That day, not only were donations collected, but also the foundation for a movement was laid.

Such moving stories on the social media platform X @modiarchive would be appropriate to tell on this Janjatiya Gaurav Divas, as they have left an indelible mark on Prime Minister Narendra Modi's mind and initiated a new initiative for tribal welfare. Indeed, to see the development of any nation, one must look to its far-

flung areas. From this perspective, today's India sees its future in the development of tribal areas. India's unique aura lies in the development of these regions, which are closest to nature. The Central Government has done unprecedented work over the past 11 years to realize those dreams.

Even decades after independence, most tribal communities faced a difficult life, lacking homes and basic amenities like electricity, water, and roads. The burden of medical treatment in case of illness further made

their lives difficult. The development path was also difficult for them. Tribal communities create exquisite products drawing on their centuries-old artistic heritage. However, certain laws restricted some of their ventures. Furthermore, a lack of information and facilities to market their products hindered their development. Thus, due to unmet needs for housing, transportation, medical care, education, and employment, they were left out of the mainstream of development. However, these facilities are now being made available to them, and their standard of living has improved. Additionally, opportunities for economic development are expanding for them. The current government has rapidly advanced the speed of tribal development and welfare. Numerous large-scale campaigns and programs are being implemented. Special measures have been taken to ensure that tribal communities receive all the benefits within all national development and welfare programs.

EMPOWERED TRIBES, EMPOWERING THE NATION

The vision of strengthening the nation through tribal participation is becoming a reality. According to the 2011 census, Scheduled Tribes (STs) constitute approximately 9 percent of India's total population, numbering approximately 11 Crores. There are over 730 tribes in the country notified as Scheduled Tribes, under Article 342 of the Constitution. In alignment with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision of "Sabka"



Legal Protection and Expanded Rights

"Only when tribal society progresses will our country truly progress."

With this vision, the Central Government is working to integrate tribal communities, who have faced apathy for a long time despite their rich heritage. From legal protection to expanded rights, the Central Government's commitment has given a new direction to the multifaceted development of tribal communities...

- More than 730 Scheduled Tribes are notified under Article 342 of the Constitution.
- 117 communities were included in the Scheduled Tribe list between 2014-2024, compared to only 12 in its preceding decade.
- The inclusion of more than 10 times the number of communities in the Scheduled Tribe list has opened the doors to welfare benefits for these marginalized communities. From reservations in education and employment to political representation and legal protection, this has increased.
- The Forest Rights Act (FRA) empowers tribal and forest-dwelling communities by legally recognizing individual and community rights over forest land and resources.



Villages in the country are located near forest areas. These are called forest fringe villages. According to the India State of Forest Report 2019, approximately 300 million people in the country depend on forests.

Saath, Sabka Vikas, Sabka Vishwas, Sabka Prayas," the current central government has consistently worked towards the equal development of all sections of society. The central government has given top priority to the development of tribal communities and the preservation of their heritage and culture. With greater commitment, it has empowered them to participate in

- The provisions of the Indian Forest Act, 1927, were amended to remove bamboo from the category of trees to encourage bamboo cultivation in non-forest areas. This is directly benefiting the tribal community.
- The main objective of paragraph 5.2 of Schedule V of the Constitution is to impose a complete ban on the transfer of immovable property in a Scheduled Area to any person other than a tribal person.

Social Empowerment of Tribal and Scheduled **Tribe Communities**

Government continues to focus on the socio-economic development of tribal communities, particularly the Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Group and is taking steps to empower these communities so that they can contribute to their own and national development.

- Under Article 275(1) of the Constitution, 100% grants are issued to states with Scheduled Tribe populations to bridge the gaps in infrastructure activities in the areas of education, health, skill development, livelihoods, drinking water, and sanitation, with the aim of improving the level of governance in Scheduled Areas and ensuring the welfare of tribal people.
- Under the Adivasi Mahila Sashaktikaran Yojana, concessional loans up to ₹2 lakh are provided to tribal women at just 4% interest. Under the Micro Credit Scheme, loans up to ₹5 lakh are provided to tribal selfhelp groups.
- Pradhan Mantri Vanbandhu Kalyan Umbrella Yojana: The Pradhan Mantri Vanbandhu Kalyan Yojana was formally launched on October 28, 2014, to enhance the socio-economic status of tribal and indigenous communities living in remote areas of the country.
- Now, this umbrella scheme encompasses six schemes for the development and welfare of tribal communities.

the nation's progress. Indeed, this community, dwelling in forests, deserts, and mountains, awakened the spirit of India's independence. They made India's prosperity their life mantra. The present leadership of the country has been working tirelessly over the past few years to ensure the development of tribal communities, which have remained excluded from development for a long

time since independence, and to safeguard their social, cultural, and political autonomy. The annual budget for tribal development has tripled. - The Central Government is implementing the Development Action Plan for Scheduled Tribes (DAPST) as a strategy for the development of Scheduled Tribe dominated areas.
- In addition to the Ministry of Tribal Affairs, 41 ministries and departments, including education, health, agriculture, irrigation, roads, housing, electrification, employment generation, and skill development, are mandated to allocate a specified percentage (from 4.3% to 17.5%) of their budgets for tribal development projects.
- Under DAPST, these 41 ministries and departments are implementing 204 schemes and programs in 2025-26.
- An amount of ₹1,27,434 crore was allocated in the current financial year. Of this, more than ₹52,000 crore has already been released for these schemes and programs.

budget for tribal children has been raised, leading to the progress of tribal children in both academics and sports. A new sense of confidence is now visible among every tribe, including the Bodo, Bru, and Karbi. Furthermore, the Padma Awards have moved beyond the metropolitan areas and reached the forests, deserts, and mountains, giving new recognition to the work of the tribal people.

When the government was formed under the lead-

ership of former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee, a serious effort was made to understand the hopes and aspirations of this community. In 1999, a separate ministry was created for the upliftment and prosperity of the tribal community, and the National Commission for Scheduled Tribes was established through the 89th Constitutional Amendment to ensure their interests. The upliftment and respect of tribal society have been further given a new thrust by Prime Minister Narendra

PM JUGA: A **Campaign to Transform Tribal Villages**

- On October 2, 2024, Prime Minister Narendra Modi launched the Pradhan Mantri Janjatiya Unnat Gram Abhiyan (PM JUGA) from Hazaribagh, Jharkhand. This campaign is popularly known as the Dharti Aaba Janjatiya Gram Utkarsh Abhiyan. Seventeen ministries and departments of the central government are jointly taking steps to implement 25 measures to uplift tribal villages by March 31, 2029.
- At an expenditure of over ₹79,156 crore, this program is facilitating social infrastructure, health, education, and livelihood development in approximately 63,843 tribal/indigenous villages.
- More than 5.38 crore tribal people are benefiting, with work being carried out under PM JUGA in 2,911 blocks across 549 districts in 30 states and union territories, in line with the 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.

PM JANMAN: A Changing Picture

For decades after independence, there were 75 tribes that were extremely backward, even among tribals. It was for these Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Groups (PVTGs) that PM Modi launched the Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan (PM JANMAN) from Khunti on November 15, 2023, on the occasion of Janjatiya Gaurav Divas.

- PM JANMAN aims to transform the socioeconomic landscape of the people through 11 measures implemented jointly by 9 ministries over three years. With a total provision of ₹24,104 crore, each ministry was assigned the responsibility to implement the prescribed measures.
- These PVTG communities are significantly backward in social, economic, and educational spheres. Their population is approximately 2.8 million, living in approximately 22,000 settlements.

Tribals' Health Government's Priority

Ayushman Bharat has eased the healthcare concerns of tribal communities by ensuring access to quality treatment, while concerted efforts are underway in mission mode to eliminate diseases such as sickle cell anemia.

- As part of its commitment to address health disparities among tribal populations, the Government of India launched the Sickle Cell Anemia Elimination Mission in 2023.
- On July 1, 2023, PM Modi launched the mission from Shahdol, Madhya Pradesh, with the goal of eliminating sickle cell anemia by 2047.

The Central Government has taken several effective steps in recent years to integrate tribal populations into mainstream education. These initiatives have not only ensured children attend school but have also brought about positive changes in the quality of education...



Eklavya Model Residential Schools (EMRS)

Eklavya Model Residential Schools were launched in 2018-19 to provide tribal children with quality education comparable to Navodaya Vidyalayas in their own environment.

- The sanctioned number of Eklavya Model Residential Schools in the country is 722. However, the government plans to increase this number to 740 by 2026. By July 2025, teaching had started in 485 schools across the country. This will benefit approximately 3.5 lakh Scheduled Tribe students across the country.
- The National Tribal Students Education Society (NESTS), in partnership with the United Nations Children's Fund (UNICEF) India, has launched the national program TALASH (Tribal Aptitude Life Skills And Self-Esteem Hub). It aims to improve the education and personality development of tribal students across the country.

tribal communities are achieving economic self-reliance by benefiting from central government schemes. Their development opportunities are expanding. Efforts are being made to ensure that the benefits of major national schemes reach all tribal beneficiaries in a timebound manner. The PM-Janman Abhiyan, launched by the Prime Minister on 'Janjatiya Gaurav Divas' in 2023, aims to achieve comprehensive development for the people of PVTG communities in the country. This campaign aims to provide numerous benefits to the people of this community before the three-year deadline, at a cost of over 24,000 crore rupees. ment launched the 'Dharti Aaba Janjatiya Gram Utkarsh Abhiyan' from the land of Bhagvan Birsa Munda. This campaign, costing approximately ₹80,000 crore, aims to ensure that every tribal person benefits from government schemes. Every tribal village will be connected through roads and mobile connectivity, ensuring that all tribal families have their own permanent homes.

This campaign of development and welfare will benefit approximately 63,000 tribal villages. This nationwide campaign is benefiting more than 5 crore tribal people.

A new awareness of tribal pride and the ideals of the Constitution is being cultivated in the country. This spirit is becoming the foundation for a bright future for the entire country, including the tribal community. On the occasion of 'Janjatiya Gaurav Divas' in 2023, Prime Minister Modi visited Ulihatu and sought the blessings of Bhagvan Birsa Munda, his birthplace. This was the first visit by a Prime Minister to Ulihatu. On the same day, the 'Pradhan Mantri Janjati Adivasi Nyaya Maha Abhiyan' (PM Janman) was launched from Jharkhand.

Today, more than 700 Eklavya Model Schools are being built across the country to provide quality education to tribal children. Approximately 3 million tribal students are receiving scholarships. They are also assisted in getting opportunities to study abroad. As a result, young people from tribal communities are increasingly joining the administrative services, medical, engineering, and other fields. As part of the goal of building a Viksit Bharat by 2047, the elimination of sickle cell anemia from tribal communities has also been set. The budget for the Development Action Plan for Scheduled Tribes (DAPST) has been increased several times over the past decade. The Ministry of Tribal Affairs' budget for 2024-25 is ₹13,000 crore, a 74 percent increase from the previous year. The rapid progress of tribal communities is a national priority today. The idea is to preserve the centuries-old identity of tribal communities while simultaneously pursuing modern development.

In the past few years, many new traditions have emerged in India, and as a result of these emerging traditions, the talents of tribal communities are receiving greater recognition. Over 100 people from tribal communities have been honored with the Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan, and Padma Shri awards over the past 11 years. Governors and Chief Ministers of several states, ministers in the central and state governments, and numerous individuals holding high positions come from tribal communities. Today, the tribal community and tribal youth have several development opportunities. No matter how high they wish to soar, society and the government are always supporting them.

PRESIDENT MURMU REFLECTS THE ASPIRATIONS OF NEW INDIA

The life of Droupadi Murmu, the first tribal President from Odisha, is a reflection of New India. From a remote forest region to Raisina Hill, President Murmu has also become a symbol of the New India hope that the people of the country are united to realize the vision of Amrit Kaal. Respect for the 'Annadata' in Tribal Areas

After 2014, the central government launched several development schemes focused on the nation's 'Annadata'. Along with changes to traditional farming practices in tribal areas, measures such as expanding the Minimum Support Price (MSP) and strengthening infrastructure have transformed agriculture...

- More than 1 crore tribal farmers have received assistance under the PM Kisan Samman Nidhi so far.
- For the first time, the Minimum Support Price (MSP) for Minor Forest Produce (MFP) was expanded to include 77 new minor forest produce. Previously, the number of products included was 12; now it is 87.
- Better price realization and income security were ensured for tribal gatherers.
- To strengthen infrastructure and market linkages, 1,316 haat markets, 603 storage units, and 22 processing units were approved. Direct market access for tribal products and artisans was facilitated.
- The National Mission on Natural Farming (NMNF), launched in 2015-16 to promote organic farming, included the Large Area Certification (LAC) program to certify traditionally organic areas, including tribal areas, islands, and hilly areas.
- The National Livestock Mission has provided support to 8,500 individual and group beneficiaries to enhance sustainable livelihoods by promoting animal husbandry in tribal areas.



From Entrepreneurship to Self-Reliance

The Central Government is committed to promoting entrepreneurship and livelihood creation among tribal communities. This is why several significant changes have been made in this sector, empowering tribals and laying a strong foundation for transformative reforms.

- TRIFED has approved 4,661 Van Dhan Vikas Kendras (VDVKs) under the Pradhan Mantri Janjatiya Vikas Mission (PMJVM), connecting over 1.2 million beneficiaries. With this, tribal products are now available on global and national e-commerce platforms.
- More than 2.2 lakh artisan families and over 1 lakh products are registered under TRIFED. TRIFED has organized 79 artisan fairs and 50 exhibitions.
- Each Van Dhan Vikas Kendra cluster, comprises 15 tribal self-help groups with 300 beneficiaries. This initiative provides Rs 15 lakh per cluster.



GI-tagged tribal products are now gaining remarkable global recognition.



- Araku Coffee opened its first organic coffee shop in Paris in 2017. Mahua flowers from Chhattisgarh were exported to France for the first time.
- More than 300 tribal heritage conservation centers are being built across the country to promote and document tribal culture, language, and traditions.
- The Dharti Aaba Tribepreneurs program was organized in April 2025, bringing together 45 tribal startups to showcase innovations and network with investors and startup leaders.
- Two startups received national recognition. Our Guest Travels from Sikkim won the Direct-to-Consumer Award as Northeast India's first online travel aggregator. Naguri Organic received the Agritech Award for sustainable agriculture.
- A ₹50 crore venture capital fund was established for Scheduled Tribes. Partnerships were established with leading institutions such as IIMs, IITs, IFCI, and META.

Cultural and Historical Reforms...

- To ensure that the sacrifices of unsung heroes are never forgotten, the Government of India, during the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav in 2021, celebrating 75 years of the country's independence, declared Bhagvan Birsa Munda's birth anniversary, November 15, as Janjatiya Gaurav Divas. This was the central government's most significant and biggest step towards cultural reform.
- Janjatiya Gaurav Divas in 2024 was the 150th birth anniversary of Lord Birsa Munda. It saw nationwide participation and policy-driven action aimed at preserving tribal heritage.
- Tribal Freedom Fighter Museums were approved to bring to light the forgotten stories of brave warriors from tribal communities. Under this initiative, construction of 11 museums was initiated in 10 states. Construction of three of these has been completed.
- Habibganj Railway Station in Bhopal, Madhya Pradesh, was named after Rani Kamalapati, and Kaimai Railway Station in Manipur was named after Rani Gaidinliu. On the occasion of Birsa Munda's 150th birth anniversary, it was decided to rename Sarai Kale Khan Chowk as 'Bhagvan Birsa Munda Chowk'.
- PM Modi declared Mangarh Dham a monument of national importance. For decades, this site remained unknown to most Indians.

VOCAL FOR LOCAL TRIBAL UPLIFTMENT

"Vocal for Local" is transforming tribal craftsmanship into a source of income. Decades-old laws that prevented tribal people from harvesting forest produce like bamboo have been amended to grant them rights over forest produce. Today, the central government is making

several new efforts to promote forest produce. Previously, only 12 forest produce were procured at MSP, but today, nearly 90 products have been included in this list. The country has also initiated efforts to connect forest wealth with modern opportunities through the Van Dhan Yojana. Over 3,000 Van Dhan Vikas Kendras (Van Dhan Development Centers) and over 50,000 Van Dhan Self-Help Groups (VANs) are currently operating across the country. A Tribal Research Institute has also been



Gifts showcasing **Tribal Heritage** given to Global Leaders

- PM Modi has taken Indian tribal culture to the forefront of the global stage by presenting tribal artifacts to leaders of several countries.
- Dokra art is known for its intricate metalwork and deep historical roots. Dokra artifacts were gifted to the leaders of Australia, Brazil, the Cook Islands, and Tonga.
- Sohrai paintings from Jharkhand were gifted to Russian President Vladimir Putin, and Gond paintings from Madhya Pradesh were gifted to Brazilian President Luiz Inácio Lula da Silva.
- Leaders from Uzbekistan and Comoros were honored with Warli paintings from Maharashtra.



Cultural Preservation and Promotion

- The Central Government supports 29 tribal research institutes for the preservation of tribal cultural heritage, languages, and traditional knowledge. Rs. 265.94 crore has been allocated for this purpose during 2020-25.
- Additionally, buildings for 10 new tribal research institutes have been approved since 2014.
- Tribal Research Institutes research and document tribal languages, traditional practices, and folk arts, developing educational materials for tribal students.
- The new National Education Policy mandates that schools provide education in the mother tongue/ local language until at least Grade 5 (and beyond where possible).
- The Adi Vaani app, India's first artificial intelligence-based translator, was launched. This platform was developed to bridge the linguistic gap and revitalize communication in tribal dialects.

Padma Awards for Tribal Heroes

- After 2014, the Central Government completely overhauled the nomination process for the Padma Awards, making them an award for the common man for the first time.
- As a result, silent guardians of culture like Bhil painters, Gond woodworkers, Baiga craftsmen, and protectors of tribal traditions dedicated to protecting the environment have now become an integral part of the national consciousness.
- More than 100 people from tribal communities have been honored with the Padma Vibhushan, Padma Bhushan, and Padma Shri awards so far.

Steps Toward Tribal Empowerment

- Aadi Mahotsav was launched in 2017 as the National Tribal Festival to promote economic self-reliance, cultural preservation, and social empowerment for India's tribal communities.
- It is organized by the Ministry of Tribal Affairs and TRIFED in several cities across the country, including Delhi. The festival provides a platform for India's rich tribal art, culture, handicrafts, cuisine, and folk art to connect with the mainstream.
- 38 Aadi Mahotsavs have been organised in major cities of the country.

established in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh. The national campaign for the development of aspirational districts and aspirational blocks is also greatly benefiting tribal areas. The emphasis on education in the mother tongue in the National Education Policy will also greatly assist tribal children in their education.

Numerous efforts have been made during the Amrit Mahotsav to bring the invaluable contribution of tribal communities to the freedom struggle to the forefront.

For the first time since independence, tribal museums are being built across the country to showcase tribal pride and heritage. The "Alluri Sitarama Raju Memorial Tribal Freedom Fighter Museum" is also being built in Lambasingi, Andhra Pradesh. Foreign governments inflicted the most atrocities on tribal people, attempting to destroy their culture. However, the memory of those sacrifices will continue to inspire future generations. Numerous efforts are being made at the central government level to ensure that forest resources become a source of employment and opportunities for tribal youth.

NEW RECOGNITION FOR TRIBES, CARRIERS OF TRADITION

For the past few years, tribal communities and those associated with tribal life have been well represented among those honored with the Padma Awards. Tribal life is unique, different from the hustle and bustle of cities. Despite this, tribal communities are always committed to preserving their traditions. Efforts are also made to preserve and research aspects related to tribal communities. Many great personalities who have worked on tribal languages like Toto, Ho, Kui, Kuvi, and Manda have received Padma Awards. Dhani Ram Toto, Janum Singh Soy, and B. Ramakrishna Reddy...the whole country has become familiar with them now. People working with tribals like Siddhi, Jarawa, and Onge have also been honoured. Such as...Hirabai Lobi, Ratan Chandra Kar, and Ishwar Chandra Verma. Tribal communities have been an integral part of India's land and heritage. Their contribution to the development of the country and society is significant. Honoring individuals who work for them also inspires the new generation. Furthermore, the Padma Awards are resonating even in areas once affected by Naxalism. The central government has now set March 31, 2026, as the date for a Naxal-free India. Those who have shown right path to misguided youth in Naxal-affected areas through their efforts have also been honored with Padma Awards. Ajay Kumar Mandavi, a wood carver in Kanker, and Parshuram Komaji Khune, associated with the famous Jhadipatti Theatre in Gadchiroli, have also received this honor. Similarly, Ramkuiwangbe Nyume, Bikram Bahadur Jamatia, and Karma Wangchu, who are engaged in preserving their culture in the Northeast, have also been honored.

- The 2024 Janjatiya Gaurav Divas saw massive virtual participation of over 1 crore people.

sense of belonging and harmony among tribal people is the foundation of our culture and civilization." During Atal Bihari Vajpayee's government, the tribal language Santhali was included in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution.

Furthermore, Prime Minister Narendra Modi dedicated the Bhagwan Birsa Munda Memorial Udyan cum Freedom Fighter Museum in Jharkhand to the nation. A nationwide budget of ₹200 crore has been approved for the establishment of tribal freedom fighter museums in Gujarat, Jharkhand, Andhra Pradesh, Chhattisgarh, Kerala, Madhya Pradesh, Telangana, Manipur, Mizoram, and Goa. The National Tribal Museum is being established in Garudeshwar in Gujarat's Narmada district, approximately 6 km from the Statue of Unity. Mangarh Dham, a major tribal pilgrimage site in Rajasthan's Banswara district, was granted national monument status. Development in the Northeast, which has a predominantly tribal population, has been emphasized over the past 11 years under the Act East Policy. By making 10% of the budget allocated to the Northeast in all ministries' schemes mandatory, Ashtalakshmi has been integrated into national progress. Efforts are being made to integrate the tribal community, which has made unforgettable contributions and sacrifices in the freedom movement, into the mainstream of development, provide socio-economic upliftment, and political representation.

FAST IMPROVEMENT IN SOCIAL STATUS

The results of tribal development are also visible on the ground. The literacy rate for Scheduled Tribes (STs) has increased from 59% in the 2011 Census to 73.40% according to the Periodic Labour Force Survey (July 2023-June 2024). A total of 4,550 Van Dhan Vikas Kendras have been approved so far under the Pradhan Mantri Janjatiya Vikas Mission and Pradhan Mantri Janjatiya Nyaya Maha Abhiyan (PM-JANMAN) schemes. Since its inception, the Van Dhan Yojana has significantly improved the livelihoods of tribal communities across India. This initiative has benefited over 11.83 lakh tribal individuals and increased their incomes. The scheme has provided economic opportunities and empowered forest-dependent communities to become self-reliant. From fiscal year 2022-23 to June 2025, 65,949 women members of self-help groups have been identified and trained. The Aadi Mahotsav is being organized for tribal empowerment, bringing together the exquisite craft traditions of tribal artisans, weavers, potters, puppeteers, and embroiderers. Under the Institutional Support Program for the Development and Marketing of Tribal Products, TRIFED promotes the sale of tribal products through e-commerce on its portal www.tribesindia. com. This program ensures the benefits of the Central Government's social welfare schemes.

Steps are being taken continuously for the upliftment of tribal communities. The Central Government has approved the establishment of 728 new Eklavya Model Residential Schools. In 2013-14, only 167 schools were approved. The Central Government now aims to establish 740 Eklavya Model Schools by 2026, and work is going on. Statistics show that in 2013-14, there were 119 schools offering education, but now the number has increased to over 401. The establishment of the Sammakka Sarakka Central Tribal University in Telangana was approved by the Cabinet in October 2023. Since 2014, 10 tribal research institutes have been approved across the country. Under the Top Class Education Scheme, scholarships are provided annually to students for admission to top institutions such as IITs, IIMs, and AIIMS. Tribal communities primarily reside in mining-affected areas, but they have never received a share of mining revenues. The establishment of the District Mineral Foundation Fund addressed this discrepancy, collecting thousands of crores of rupees and using them for the development of tribal areas.

TRIBAL ART TREASURES SHOWCASED AT G-20

The rich tribal heritage, craftsmanship, and exquisite products attracted global attention at the G-20 Summit, presided by India. Padma Shri awardee Pareshbhai Jayantibhai Rathwa gave a live demonstration of Pithora art, a craft promoted by the Rathwa, Bhilala, Naik, and Bhil tribes of Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh. Longpi pottery, the Sulur bamboo wind flute made by the Gond tribe of Bastar in Chhattisgarh, Gond paintings, hangings made by the Bhil and Patelia tribes of Gujarat, and the metal Ambabari of the Meena tribe showcased the rich cultural diversity and heritage of the tribes to the world. Handicrafts share in the country's exports is growing. Handicraft exports are growing at a rate of approximately 30%, with tribal handicrafts, or TRIFED products, contributing a significant share.

Certainly, the Central Government has taken the initiative to touch the hearts of the tribal areas and people, so that they too can be made the drivers of Aatma Nirbhar Bharat because social justice means that every section of the society should get equal opportunities and no one should be deprived of the basic necessities of life.

Inauguration of Phase 2B of Mumbai Metro Line 3, extending from Acharya Atre Chowk to Cuffe Parade. It was constructed at a cost of approximately ₹12,200 crore.

• The final Phase 2B of the project will provide seamless transportation connectivity to South Mumbai's heritage and cultural districts, such as Fort, Kala Ghoda, and Marine Drive, and provide direct access to key administrative and financial centres, including the Bombay High Court, Mantralaya, Reserve Bank of India, Bombay Stock Exchange, and Nariman Point.

The entire Mumbai Metro Line 3 (Aqua Line), costing over ₹37,270 crore, was also dedicated to the nation. It is Mumbai's first fully underground metro line.

- Mumbai Metro Line 3, with a length of 33.5 kilometres and 27 stations from Cuffe Parade to Aarey JVLR, will serve 1.3 million passengers daily.
- Metro Line 3 has been designed to integrate with railways, airports, other metro lines, and monorail services, improving last-mile connectivity and reducing congestion.



Rabi Crop MSP Increased by 600 Rupees 57 New Kendriya Vidyalayas to Open

Building a Viksit Bharat is only possible when farmers are empowered and prosperous. With this vision, the Central Government, under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has given top priority to the welfare of farmers. Furthering this initiative, the Union Cabinet decided to increase the MSP for Rabi crops and approved the 'Pulses Self-Reliance Mission' to promote pulse production. It also approved several other important proposals, including the establishment of 57 new Kendriya Vidyalayas across the country.

DECISION: Approval of Minimum Support Price (MSP) for Rabi crops for the 2026-27 marketing season.

IMPACT: The MSP has been increased by ₹600 per quintal for safflower and ₹300 per quintal for lentils. The prices of rapeseed and mustard, gram, barley, and wheat have been increased by ₹250 per quintal, ₹225 per quintal, ₹170 per quintal, and ₹160 per quintal, respectively. This increase in the MSP for Rabi crops will ensure remunerative prices for farmers and encourage crop diversification.

DECISION: The 'Pulses Self-Reliance Mission' will increase pulse production.

IMPACT: This mission will be implemented over a period of six years, from 2025-26 to 2030-31, with a financial outlay of ₹11,440 crore. The mission aims to expand the pulses acreage to 31 million hectares by 2030-31. This mission will also generate employment. The mission aims to achieve self-sufficiency in pulses, reduce dependence on imports, boost farmers' income, and conserve foreign exchange. A key feature of the mission is ensuring maximum procurement of pigeon peas, black grams, and red lentils under the price support scheme of PM-AASHA.



IMPACT: The total estimated funding requirement for establishing these schools is approximately ₹5,862.55 crore for a period of nine years, starting from 2026-27. To date, 1,285 Kendriya Vidyalayas have been established in India. Additionally, three Kendriya Vidyalayas are currently established in Moscow, Kathmandu, and Tehran. The total student enrolment is approximately 1.362 million as of June 30, 2025. The approval of these new Kendriya Vidyalayas will create a total of 4,617 direct permanent employment opportunities.

DECISION: 3% increase in Dearness Allowance for central government employees.

IMPACT: The increase in Dearness Allowance will benefit approximately 49.19 lakh central government employees and 68.72 lakh pensioners. This is an additional 3% increase over the existing rate of 55% of basic pay/pension. The combined impact of the increase in Dearness Allowance and Dearness Relief will be ₹10,083.96 crore per year to the exchequer. It will be effective from July 1, 2025.

DECISION: Approval for 4-laning and widening of the existing Kaliabor-Numaligarh section of NH-715 in Assam.

IMPACT: The project will be implemented on Engineering, Procurement and Construction (EPC) mode, with a total length of approximately 86 km and a cost of ₹6,957 crore. This includes implementation of the proposed wildlife-friendly measures proposed on Kaziranga National Park Stretch. This will boost tourism in Kaziranga National Park and open new avenues for business and industrial development. It will also create direct and indirect employment opportunities.

DECISION: Approval of the third phase of the Biomedical Research Career Program.

IMPACT: This programme will encourage top-tier scientific talent to pursue cutting-edge biomedical research. It will promote research across multiple disciplines to translate innovation into practical solutions (translational innovation). It will also strengthen systems supporting high-quality research to develop world-class biomedical research capacity with global impact. It will also reduce regional disparities in scientific capacity.

DECISION: Approval of proposals for four multi-tracking projects in 18 districts of Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh, Gujarat, and Chhattisgarh. This will expand the existing network of Indian Railways by approximately 894 KM

IMPACT: The approved multi-tracking project will enhance connectivity to 3,633 villages with a population of approximately 85.84 lakh and two aspirational districts of Vidisha and Rajnandgaon in Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh. The projects, with a total estimated cost of ₹24,634 crore, will be completed by 2030-31. It will enhance mobility, reduce congestion, and improve operational efficiency and service reliability. These projects will foster development by empowering individuals with self-reliance, increasing employment and self-employment opportunities.

This path to progress was further strengthened on November 2, 2018, when Prime Minister Narendra Modi unveiled 12 key announcements at once, giving a new dimension to the dreams of MSMEs...



he true strength of India's economy lies in the millions of people living in villages, towns, and small cities who, despite limited resources, are setting examples of employment, production, and innovation through their skills. The organised form of these efforts is Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs). Therefore, over the past 11 years, with the motto of "Minimum Government, Maximum Governance", the central government has taken numerous steps that have not only facilitated easy access to credit and markets but also freed MSMEs from the entanglement of regulations, including the expansion of technology and ease of doing business. In 2018, while making 12 announcements for MSMEs, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said, "When barriers are broken, files gain momentum; officers themselves take up files and take the lead in ensuring decisions."

Today, the record number of 6.63 crore registered MSMEs (by July 2025) and the employment of nearly 29 crore people in the last five years alone are sufficient to illustrate the impact the central government's initiatives have had on this sector over these seven years.

Just months after the India-UK Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA), this visit by the British Prime Minister, accompanied by the largest-ever business delegation, symbolises the new energy and broad vision of the India-UK partnership...

ndia-UK bilateral annual trade stands at \$56 billion, with the target to double it by 2030. The Comprehensive Economic and Trade Agreement (CETA) will play a key role in achieving this goal, opening up new avenues for trade and investment in the future. However, PM Modi has expressed confidence that this target can already be achieved. This is why this visit by the British Prime Minister is considered significant. During the meeting between Sir Keir Starmer and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the two countries agreed to strengthen trade and economic ties. In a joint statement, India and the UK jointly decided to establish an Artificial Intelligence (AI) Centre, a Connectivity Innovation Centre, and a Critical Minerals Industry Guild. In addition, joint investments in renewable energy, health research, and a climate technology startup fund were announced. These agreements are expected to accelerate bilateral trade between the two countries, expand nine UK university campuses in India, and promote equitable economic development through the use of modern technology. During the visit, British Prime Minister Sir Keir Starmer delivered the keynote address at the Global FinTech Fest in Mumbai on October 9th. The two leaders also held restricted and delegation-level talks in Mumbai.

griculture and farming have always been a key part of India's development journey. Agriculture must continue to receive government support as times change. To this end, the current Central Government is striving to increase farmers' income and make them self-reliant. In fact, since 2014, in alignment with Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision, the Central Government has implemented numerous reforms in the interest of farmers, from seeds to the market.

Speaking on the development journey of the country's 'Annadata' during a program held at the Indian Agricultural Research Institute in Delhi, Prime Minister Narendra Modi also highlighted the new beginnings



Focus on the most backward districts in agriculture with the **Dhan Dhaanya Yojana**

- The main objective of the PM Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana is to provide irrigation facilities to every farm in the country, increase crop productivity, provide easy credit and storage facilities to farmers, and encourage the adoption of new agricultural technologies.
- Under the scheme, costing ₹24,000 crore over 6 years, special attention will be given to agricultural infrastructure development, water management, and crop diversification in selected districts. Launched on the lines of the Aspirational Districts Campaign, this scheme will benefit approximately 17 million farmers.
- The government has selected 100 backward districts where 36 schemes from 11 departments will work simultaneously.

and results achieved through these reforms. He said that in the last 11 years, India's agricultural exports have nearly doubled, grain production has increased by approximately 90 million metric tons, and fruit and vegetable production has increased by more than 64 million metric tons. Today, India ranks number one in the world in milk production and number two in fish production. Furthermore, honey and egg production have doubled compared to 2014. During this period, six major fertilizer factories were commissioned in the country. More than 250 million farmers have received soil health cards, micro-irrigation has reached 10 million hectares, and farmers have received approximately 2 lakh crore rupees in claims under the PM Fasal Bima Yojana. More than 10,000 Farmer-Producer Organizations (FPOs) have been formed. So far, more than 3.75 lakh crore rupees have been transferred to farmers' bank accounts under the PM Kisan Samman Nidhi.

Launching the Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that the nation no longer becomes complacent, satisfied with just a few achievements. 100 districts were declared backward and abandoned. Of these, 20 percent of settlements had not seen a road since independence. 17 percent of children here were not immunized. 15% of schools lacked electricity. However, the current central government designated these districts as aspirational districts instead of backward and focused on them. Given priority, these districts have now achieved better results than other districts on several parameters. The PM Dhan Dhaanya Krishi Yojana is based on this model. The 100 districts for this scheme were selected based on three parameters: first, the yield from the farm; second, the number of times a field is cultivated; and third, do farmers have access to loans or investment. And if so, how much?

Launching the Pulses Self-Reliance Mission, Prime Minister Narendra Modi stated that this is not just a mission to increase pulse production, but also a mission to empower our future generations. He noted that pulses are an important source of protein for nutrition. However, India faces a significant challenge: despite being an agricultural nation, it still imports large quantities of pulses. This mission is a beginning towards achieving self-reliance in this area. Its goal is to increase pulse cultivation by 3.5 million hectares.

During the program, Prime Minister Modi interacted with pulse farmers who have benefited from various government schemes aimed at establishing a value-chain-based approach in agriculture, animal husbandry, and fisheries. These farmers have also received support through membership in Farmer-Producer Organizations (FPOs) and the Agricultural Infrastructure Fund.

More than 2 crore farmers benefit from the Pulses Self-Reliance Mission

- This mission, is a major step towards achieving nutritional security and self-sufficiency. It aims to improve pulse productivity levels, expand pulse cultivation area, strengthen the value chain procurement, storage, processing, and reduce losses.
- The Mission for Self-Reliance in Pulses Production was announced in the Union Budget 2025-26 and approved by the Union Cabinet on October 1, 2025. It will be implemented from 2025-26 to 2030-31 with a total outlay of ₹11,440 crore.
- The mission aims to increase pulse production to 35 million tonnes and pulse area to 31 million hectares by 2030-31. Particular focus is on tur (pigeon pea), urad (black gram), and masoor (red lentil). These will be procured 100% from farmers at MSP.
- Under the mission, 1,000 units will be established to reduce post-harvest losses. A subsidy of up to ₹25 lakh will be provided for setting up processing and packaging units.
- 8.8 million free seed kits will be distributed to facilitate farmers' access to new varieties of seeds. Not only this, by the year 2030-31, 126 lakh quintals of certified seeds will be given to pulse-producing farmers. Around 2 crore farmers will benefit from this mission.
- Self-reliance in pulse production... India has increased the production of pulses by about 31 percent in the last 11 years. Even after this, to meet its needs, India imported 47.38 lakh tonnes of pulses in the year 2023-24, whereas in comparison, exports were only 5.94 lakh tonnes. Pulse Self-Reliance Mission was started in the direction of increasing exports along with self-reliance.

Projects worth over ₹6,000 crore either inaugurated or the foundation stone laid

- The Prime Minister inaugurated projects worth over ₹5,450 crore in the agriculture, animal husbandry, fisheries, and food processing sectors, while also laying the foundation stone for additional projects worth approximately ₹815 crore.

- The projects whose foundation stone was laid included an Integrated Cold Chain and Value Addition Infrastructure in Krishna, Andhra Pradesh, and a stateof-the-art Integrated Aqua Park in Hirakud, Odisha.


