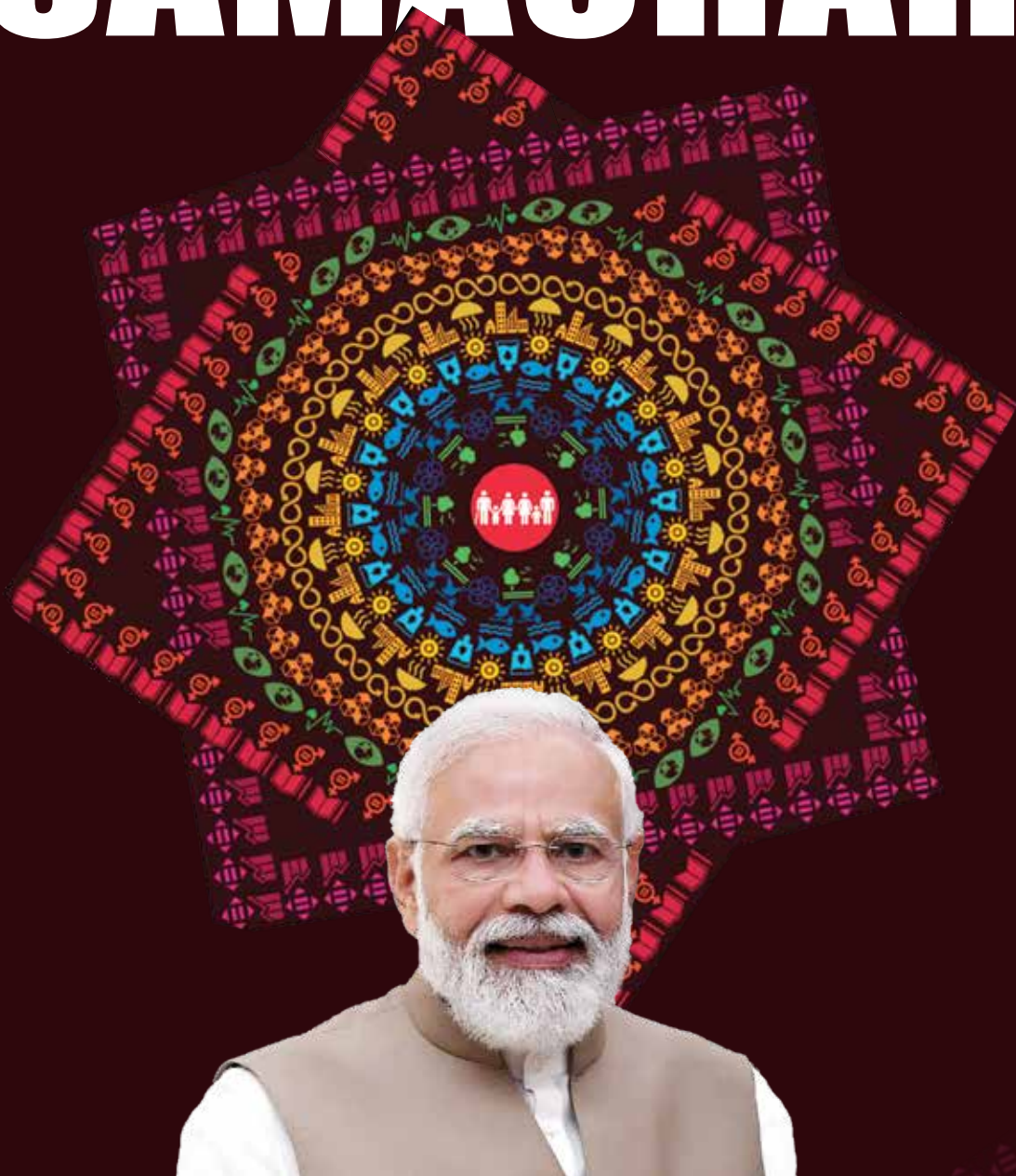

- **NEW REVOLUTION:** Be it the Space Sector or AI, the ever-increasing participation of our youth is begetting a new revolution. The people of India are second to none in adopting and trying new technologies.
- **NARI SHAKTI:** In the past 10 years, about 460 satellites have been launched and this includes many satellites of other countries as well. One of the important things in recent years is that the participation of women in our team of space scientists is constantly increasing.
- **ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE:** India is rapidly carving out a robust identity in the field of AI, i.e. artificial intelligence. Recently, I went to Paris to participate in a big AI conference. There, the world praised India's progress in this sector. We

are also getting to see examples of how people of our country are using AI today.

- **GLOBAL SPORTING POWERHOUSE:** More than 11,000 athletes from across the country performed brilliantly in the National Games held in Uttarakhand. It also showed that those who never accept defeat definitely win. No one becomes a champion amid comfort. I am happy that with the determination and discipline of our young athletes, India is rapidly progressing towards becoming a global sporting powerhouse.
- **VIBRANT ECOSYSTEM:** We have a very vibrant ecosystem of flora and fauna and these wildlife are deeply embedded in our history and culture. Many animals are also observed as the vehicles of our Gods and Goddesses.
- **TRADITION OF WORSHIP:** Many tribes in central India worship Bagheshwar. There is a tradition of worshipping Waghoba in Maharashtra. Lord Ayyappa also has a very deep connection with the tiger. Bonbibbi, whose Vaahan is the tiger, is worshipped in Sundarbans.
- **WILDLIFE CONSERVATION:** I would like to thank my tribal brothers and sisters because they actively participate in wildlife conservation activities. The population of tigers has risen continuously in Karnataka's BRT Tiger Reserve. A lot of credit for this goes to the Soliga tribe, who worship the tiger.



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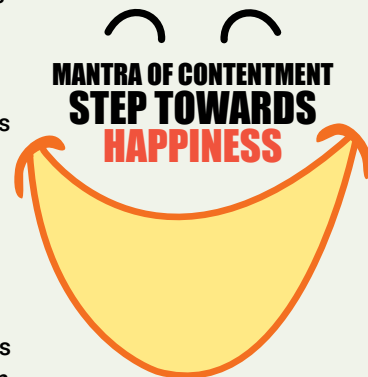

BORDER SECURITY WILL BE STRENGTHENED



The central government has approved the proposal to purchase ammunition for the Pinaka rocket system at a cost of Rs 10,200 crore. Through the indigenous rocket system, a large amount of ammunition can be fired on the target with precision. This system will not only prevent enemies from advancing, but high strategic areas can also be targeted if needed. This decision taken by the government will strengthen India's border security along with strengthening the country's military strength. Apart from this, a contract has also been signed with Bharat Electronics Limited (BEL) for upgrading the Shakti software.

GROWING INFLUENCE OF INDIA'S PHARMA SECTOR

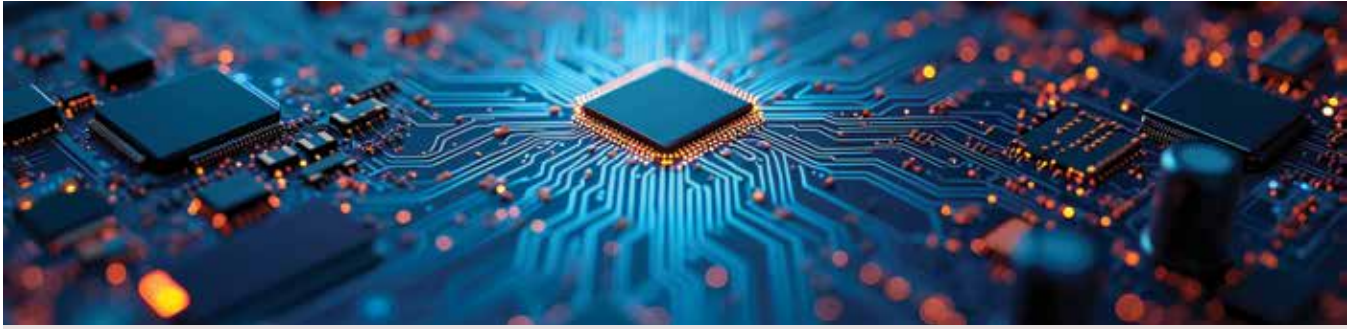
Due to the policies of the Government of India and the Production Linked Incentive (PLI), the pharma sector of the country has been progressing at a very fast pace in the last few years. India is not only becoming self-reliant in the pharma sector but is also meeting the needs of many countries of the world. According to the report of Bain & Company, India's pharmaceutical sector can achieve a 5% share in the global market by the year 2030. At the same time, according to a report, India's pharma market will reach 130 billion dollars by 2030 with a 2.4-fold increase in the next five years. Let us tell you that India is the largest producer of generic medicines globally, while India fulfills 60% of the global vaccine production.

THE INTEREST RATE ON EPF DEPOSITS WILL REMAIN AT 8.25%

The Employees' Provident Fund (EPF) will continue to offer an interest rate of 8.25% for the financial year 2024-25, just like in the previous year. This decision was made by the Central Trustee Board of EPFO in the presence of the Minister of Labour and Employment and Youth Affairs and Sports, Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya. The interest will be credited to EPF accounts once the Central Government officially notifies the rate. Additionally, the Trustee Board has introduced some changes to the insurance scheme for EPF members, aimed at providing more financial support to employees' families. In the event of the member's death, a life insurance benefit of Rs. 50,000 will be provided, even if the member has not completed one year of continuous service. This benefit will now be available if the death occurs within six months of the last contribution. Furthermore, a gap of up to two months between jobs will be considered as continuous service for this insurance benefit. These amendments are expected to benefit around 20,000 members.



INDIA'S FIRST INDIGENOUS SEMICONDUCTOR CHIP

The Government of India has been focusing on semiconductors recently, with large-scale efforts underway to develop the country's infrastructure. Currently, work is going on simultaneously on five semiconductor manufacturing units in the country. Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnav said at the Global Investors Summit held in Bhopal that the first Made in India semiconductor chip will be ready by the year 2025. The government has launched a program to train 85,000 engineers in advanced semiconductor and electronics manufacturing. India is currently exporting electronics worth Rs 5 lakh crore. This includes mobiles (Rs 4 lakh crore), laptops, servers, telecom equipment (Rs 75,000 crore) and electronics products related to defence and medical sectors.

VILLAGES WILL HAVE ACCESS TO 24-HOUR ELECTRICITY

The central government's objective is to ensure 24-hour electricity supply for everyone, and significant progress is being made towards this goal. Over the past decade, there has been remarkable growth in power generation, distribution, and a reduction in power wastage. In rural areas, where the average daily electricity supply was just 12.5 hours in 2014, it has now increased to 22.6 hours. Similarly, urban areas now receive an average of 23.4 hours of electricity daily. Additionally, by 2025, there has been an 8% reduction in power supply line losses compared to 2014. With the aim of providing round-the-clock power to all villages, the government has also planned to establish one lakh electric vehicle charging stations across the country by 2030.

INDIA BECOMING A SUPERPOWER IN AGRICULTURE

In the past decade, the central government's robust policies in the agriculture sector have led to record food grain production and a rise in farmers' incomes. So far, Rs 1.72 lakh crore has been allocated to farmers under the world's largest Fasal Bima Yojana, while Rs 3.70 lakh crore has been transferred to their accounts under the PM Kisan Samman Nidhi. To ensure the safety of farmers' produce, a storage facility with a capacity of 9,750 metric tons has been set up. Additionally, the government is providing substantial subsidies to offer fertilizers at affordable prices. As a result, the country achieved its highest-ever food grain production of 332 million tonnes in the 2023-24 period.

The true essence of the Maha Kumbh transformed into a celebration of India's spirit. The way the faith of 140 crore citizens united at one time, intertwining with this single festival over 45 days in Prayagraj, was truly overwhelming.

The feeling that came from the heart of Prime Minister Narendra Modi also gives a glimpse of the great message of this Maha Kumbh. He says, "I am overwhelmed by the hard work, efforts, and determination of the countrymen to make the Maha Kumbh of unity a success. I will go to visit Shri Somnath, the first Jyotirlinga out of the twelve Jyotirlingas. I will offer my Sankalp Pushp as a symbol of devotion and pray for every Indian. I wish that this uninterrupted flow of unity among the countrymen continues to flow like this." The thoughts that came to the mind of Prime Minister Narendra Modi on the completion of Prayagraj Maha Kumbh have been written down by him in



this way...

The Mahakumbh has successfully concluded in the holy city of Prayagraj. A grand Mahayajna of Unity has been completed. When the consciousness of a nation awakens, when it breaks free from the shackles of a centuries-old mindset of subjugation, it breathes freely in the fresh air of renewed energy. The result of this was witnessed at the Ekta Ka Mahakumbh (Mahakumbh of Unity) in Prayagraj since January 13. On January 22, 2024, during the Pran Pratishtha of the Ram Mandir in Ayodhya, I spoke about Devbhakti and Deshbhakti - devotion to the divine and to the nation. During the Mahakumbh in Prayagraj, Gods and Goddesses, saints, women, children, youth, senior citizens and people from all walks of life came together. We witnessed the awakened consciousness of the nation. This was Ekta Ka Mahakumbh, where the sentiments of 140 crore Indians converged at the same place, at the same time, for this sacred occasion.

In this holy region of Prayagraj is Shringverpur, a sacred land of unity, harmony and love, where Prabhu Shri Ram and Nishadraj met. Their meeting symbolized the confluence of devotion and goodwill. Even today, Prayagraj inspires us with the same

spirit. For 45 days, I witnessed crores of people from every corner of the country making their way to the Sangam. The wave of emotions at the confluence kept rising. Every devotee came with one purpose – taking a dip in the Sangam. The holy confluence of Ganga, Yamuna, and Saraswati filled every pilgrim with enthusiasm, energy, and confidence. This Mahakumbh in Prayagraj is a subject of study for modern management professionals, planning, and policy experts. Nowhere in the world is there any parallel or example of this scale.

The world watched in wonder how crores of people gathered at Prayagraj at the banks of the confluence of rivers. These people had no formal invitations, no prior communication on when to go. Yet crores of people left for the Mahakumbh of their own accord and felt the bliss of taking a dip in the sacred waters. I cannot forget those faces radiating immense joy and satisfaction after the holy dip. Women, elders, our Divyang brothers and sisters – everyone found a way to reach the Sangam. It was particularly heartening for me to see the overwhelming participation of India's youth. The presence of the younger generation at the Mahakumbh sends a profound message that the



youth of India will be the torchbearers of our glorious culture and heritage. They understand their responsibility towards preserving it and are committed to carrying it forward. The number of people who arrived in Prayagraj for this Mahakumbh has undoubtedly created new records. But beyond those physically present, crores of people who could not reach Prayagraj were also deeply connected emotionally to the occasion. The sacred water brought back by pilgrims became a source of spiritual bliss for millions. Many of those returning from the Mahakumbh were received with respect in their villages, honoured by society.

What has happened in the last few weeks is unprecedented and has laid a foundation for centuries to come. More devotees arrived in Prayagraj than anyone had imagined. The administration had estimated attendance based on past experiences of the Kumbh. Nearly twice the population of the United States participated in this Ekta Ka Mahakumbh. If scholars of spirituality analyse the enthusiastic participation of crores of Indians, they will find that India, proud of its heritage, is now surging ahead with a new-found energy. I believe this is the dawn of a new era, which will

script the future of a new India. For thousands of years, the Mahakumbh has strengthened India's national consciousness. Every Purnakumbh used to witness a gathering of saints, scholars and thinkers deliberating upon the state of society in their times. Their reflections used to provide a new direction to the nation and society. Every six years, during the Ardhkumbh, these ideas were reviewed. After 12 Purnakumbh occurrences spanning 144 years, obsolete traditions were given up, newer ideas were embraced, and new traditions were created to move ahead with times. After 144 years, in this Mahakumbh, our saints have once again given us a new message for India's development journey. That message is Developed India – Viksit Bharat.

At this Ekta Ka Mahakumbh, every pilgrim, whether rich or poor, young or old, from villages or cities, from India or abroad, from the East or the West, from the North or the South, irrespective of caste, creed and ideology, came together. This was an embodiment of the vision of Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat that filled confidence in crores of people. Now, we must come together in the same spirit for the mission of building a developed India. I am reminded of the incident where, as a little boy, Shri Krishna revealed a snapshot of the whole universe within His mouth to His mother Yashoda. Similarly, in this Mahakumbh, the people of India and the world have witnessed the massive potential of India's collective strength. We must now move





forward with this self-confidence and dedicate ourselves towards building a developed India.

Earlier, the saints of the Bhakti movement had identified and encouraged the strength of our collective resolve across India. From Swami Vivekananda to Sri Aurobindo, every great thinker reminded us of the power of our collective resolve. Even Mahatma Gandhi experienced it during the freedom movement. Post-independence, if this collective strength had been correctly recognised and harnessed towards boosting the welfare of all, it would have become a great force for a newly independent nation. During my election campaign in Kashi, I had said, "Maa Ganga has called me." This was not just an emotion but also a call of responsibility, towards the cleanliness of our sacred rivers. Standing at the confluence of the Ganga, Yamuna, and Saraswati in Prayagraj, my resolve became even stronger. The cleanliness of our rivers is deeply linked to our own lives. It is our responsibility to celebrate our rivers, big or small, as life-giving mothers. This Mahakumbh has inspired us to keep working towards the cleanliness of our rivers.

I know that organizing such a massive event was no easy task. I pray to Maa Ganga, Maa Yamuna, and Maa Saraswati to forgive us in case there were any shortcomings in our devotion. 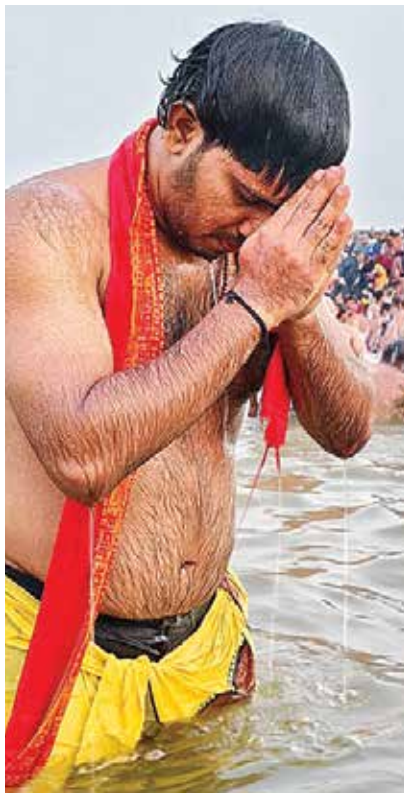


महाकुम्भ OF VASTNESS AND DIVERSITY

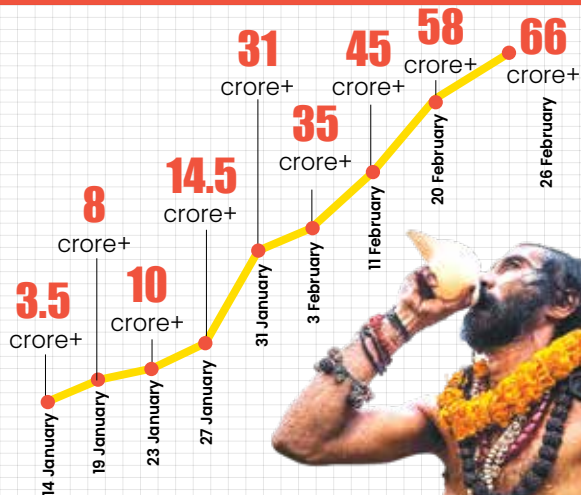
The Maha Kumbh in 2025 saw lakhs of saints, countless traditions, hundreds of sects, and numerous Akharas come together, creating an unparalleled display of unity in diversity. This extraordinary scene, unique to the Maha Kumbh, is unlike anything seen anywhere else in the world. The 45-day event witnessed an astounding 21 crore more devotees than anticipated, making it a grand spectacle of unity, vastness, and diversity. In addition to this monumental turnout, two world records were set for cleanliness, along with another for handprint painting on the banks of the Sangam...

The Kumbh Mela, recognized by UNESCO as an intangible cultural heritage, stands as a testament to India's timeless traditions. The Maha Kumbh, held over 45 days from January 13 to February 26, spanning from Paush Purnima to Mahashivratri, saw over 66 crore devotees gather along the banks of the Ganga to take a sacred dip. This event is recognized as the world's largest peaceful gathering. The number of devotees was nearly double the population of the United States and exceeded the populations of 193 countries worldwide. Only India and China have larger populations than the number of devotees who attended the Maha Kumbh. Additionally, people from more than 80 countries participated in the grand event.

Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, in the Maha Kumbh closing ceremony, said that such a big gathering of faith has not happened anywhere in the world. There was no incident of kidnapping, robbery, molestation, or rape. 8 crore devotees were here on the day of Mauni Amavasya; a tragic incident took place, and condolences to all those families. Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath said, What will be the situation if 5 to 8 crore people suddenly

PEOPLE WITNESSED THE DIGITAL MAHA KUMBH

To make sure that devotees arriving for Maha Kumbh 2025 could easily reach their destinations without any trouble, a system was put in place to guide them to different ghats, temples, and arenas. Along with this, for the first time, an AI chatbot was introduced, allowing devotees to easily access information for the first time, due to which devotees could easily access Kumbh-related information in 11 different Indian languages.

3 'GUINNESS BOOK OF WORLD RECORDS' MADE IN PRAYAGRAJ MAHA KUMBH

● **Record of cleaning Ganga in Kumbh Mela**
The biggest cleaning campaign was conducted at 329 places, the most for cleaning any river in the world.

● **Record of sweeping**
19 thousand sanitation workers and activists swept the Maha Kumbh Mela area together. The previous record was of 10 thousand people.

● **Third record for handprint Painting**
In 8 hours, 10,102 people painted by putting their handprints. The previous record was of 7660 people.

● A total of 50,000 security personnel, including paramilitary forces, were deployed, along with 14,000 home guards. Additionally, 2,750 AI-powered CCTV cameras were set up for surveillance.

● Over 16,000 trains were operated to bring approximately 4 to 5 crore devotees to the Maha Kumbh.

● Additionally, 3,050 buses ran continuously, with 1,200 extra buses deployed on February 12.

● For the first time in 106 years, 24/7 air connectivity was provided by starting night flights at Prayagraj Airport in a day.

● 5,000 passengers also travelled from here in a day for the first time.

● 10,200 sanitation workers and 1,800 Ganga Sevadoots were deployed.

During the Maha Kumbh, several spiritual circuits were formed, including one connecting Kashi Vishwanath and Vindhyavasini, linking Ayodhya and Gorakhpur, a third connecting Lucknow and Naimisharanya via Prayagraj and Shringverpur, a fourth circuit of Lalapur-Rajapur and Chitrakoot from Prayagraj, and a fifth circuit of Vrindavan from Prayagraj. In February alone, an average of five to six lakh devotees visited Kashi Vishwanath Dham daily, emphasizing the potential for religious tourism and its contribution to the economy. Business organizations have projected a total business of Rs 3.25 lakh crore during the 45 days of the Maha Kumbh. ●

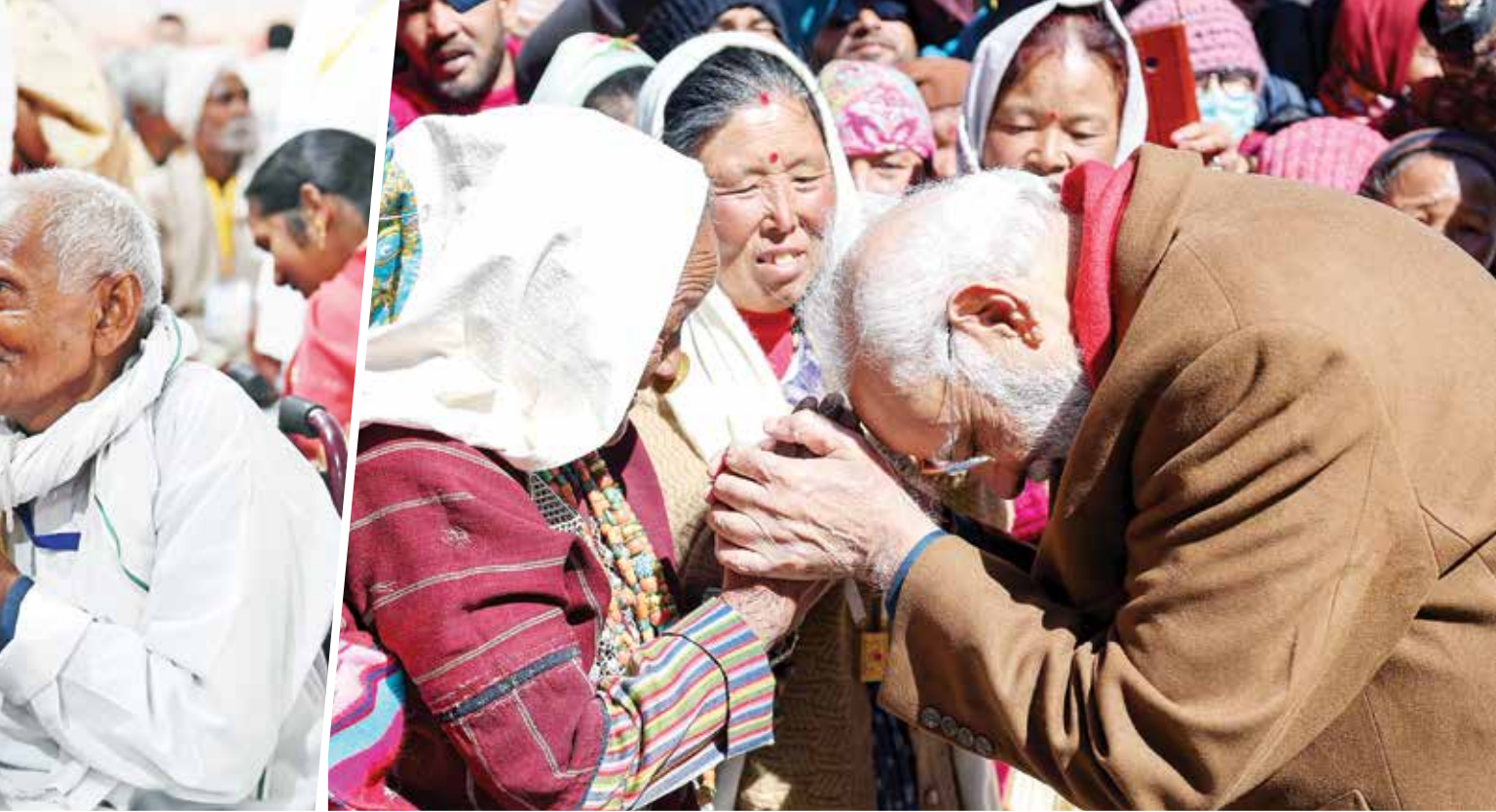

The Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana launched in 2016 to provide free LPG connections to the poor has proved to be important in bringing smiles to the faces of crores of women, while through the



INDIA'S PERFORMANCE CONTINUES TO IMPROVE

India's overall SDG score improved to 71 in 2023-24 from 66 in 2020-21 and 57 in 2018. Kerala and Uttarakhand were the best-performing states, scoring 79 points each. There are 32 states and Union Territories (UTs) in the leading category, with 10 new entrants, including Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Chhattisgarh, and Uttar Pradesh.

Saubhagya Yojana, electricity reached 18,000 villages that were deprived of electricity even after 70 years of independence. Prime Minister Modi aims for no Indian to be homeless, and to realize this vision, over 4.53 crore houses were sanctioned under the PM Awas Yojana between 2014 and 2024. One of the first Cabinet

decisions after assuming power for a third term in June 2024 was to provide assistance for the construction of houses to 3 crore additional rural and urban families, underlining the Central Government's commitment to address the housing needs of the country and ensure dignity and quality of life for every citizen.

PM Modi has a deep passion for environmental issues. He has always believed that work should be done to create a clean and green planet. In 2018, leaders from various nations gathered in India for the inauguration of the International Solar Alliance. This alliance is an innovative effort to promote solar energy for a better planet. having a highly positive effect on the rural economy.

Without strengthening the rural economy, we cannot build a Viksit Bharat. Therefore, efforts are being made to touch all aspects related to the rural economy. In the past decade, the agriculture budget has been increased 10 times. In the past 10 years, 12 lakh crore rupees have been spent for the sole purpose of providing cheap fertilizers to farmers.

Under the PM Kisan Samman Nidhi scheme, approximately three and a half lakh crore rupees have been directly transferred into farmers' accounts. Additionally, a record increase in the Minimum Support Price (MSP) has been implemented, and procurement has tripled in the last decade compared to previous years. Farmers now also receive three times more in affordable loans than before. In the past, farmers had to manage on their own during natural disasters, but now they receive better support. CONTINUOUS MONITORING THROUGH SDG INDEX

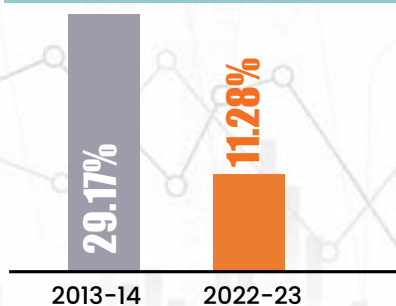
To track India's progress on Sustainable Development Goals, NITI Aayog introduced the SDG India Index in 2018. This index evaluates national advancement through 113 different indicators. Through this, the contribution and performance of all the states and union territories of the country, along with the efforts of the central government towards achieving the goals of sustainable development, are evaluated. Through this, the goal-wise score of the states and union territories is calculated on 17 goals. They have also been classified into four categories based on the score: Aspirant (0-49), Performer (50-64), Front-Runner (65-99), and Achiever (100). Along with this, a dashboard named SDG India Index was also created based on the performance of the states. ●

JEEVAN JYOTI TOOK CARE OF LEELABAI'S FAMILY WITH JAN DHAN

Leelabai Porte of Karimitikara, Jashpur in Chhattisgarh is one of those whose family was supported by Jan Dhan account and the benefits of Jeevan Jyoti Insurance Scheme received through it in difficult times. It was the year 2015, Leelabai's family with her husband Abhiram had two sons and two daughters. The family was making a living by farming and odd labour. As the bank branch was 7 km away from the village, no one had a bank account. One day a Bank Mitra came to the village and told about the benefits of the account. Leelabai says, they opened our bank account by taking thumb impression from a small machine along with identity card. My husband also filled the form of Jeevan Jyoti Yojana through that account. I did not know this then. In June 2015, my husband died due to heat stroke. When the Bank Mitra got information about this, he told us about my husband's insurance and after the necessary documentation, two lakh rupees were deposited in my account.

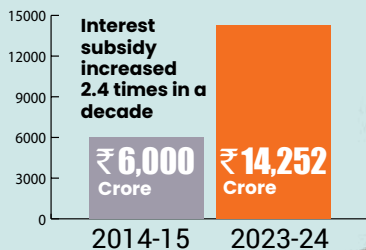

He has 20 years of experience in farming and marketing agricultural products, is among those who have given a new identity to their business through e-NAM. He sold 26.16 quintals of white soya at e-NAM, which saved him Rs 1,427 as additional commission and saved Rs 1,501 in the form of other reduced charges. On 26.16 quintals of produce, got a profit of Rs 2,929 in a single transaction of produce worth Rs 70,000. Thus, by selling 270 quintals of soya, Vidyasagar earned a profit of more than Rs 30,000 on his agricultural produce in 2016, which used to go to commission agents. Moreover, he received payment for produce within 24 hours of sale through online transactions.

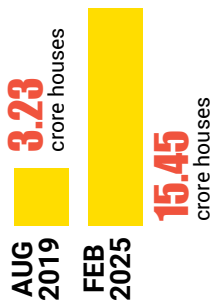

Sometimes, there were days when we could not get wood, and the children had to sleep hungry. Cooking on the chullah produced a lot

of smoke, causing it to enter her eyes and blacken the walls. She was worried about its impact on her health. Now, after getting a gas connection through the Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana, all these worries of Ramvati have vanished. Geeta's story from Bareilly is also like Ramvati's. Geeta says that now she is neither worried about wet wood nor smoke in the eyes.

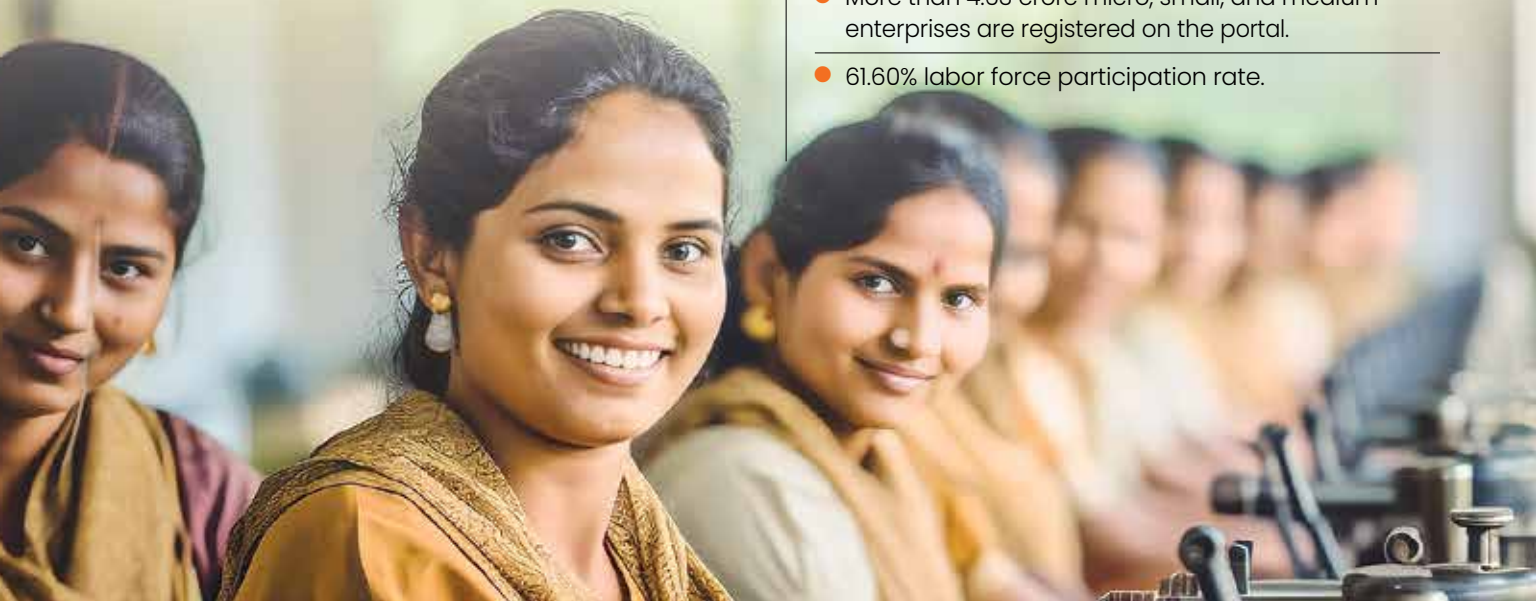

Yasin says, Now the work for which I had to travel a long distance is being done at Aqib's centre, so what can be better than this for me.

EASE OF DOING BUSINESS

- To increase the ease of doing business in India, the Centre for Processing Accelerated Corporate Exit (C-PACE) was established in the Companies Act, 2013, to centralise and expedite the voluntary strike-off process of companies.

PM MATSYA SAMPADA YOJANA BECAME THE SUPPORT OF THE PEOPLE IN THE VILLAGE OF SIRSA

In Sirsa, the land started becoming barren due to the rising level of saline water in the village adjoining the Rajasthan border. When the support of Pradhan Mantri Matsya Sampada Yojana was received, the farmers there started rearing shrimp in saline water.

Fish farmer Sumitra says that she started shrimp farming in 2021. Brought three lakh fish fry from Chennai. Although it takes 120 days, after 106 days only, shrimps worth Rs 25 lakh were sold, and money came into the account immediately. In 2022, Sumitra started shrimp farming on five acres instead of two and a half acres. She says that there is very little chance of loss in this, so fish farmers are increasing.

The Right to Information Act 2005 was passed by the Parliament. This law is now applicable throughout the country.

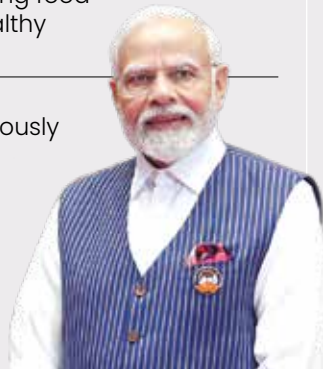

IMEC INITIATIVE IN THE FIELD OF INFRASTRUCTURE

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi and then US President Joe Biden co-chaired the program on Partnership for Global Infrastructure and Investment and the India-Middle East-Europe Economic Corridor (IMEC) during the G20 summit in Delhi on 9 September 2023.

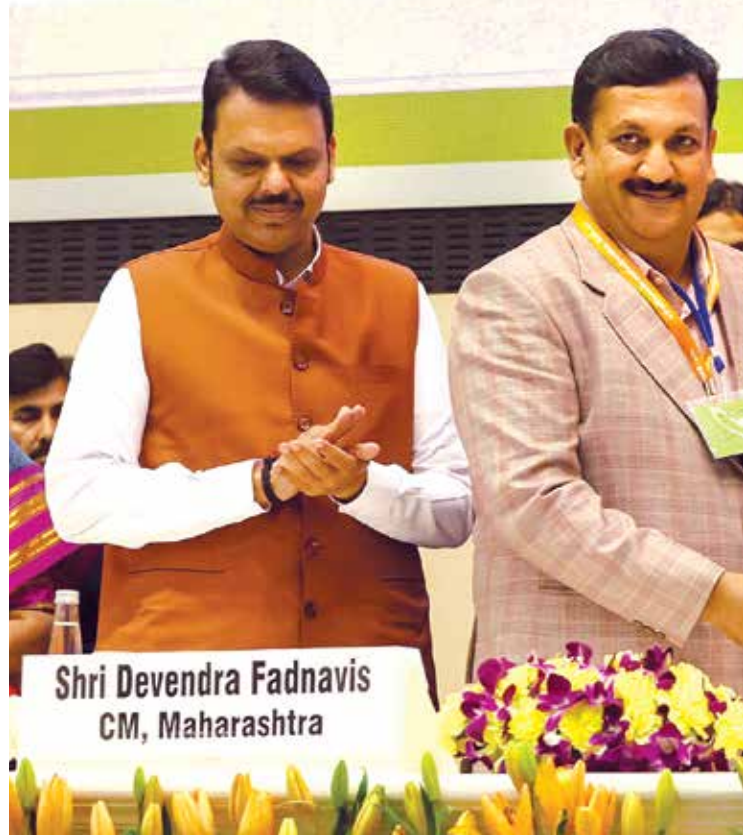


LANGUAGE TEACHES THE LESSON OF PROSPERITY THROUGH HARMONY

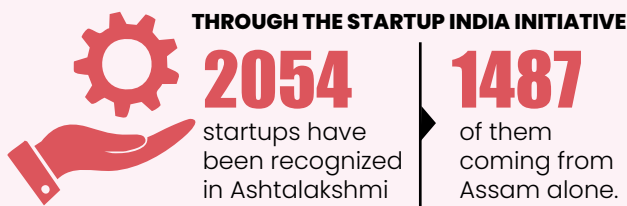

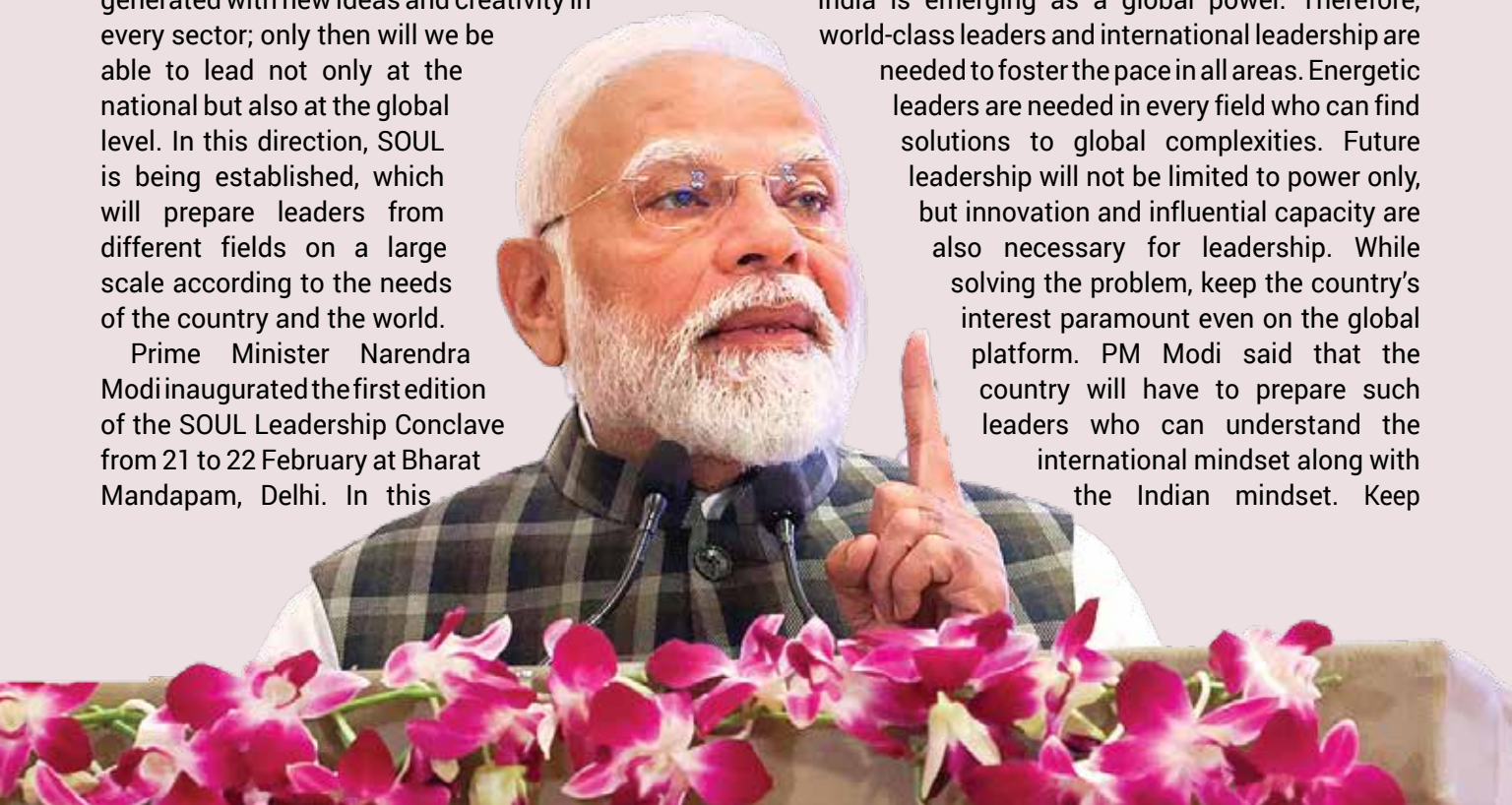

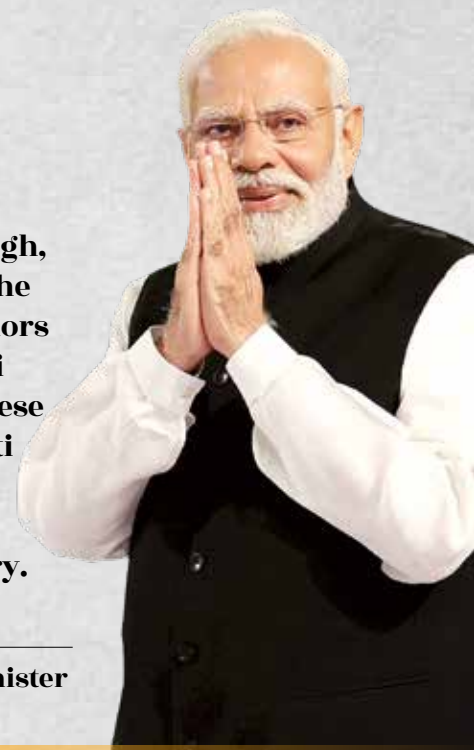
