





Mera Gaon Meri Dharohar Cultural Mapping of 6.38 Lakh Villages Completed



The number of villages identified under Mera Gaon Meri Dharohar (MGMD) Programme for cultural mapping across the country by the Ministry of Culture, Government of India, is 6,38,365, out of which, the data of 6,23,449 villages have been uploaded on MGMD Portal so far, documenting the cultural identity of these villages. As part of its documentation activities, it covers a wide range of cultural elements, both tangible and intangible, including oral traditions, beliefs, customs, historical significance, art forms, heritage sites, traditional food, prominent artists, fairs and festivals, traditional dress, ornaments, and local landmarks. This program not only strengthens rural identity but also creates an authentic cultural profile of each village.

125 Border Infrastructure Projects Related to Ladakh Dedicated to the Nation


125 strategically important infrastructure projects of the Border Roads Organization (BRO) were dedicated to the nation on December 7th. This is the highest number of projects inaugurated simultaneously from Ladakh so far. 28 roads, 93 bridges, and 4 miscellaneous projects spanning 2 Union Territories and 7 States at a cost of Rs

5,000 crore were completed, making it the highest value inaugurations in the history of BRO. This includes the strategic Shyok Tunnel on Darbuk-Shyok-Daulat Beg Oldie Road in Ladakh, which will improve last-mile connectivity to remote villages and forward military locations.



Allotment of lower berths for senior citizens and women over 45

Indian Railways is continuously striving to provide convenience to passengers, including Senior Citizens and Persons with Disabilities. As part of this effort, Indian Railways will allocate senior citizens and women over 45 with lower berths. Union Railway Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw gave this information in the Rajya Sabha that, subject to availability, even if the option is not given, senior citizens and women aged 45 and above will be automatically allocated lower berths. Furthermore, 6-7 lower berths in sleeper class, 4-5 in third AC, and 3-4 in second AC are reserved for senior citizens, women passengers over 45, and pregnant women. Additionally, a separate coach for the Divyangan has been provided on almost all mail/express trains.



Beneficiaries under the Atal Pension Yojana and PM Vishwakarma Yojana are steadily rising

The number of beneficiaries under central government schemes expanding social security coverage is steadily rising. The Atal Pension Yojana (APY) was launched on May 9, 2015, and by October 2025, 83,413,738 beneficiaries had been registered, of which approximately 48% were women. The scheme is available to all citizens aged 18-40 years who have a savings account with a bank

or post office. According to the scheme, beneficiaries will receive a pension upon reaching the age of 60, with pension benefits expected to start from 2035 onwards. As of December 1, 2025, 3 million beneficiaries had been registered under the Pradhan Mantri Vishwakarma Yojana, of which 23.09 lakh beneficiaries had been trained. The scheme was launched on September 17, 2023. Beneficiaries of this scheme are being provided online marketing support through various e-commerce platforms such as ONDC, Fabindia, etc., to promote the sale of their products in domestic and international markets.



Launch of the Sujalam Bharat App for water supply data information



The Sujalam Bharat App has been launched, a key digital initiative designed to transform rural drinking water governance by placing comprehensive, real-time information in the hands of both citizens and institutions. Through the Sujalam Bharat – Sujal Gaon ID, all rural water schemes in the country will be integrated into a national digital registry, providing complete information from source to tap on a single platform. This app will strengthen reliable and real-time digital monitoring of assets, operations and maintenance, and service performance.

Shaping the future PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana

The PM Surya Ghar Muft Bijli Yojana has given citizens the opportunity to directly participate in the energy security campaign. The Central Government is continuously working on awareness and ease of doing business to ensure greater participation in this scheme. This is why, against the target of installing rooftop solar systems in 10 million residential homes by the 2026-27 fiscal year, a total of 2,396,497 homes have already installed rooftop solar systems. This represents nearly a quarter of the target. Furthermore, as of December 3, 2025, a total of 5,354,099 applications have been received under the scheme.

At a program in December 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that India imports approximately ₹125 lakh crore worth of petrol, diesel, and gas annually. Despite the immense blessings of the Sun God, India's solar power generation capacity was only 3 gigawatts until 2014. In the past 10 years, it has now grown to around 130 gigawatts. Of this, 22 gigawatts of capacity is solely from solar rooftop.



Pioneer of the Bose-Einstein Theory

Born: January 1, 1894 | Died: February 4, 1974



Satyendra Nath Bose, who made invaluable contributions to the world of Science, along with renowned scientist Albert Einstein, discovered the Bose-Einstein Theory and raised India's stature in the field of physics. He not only made an unparalleled contribution to physics but also gave it a new direction, securing India a special place in the world. His remarkable contribution in giving a new direction to modern physics will remain unforgettable for ages to come.

Born on January 1, 1894, in Kolkata, Satyendra Nath Bose was a brilliant student from childhood. He consistently passed his exams with the highest marks. Satyendra Nath's father, Surendranath Bose, worked in the engineering department of the East Indian Railway Company. Satyendra Nath was the eldest of seven children. He received his early education in Bara Jagulia village in Nadia district. He later enrolled at Kolkata's renowned Presidency College, where he studied under scholars like Jagadish Chandra Bose and Prafulla Chandra Ray. He then joined the same college as a professor of physics, and in 1921, he became a reader in the physics department at the newly established University of Dhaka. Later, he travelled to Europe and returned home.

Satyendra Nath Bose was a scholar who learnt on his own. Despite lacking formal research training and having limited connection with the global scientific community, he succeeded. His original research paper was published in 1924 after Albert Einstein translated it into German. With a steadfast commitment to unexplored science, he produced a groundbreaking work in 1924. He laid the foundation of quantum statistics and provided the basis for modern atomic theory. It was Satyendra Nath Bose who proposed the concept of the smallest particles, and on this basis, they were named bosons. Einstein's biographer, Abraham Pais, regarded Bose's work as one of the last four revolutionary papers of the old quantum theory. Bose's name has become immortal in the history of science through concepts and terms like Bose statistics, Bose-Einstein condensation,

and Higgs bosons. His contributions fundamentally transformed humanity's understanding of physics and paved the way for many scientific breakthroughs.

His scientific depth can be gauged from the fact that researchers who later advanced his ideas in various physical applications were awarded several Nobel Prizes in Physics. Professor Bose was an advocate of teaching science in the local language. He founded the Bengali science magazine Gyan-o-Bigyan. In 1954, he was awarded the Padma Vibhushan. To honor Professor Bose's work, the Government of India established the S.N. Bose National Centre for Basic Sciences, a research institute in Kolkata, in 1986. The S.N. Bose Bhawan was inaugurated at the Centre for Global Nuclear Energy Partnership at Sushma Swaraj Bhavan in New Delhi on March 18, 2025.

On 1 January 2018, on the 125th birth anniversary of Prof. Satyendra Nath Bose, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said that he had learned a great deal about Bose's achievements, which were far ahead of his time and society. With very few resources and immense struggle, Bose served people through his ideas and discoveries. Even today, we continue to learn from his dedication and creativity. Prime Minister Modi had appealed that if every scientist could devote a little time to guiding even one child towards studying science and developing an interest in research, the future of millions of students in the country could be shaped. This, he said, would be the greatest tribute to Acharya Satyendra Nath Bose in his 125th birth year. Bose passed away on 4 February 1974. ●



Mutual fund companies hold around Rs. 3,000 crore, and dividends worth Rs. 9,000 crore are also unclaimed.



The change of names aligns with its vision to give a message that institutions are not power-centric, but facilitate the vision of liberation from the mentality of slavery, and the eternal values of public service, connecting to people, and dedication. In the last 11 years, the government led by PM Narendra Modi has shown that governance is not a medium of power but a steadfast resolve to serve. Slipping into the role of a "Pradhan Sevak," a history is in the making as India inches closer to becoming a Viksit Bharat. Prime Minister Narendra Modi is the leader of this journey, leading the nation in liberating itself from the mindset of slavery imported to India by Macaulay within the next 10 years, i.e., by 2035.

FREEDOM FROM MACAULAY MENTALITY BY 2035

An Englishman named Macaulay, in 1835, about 190 years started the campaign of uprooting India from its roots. Macaulay laid the foundation of mental slavery in India. Ten years later, i.e., in 2035, 200 years will have passed since that event which tried to make Indians a mental slave. Under this backdrop, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has made a determined call to liberate India from the mentality of slavery in the coming ten years. Before we understand the campaign to liberate Indians from the mentality of slavery, its history must also be understood. This seed of creating discord was sown even before the 1857 War of Independence, when, in 1835, British MP Thomas Babington Ma-

Name Changes Aimed At Boosting Self-Respect

Its aim is not only customary in practice, but plays a key role in shaping psychological impact on our subconscious. Demolishing every sign of slavery is the first step toward breaking that mindset, as society is driven in its thoughts and actions by symbols.

- **Seva Teerth:** In 2025, the Prime Minister's Office was renamed Seva Teerth.
- **Lok Bhavan and Lok Niwas:** The Raj Bhavan was renamed Lok Bhavan, and the Raj Niwas was renamed Lok Niwas.
- **Lok Kalyan:** In 2016, the road near the Prime Minister's residence, formerly known as Race Course Road, was renamed Lok Kalyan Marg. The name Race Course was reminiscent of the British era.
- **APJ Abdul Kalam Road:** In 2015, Delhi's Aurangzeb Road was renamed to its present name.
- **Dara Shikoh Road:** In 2017, Dalhousie Road was given this name.




- **Amrit Udyam:** As part of the "Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav" celebrations to mark 75 years of independence, the President renamed the gardens in Rashtrapati Bhavan as "Amrit Udyam."
- **Teen Murti Haifa:** In 2018, Teen Murti Chowk was renamed Teen Murti Haifa Chowk.
- Several such renamings have taken place over the past few years, and more such initiatives are underway. The places giving an impression of a slave mentality are being replaced with names inspired by Indian freedom fighters or those reflecting Indian identity.

Impact on the masses

The colonial period names at several places reflected India's colonial past as a slave. Now, the renaming personifies duty, public spirit, and India's pride, promoting emancipation from mental slavery.

caulay played a key role in launching this campaign to uproot India from its soul. He declared that he would create such Indians who would be Indian in appearance but English in their minds. And to achieve this, Macaulay did not merely change the Indian education system; he destroyed it from the roots. Mahatma Gandhi himself had said that India's ancient education system was like a beautiful tree that was uprooted and destroyed. India's education system ingrained the values of taking pride in one's

culture. Even in those times, equal emphasis was placed on skills and education. As part of his vicious plan set out to destroy the backbone of India's education system, and he succeeded. He took steps to spread the British language and British thinking in those times, leaving India to suffer for centuries to come. He was instrumental in demolishing people's self-confidence and instilled a sense of inferiority. In his malicious motive, Macaulay attempted to destroy thousands of years of Indian knowledge,

to drive away the British, lost its radiance. Foreign governance models were also sought. The Indians started looking towards foreign countries for innovation. 
- **Changes to the Independence Day Celebrations:** On Independence Day, August 15th, a 21-gun salute is given at the Red Fort. In 2022, for the first time, indigenously manufactured DRDO guns were used for this purpose.
- **Changes to the Republic Day Celebrations:** The hymn "Abide with Me" was removed from the Beating Retreat ceremony, which follows the Republic Day celebrations. In its place, poet Pradeep's famous song "Ae Mere Watan Ke Logon" was included.
- **Mission Amrit Sarovar:** The Central Government launched

Mission Amrit Sarovar in 2022 as a flagship initiative under the Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav. The mission aims to create and revive 75 water sources in each district across the country, thereby promoting water conservation.

- **Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav:** Launched to commemorate 75 years of India's independence. The program aimed to rekindle and renew the patriotic fervor that arose during the freedom movement and to remember the contributions of freedom fighters, especially the unsung heroes.

Har Ghar Tiranga

Launched in 2022 as part of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav, this campaign has now become a powerful medium of expressing patriotism. Indian masses and diaspora have participated in it. By 6 pm on August 16, 2025, a total of 7.50 crore selfies were uploaded by people as part of India's "Har Ghar Tiranga" campaign

Amidst all this, India is brimming with self-confidence. That's why Prime Minister Narendra Modi said at the Hindustan Times Leadership Summit 2025 that a confident India is paving the way for tomorrow's transformation through today's reforms and performance...

India's Quarter-2 GDP figures reflect a new momentum of progress in the country. GDP growth in the second quarter was 8.2 percent. This is not just a number; it is a sign of a strong economy. The Prime Minister emphasized that this is not just a number but a strong macroeconomic signal, a message that India today is becoming the growth driver of the global economy. He highlighted that these figures come at a time when global growth is around three percent and the economies of the G-7 average about one and a half percent. He underlined that in such circumstances India has emerged as a model of high growth and low inflation. He recalled that there was a time when economists expressed concern about high inflation, but today the same economists speak of low inflation. When the world talks about economic slowdown, India writes a story of growth. When the world faces a crisis of confidence, India becomes a pillar of trust.

A large part of India's potential remained untapped for a long time. He stated that when this untapped potential receives greater opportunities, when it participates fully and without hindrance in the nation's

development, the transformation of the country is certain. The Prime Minister urged reflection on eastern India, the Northeast, villages, tier-two and tier-three cities, the women's power, the innovative youth, the maritime strength and blue economy, and the space sector, pointing out that their full potential had not been utilised in previous decades. "India's women power is achieving remarkable feats, and the daughters of the nation are excelling in every field," exclaimed the Prime Minister, emphasizing that this transformation is no longer limited to women empowerment alone but is transforming both the mindset and the strength of society. The prime minister highlighted that when new opportunities are created and obstacles are removed, new wings are added to soar in the sky. tent, and its intent firmly rooted in Nation First. He underlined that the year 2025 has been a year of such reforms, with the most significant being the next-generation GST. He remarked that this year a major reform was also introduced in the direct tax system, with zero tax on income up to 12 lakh rupees, a step that was unimaginable even a decade ago. Earlier, even for a loan of 1000 rupees, banks demanded guarantees because of excessive distrust. PM emphasized that this vicious cycle of distrust was broken through the Mudra Yojana, under which guarantee-free loans worth 37 lakh crore rupees have been given so far. Money has given confidence to the youth, enabling them to become entrepreneurs.

PM Modi said that if campaigns like Aatmanirbhar Bharat had been initiated four to five decades ago, mentioning that five to six decades ago a company had come forward to set up a semiconductor plant in India but was not given due attention, India's picture would have been different today. India imports petrol, diesel, and gas worth approximately ₹125 lakh crore every year. Until 2014, the country's solar power capacity was only 3 gigawatts. In the last 10 years, it has now increased to around 130 gigawatts. Before 2014, the country imported 75% of its mobile manufacturing needs, which has now dropped to almost zero.

PM Modi emphasized that after 2014 a reform was introduced, the nation performed, and the transformative results are now being witnessed by the world. India's achievements are not ordinary, nor are they merely about statistics, but represent a fundamental change brought by the nation in the past decade. PM noted that this fundamental change is about resilience, about the tendency to find solutions to problems, about removing apprehension and expanding aspirations. It is for this reason that today's India is transforming itself and is also transforming the tomorrow to come. VANDE MATARAM AWAKENED A CENTURIES-OLD CONSCIOUSNESS




WHY WAS VANDE MATARAM BETRAYED?

India and Natural Farming... Shaping the Future!

I encouraged farmers to begin with 'one acre, one season.' The outcomes from even a small plot can build confidence and inspire larger adoption.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi recently shared his thoughts on natural farming in a LinkedIn post. He attended a Summit on natural farming in Coimbatore, an event that left a deep impression on him. In the LinkedIn post, he shared his thoughts on it and made a clarion call to the people across India to increase natural farming. Have a Look...

In August this year, a group of farmers from Tamil Nadu met me and talked about how they were practising new agricultural techniques to boost sustainability and productivity. They invited me to a Summit on natural farming to be held in Coimbatore. I accepted their invitation and promised them that I would be among them during the programme. Thus, a few weeks ago, on 19th November, I was in the lovely city of Coimbatore, attending the South India Natural Farming Summit 2025. A city known as an MSME backbone was hosting a big event on natural farming.

Natural farming, as we all know, draws from India's traditional knowledge systems and modern ecological principles to cultivate crops without synthetic chemicals. It promotes diversified fields where plants, trees, and livestock coexist to support natural biodiversity. The approach relies on recycling farm residues and enhancing soil health through mulching and aeration, rather than external inputs.

This Summit in Coimbatore will forever remain a part of my memory! It indicated a shift in mindset, imagination, and confidence with which India's farmers and agri-entrepreneurs are shaping the future of agriculture. The programme included an interaction with farmers from Tamil Nadu, in which they showcased their efforts in natural farming, and I was amazed! I was struck by the fact that people from diverse backgrounds, including scientists, FPO leaders, first-generation graduates, traditional cultivators, and notably people who had left high-paying corporate careers, decided to return to their roots and pursue natural farming. I met people whose life journeys and commitment to doing something new were noteworthy.

There was a farmer who managed nearly 10 acres of multi-layered agriculture with bananas, coconuts, papaya, pepper, and turmeric. He maintains 60 desi cows, 400 goats, and local poultry.

Another farmer has dedicated himself to preserving native rice varieties like Mapillai Samba and Karuppu Kavuni. He focuses on value-added products, creating health mixes, puffed rice, chocolates and protein bars.

There was a first-generation graduate who runs a 15-acre natural farm and has trained over 3,000 farmers, supplying nearly 30 tonnes of vegetables every month.

Some people who were running their own FPOs supported tapioca farmers and promoted tapioca-based products as a sustainable raw material for bioethanol and Compressed Biogas.

One of the agri-innovators was a biotechnology professional who built a seaweed-based biofertilizer enterprise employing 600 fishermen across coastal districts; another developed nutrient-enriched bioactive biochar that boosts soil health. They both showed how science and sustainability can blend seamlessly.

The people I met there belonged to different backgrounds, but there was one thing in common: a complete commitment to soil health, sustainability, community upliftment, and a deep sense of enterprise.

At a larger level, India has made commendable progress in the field. Last year, the Government of India launched the National Mission on Natural Farming, which has already connected lakhs of farmers with sustainable practices. Across the nation, thousands of hectares are under natural farming. Efforts by the Government such as encouraging exports, institutional credit being expanded significantly through the Kisan Credit Card (including for livestock and

fisheries) and PM-Kisan, have also helped farmers pursuing natural farming.

Natural farming is also closely linked to our efforts to promote Shree Anna or millets. What is also gladdening is the fact that women farmers are taking to natural farming in a big way.

Over the past few decades, the rising dependence on chemical fertilisers and pesticides has affected soil fertility, moisture and long-term sustainability. At the same time, farming costs have steadily increased. Natural farming directly addresses these challenges. The use of Panchagavya, Jeevamrit, Beejamrit, and mulching protects soil health, reduces chemical exposure, and lowers input costs while building strength against climate change and erratic weather patterns.

I encouraged farmers to begin with 'one acre, one season.' The outcomes from even a small plot can build confidence and inspire larger adoption. When traditional wisdom, scientific validation, and institutional support come together, natural farming can become feasible and transformative.

I call upon all of you to think of pursuing natural farming. You can do this by being associated with FPOs, which are becoming strong platforms for collective empowerment. You can explore a StartUp relating to this area.

Seeing the convergence between farmers, science, entrepreneurship and collective action in Coimbatore was truly inspiring. And, I am sure we will together continue making our agriculture and allied sectors productive and sustainable. If you know of teams working on natural farming, do let me know too! ●

Arthrogryposis is a condition in which the muscles in the arms and legs fail to develop, forcing a person to rely on a wheelchair. India Has The World's Sixth Largest Nuclear Reactor Fleet

A symbol of India's burgeoning nuclear capacity, the nation now has the world's sixth-largest nuclear reactor fleet, contributing more than 3 percent to the total electricity generation. The installed capacity is 8.78 gigawatts. The central government is working steadfastly to expand nuclear power capacity. The design and development of an indigenous 200-megawatt Small Modular Reactor (SMR) and a 55-megawatt SMR, both based on Pressurized Water Reactor (PWR) technology, have been initiated.

The Indian government is placing special emphasis on indigenous nuclear technology to increase its share of nuclear energy in the country's energy mix. With the maturation of large-scale Pressurized Heavy Water Reactor (PHWR) technology, such as the 700-megawatt reactors, and the deployment of indigenous 700-megawatt reactors and 1,000-megawatt reactors established through international cooperation, the nuclear capacity is increasing. Furthermore, with the completion of projects under construction, the country's nuclear power capacity is expected to reach 22.38 gigawatts by 2031-32. The government has also announced a 'Nuclear Energy Mission'

Private Sector Investment to be Encouraged

To facilitate the implementation of the Nuclear Energy Mission, amendments to the Atomic Energy Act and the Civil Liability for Nuclear Damage Act will be introduced in Parliament. These amendments are expected to encourage private sector investment in nuclear energy projects.

to increase nuclear power capacity to 100 gigawatts by 2047. Along with this, the government is moving towards amending the Atomic Energy Act, 1962, to enable private sector participation in nuclear energy.

The government's strategy will fulfill the 100 GW target

- Establishing 700 MW indigenous Pressurized Heavy Water Reactors and higher capacity imported reactors at greenfield sites for rapid expansion.
- Designing and developing smaller reactors such as the 200 MW-electric Bharat Small Modular Reactor and the 55 MW-electric Small Modular Reactor for brownfield sites. The objective is to:
 - » Repurposing of retiring fossil fuel-based power plants,
 - » Captive plants for energy-intensive industries and
 - » Off-grid applications for remote locations.

Necessary technology for deployment of these reactors is available in the country and majority of equipment are within manufacturing capability of Indian industries with technological handholding by Bhabha Atomic Research Centre (BARC). The mission is further supported by R&D with the objective to develop indigenous advanced reactors.

- BARC has initiated design and development work on these Small Modular Reactors:
- Bharat Small Modular Reactor 200 MWe,
- SMR 55 MWe, and
- Up to 5 MWth High temperature gas-cooled reactor meant for hydrogen generation.

ELECTRON BEAM STERILIZATION... EXPORT OF MEDICAL DEVICES TO 35 COUNTRIES

Department of Atomic Energy's (DAE) electron beam (E-beam) facility in Indore, Madhya Pradesh, is playing a key role in the healthcare sector by providing electron beam-based sterilization facility services to medical device manufacturers in accordance with ISO standards. In September 2025, this facility successfully sterilized 1.53 crore medical devices. The medical devices sterilized here are being exported to more than 35 countries, including Germany, the UK, Spain, France, Belgium, Italy, the Netherlands, Switzerland, Austria, South Africa, Indonesia, Portugal, the Czech Republic, and Russia.

Expansion of Nuclear Energy in 2025...

- Prime Minister Narendra Modi laid the foundation stone for a ₹42,000 crore nuclear power project (4X700 MW) in Rajasthan on September 25, 2025. This will be one of the largest nuclear power plants in the country. This project will also strengthen India's stature in environmental protection and the developed nuclear energy landscape.
- The first two units (KAPS-3 and 4) of the indigenous 700 MW PHWR at Kakrapar, Gujarat, have received AERB licenses for regular operation. Unit 7 of the Rawatbhata Atomic Power Project (RAPP), the third indigenous 700 MW PHWR in the approved series of 16 reactors, commenced commercial operation on April 15, 2025.
- Nuclear Power Corporation of India (NPCIL) achieved its highest-ever generation in its entire operational history. 56,681 million units of electricity were generated in FY 2024-25, preventing approximately 49 million tonnes of carbon dioxide emissions.

- Establishment of Small Reactors in India.
- Research and Development of Small Modular Reactors in India.
- Research and Development of new technologies for nuclear energy.



Meanwhile, a high-intensity gamma radiation facility has also been commissioned to provide services for the final sterilization of healthcare products. ISOMED 2.0 is the world's only high-intensity land-based stationary gamma radiation facility. ●

Union Cabinet Decisions

Budget for Census and Coal Logistics Policy Approved

The Union Cabinet has approved three important proposals related to national interest. The biggest decision among these is the budget allocation for the census to be conducted in 2027, which will be the 16th census of the country and the 8th census of independent India. This database is the largest source of primary data available at the city and ward levels. The Cabinet also approved the Coal Logistics Policy and the proposal for the Minimum Support Price (MSP) for copra for the 2026 season.

DECISION: The Union Cabinet has approved the proposal for conducting the Census of India 2027 at a cost of Rs 11,718.24 crore.

IMPACT: The Census of India 2027 will cover the entire population of the country. It will be conducted in two phases: first, House-listing and Housing Census - from April to September 2026, and second, population enumeration - by February 2027. A mobile app will be used for data collection and a central portal for monitoring, which will ensure better quality data. This massive task of national importance will be carried out by 30 lakh field functionaries. This will generate 1.02 crore man-days of employment.

DECISION: The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs approved the CoalSETU policy for the auction of coal linkages.

IMPACT: This CoalSETU window aims for allocation based on the auction of coal linkages for long-term use

and for any industrial use and export. Any domestic buyer requiring coal can participate in the linkage auction. The coal linkages obtained under this window can be used for self-consumption, export, or any other purpose. Coal linkage holders will also be allowed to export up to 50% of their linkage. Linkage holders will have the flexibility to utilize the coal among their group companies as per their needs.

DECISION: Approval of Minimum Support Price (MSP) for copra for the 2026 season.

IMPACT: The MSP for milling copra has been fixed at Rs. 12,027 per quintal, while the MSP for ball copra has been fixed at Rs. 12,500 per quintal. This move is a significant step towards increasing farmers' income and incentivising coconut production. The higher MSP will ensure better and more remunerative prices for coconut growers. It also aims to encourage farmers to increase copra production to meet the growing domestic and international demand for coconut products. ●
